

WHAT IS LANGUAGE IMMERSION

Language immersion is a method developed to teach people a second language, in which the language being taught is used specifically for instruction purposes.

Unlike more traditional language teaching programs, where the language is taught simply as a subject to be learned, language immersion focuses more on the second language being a tool which is used to immerse the student completely within the subject.

LANGUAGE IMMERSION WITHIN ORANGE

Orange Unified started Orange County longest running Mandarin Immersion Program in 2011 at Fletcher Elementary School. Both Fletcher Elementary and California Elementary have received Golden Bell awards based on their programming. All of are immersion programs are 50:50 programs, with 50% of the day taught in English and 50% taught in the target language.





BENEFITS OF LANGUAGE IMMERSION


- Students achieve dual language proficiency in English and the target language while developing high level academic and career/college skills

# **BILITERACY AWARDS**

# **Students enrolled in a dual immersion program are eligible to receive the following awards as they matriculate through the OUSD Programs**

Bilingual Pathway Award - Kindergarten: The intent of this award is to celebrate the

path to bilingualism via oral and academic language development. To receive the

award, kindergarteners must be able to demonstrate progress in the following

outcomes in both English and the target language:

- Demonstrate active listening by asking and answering detailed questions with prompting and support
- Describe ideas, phenomena, and text elements, using key details based on understanding of a variety of Kindergarten texts with prompting and support
- Exchange information with peers and adults in small and larger groups by listening attentively, following turn-taking rules, and asking and answering questions in order to seek help and get information about Kindergarten topics and texts
- Draw, dictate, and write to compose literary and informational texts, collaboratively with an adult and independently

**Pursuit of Biliteracy Award -3rd Grade**: The intent of this award is to encourage students to continue on their path to bilingualism via oral and academic language development. To receive the award, 3rd graders must be able to demonstrate progress in the following outcomes in both English and the target language:

- State assessment and/or other valid testing instrument that demonstrates progress in English language proficiency
- District-approved language proficiency assessment that demonstrates progress in the target language
- Evidence of reading text at the appropriate grade level in both English and the target language
- Demonstrates ability to use both languages for social and/or academic purposes in and outside of the classroom
- Oral presentation on grade-level content in both English and the target language
- Teacher observation of academic discussions in both English and the target language
- Write two essays on grade-level appropriate topics—one in English and one in the target language

#### Biliteracy Pathway Award - 5th or 6th Grade: To receive the award, 5th or 6th graders must be able to demon-

strate progress in the following outcomes in both English and the target language:

- State assessment and/or other valid testing instrument that demonstrates progress in English language proficiency
- District-approved language proficiency assessment that demonstrates progress in the target language
- Evidence of reading text at the appropriate grade level in both English and the target language
- Documented use of English and target language by participating in volunteer activities at school or in the community
- Oral presentation on grade-level content in both English and the target language
- Write two essays on grade-level appropriate topics—one in English and one in the target language—that demonstrate sufficient command of language and content: Opinion pieces (5th grade) and Arguments (6th grade)

## **Biliteracy Attainment Award - 8th Grade**: To receive the award, 8th graders must be able to demonstrate progress in the following outcomes in both English and the target language:

- State assessment and/or other reliable and valid testing instrument that demonstrates progress in English language proficiency District-approved language proficiency assessment that demonstrates progress in the target language
- Evidence of reading text at the appropriate grade level in both English and the target language
- Documented use of English and target language by participating in volunteer activities at school or in the community
- Oral presentation on grade level content in both English and the target language
- Write two argumentative essays on grade-level appropriate topics— one in English and one in the target language—that demonstrate sufficient command of language and content

**Seal of Biliteracy – 12th Grade**: To receive this recognition on the high school diploma, 12th graders must be able to demonstrate progress in the following outcomes in both English and the target language:

- Successful completion of all high school graduation requirements including successful completion of all English/Language Arts requirements with an overall GPA of 2.0 or above for grade 9 through first semester of grade 12.
- Score of Standard Met or Standard Exceeded on the CAASPP English Language Arts/Literacy in junior year
- A score of "3" or above on the Language Advanced Placement exam or a "4" or above on the IB exam for world languages OR successful completion of the district's approved four-year curse of study in that same world language receiving a GPA of 3.0 or above in those courses.

## ENROLLMENT PROCEDURES

The Language Immersion Programs are highly sought-after programs for students within the Orange Unified School District. Parents interested in applying for an immersion program should complete the following steps:

01	Meet	All language immersion schools host informational meetings including a tour of their school. These meetings are intended to help parents understand the program and commitment of participation.
02	Application	Parents must complete the paper or online application before the close of the application window.
03	Notification	Parents will receive written notification regarding their application status within three weeks of the close of the application window.
04	Enrollment	Upon acceptance to the program, parents are directed to their school to pick up the enrollment packet. Enrollment packets have a deadline and must be submitted in a timely manner as a failure to do so may result in revocation of acceptance.
