1. Welcome

Presenter: Lisa Green

Lisa Green welcomed everyone to the Curriculum Council virtual meeting. She talked about what would be covered in this meeting.

She shared some of the happenings at the high schools during the CTE walkthroughs:

2. Educational Services Update

Presenter: Cathleen Corella

Cathleen talked about the Educator Effectiveness Block Grant Lisa will be receiving. The grant will be used for professional development next school year. This will include classified and certificated staff.

She encouraged everyone to take the LCAP survey. It is an integral part of how COVID funds are aligned with our Educational Partners.

3. Overdrive

Presenter: Randy Kolset

Randy talked about Overdrive and SORA and how it is a great tool to promote reading. An email was sent out, but Randy will resend in case anyone thought it was SPAM.

- SORA allows students access to a digital library. This includes eBooks, audiobooks, and digital books. It supports instructional titles and pleasure reading.
- Overdrive shows data for groups or individuals. Teachers and students can access data of what books they have read, how many, etc. Teachers can push out books to a class, group or individual.
- Overdrive app can be accessed through the single sign on.
- Lisa asked to have staff members who want training to reach out to her to set up.

4. Novel Recommendations

Lisa talked about the Novel Committee and the Equity Task Force she has been working with. Both groups agree we need more diversity in our novels.

- Why is diversity in novels important?
- What is our process for novel approval?
- Where approved novels can be found on the district website.

- (1) Counting by Sevens by Holly Sloan
- (2) Fish in a Tree by Lynda Mullaly Hunt
- (3) Amal Unbound by Aisha Saeed
- (4) A Long Walk to Water by Linda Sue Park

The books were discussed and agreed they should be moved forward.

5. Educator Effectiveness Block Grant

Presenter: Lisa Green

- Lisa gave the background of the grant.
- \$7,468,622
- Is on the agenda to be approved at 12-15-21 board meeting
- It must be spent by 2026.
- It must be used for PD, can be classified or certificated staff
- Next steps will be to train all staff & substitutes
- There are 10 focus areas:
 - (1) Coaching & mentoring support
 - (2) Improving instruction in literacy
 - (3) Practices & strategies that reengage pupils
 - (4) Strategies to implement social-emotional needs
 - (5) Practices to create a positive school climate
 - (6) Strategies to improve inclusive practices
 - (7) Instruction & education to support implementing practices
 - (8) New professional learning networks for educators not already engaged
 - (9) Ethnic studies
 - (10) Instruction, education & strategies, learning opportunities
