College Bound Tips

Every student can go to college if we prepare them now. Listed below are some tips for success for grades 6 through 12. Every month, we will be adding more exciting tips.

6th Grade

- Prepare to take courses such as Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry, and foreign languages
- Help your student with homework and develop independent and critical thinking skills

7th Grade

- Spark a desire for a college education by attending College Information Days with your child.
- Establish an educational partnership between parent, student, and counselor.

8th Grade

- Attend College Days and go on family field trips to college campuses
- Sign up to take PSAT (Preliminary Scholastic Assessment Test) and SAT (Scholastic Assessment Test); the Title VI Program is paying for Santiago College SAT Workshops for April and May.

9th Grade

- Attend Back to School Nights to find out class and graduation requirements.
- With your counselor, develop a "Student Planner."

10th Grade

- Attend Special Summer Workshops
- Visit College Campuses

11th Grade

- Check with your counselor to make sure you are on track.
- Prepare for the SAT, and CAHSEE Test.
- Use the Diagnostic Writing Services of a university or use the Santiago College's Writing Workshop that is offered through the Title VI-Native American Program.

12 Grade

- Begin your college application process in September and October.
- Apply to all the schools you want to attend.
