Per Governor Newsom's Executive Order, the purpose of distance learning is to continue to deliver high-quality educational opportunities to students.

What can I expect for my elementary student?

 Approximately 2-3 hours, per day, of student learning on core lessons, focused on essential skills and standards, as well as enrichment and extra support offerings to meet student needs.



- A blend of instruction via live or prerecorded lessons, independent assignments, and opportunities for live interaction.
- Flexibility, including advance notice of the weekly schedule and tasks, with multiple days to complete required assignments.
- A variety of activities, including opportunity for creativity and choice.

What can I expect for my secondary student?

- Consistent, school-based schedules. Please check your school's web site for more information.
- Assignments posted for the week by Monday morning with estimated time needed, and multiple days given to complete required tasks.
- A blend of instruction via live or prerecorded lessons, independent assignments, and opportunities for live interaction with enrichment or intervention, as needed, focused on essential skills and standards.
- Multiple opportunities for students to engage, receive feedback, and demonstrate mastery, including opportunities to make-up or revise key tests and assignments.
