REPORT, HEARING AND RESOLUTIONS RELATING TO FORMATION OF CFD NO. 2005-2 (DEL RIO SCHOOL FACILITIES) – (I) RESOLUTION OF FORMATION AND (II) RESOLUTION OF NECESSITY TO INCUR BONDED INDEBTEDNESS

DESCRIPTION:

On January 5, 2006, the Board of Education approved Resolution Nos. 30-2005-06 and 31-2005-06 that declared the intention to form CFD No. 2005-2 and called a public hearing regarding formation. It is proposed that the CFD be formed for the acquisition and construction of school facilities. North Orange Del Rio Land, LLC (the "Company") has submitted a petition requesting the School District undertake proceedings relating to the formation of the CFD at this time.

As indicated on January 5, 2006, the principal, interest, and other periodic costs of issuance for up to \$9,000,000 of the bonds proposed in the CFD will be issued in one series to finance the acquisition, design, construction, lease, improvement and/or equipping of school facilities.

The proceedings will result in the levy of an annual special tax in accordance with the procedures required in the Mello-Roos Facilities Act of 1982, as amended, commencing with Section 53311 of the California Government Code.

The Company has previously agreed to advance the costs of the formation of the CFD with the amount of the costs reimbursable to the Company, without interest, from the proceeds of the CFD when formed.

FISCAL IMPACT:

No financial impact to the District. All costs of issuance and other expenses related to CFD No. 2005-2 will be funded by the proceeds of the bond sale. The Resolutions form CFD No. 2005-2 and call an election for immediately following adoption of the Resolutions, at which the qualified electors will vote for or against the levy of the special tax, the issuance of bonds and the establishment of an appropriations limit.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education conduct the public hearing and, after considering any comments at the public hearing, approve each Resolution and call for the election of the qualified electors of CFD No. 2005-2 on February 9, 2006. (attached)

I. INTRODUCTION

The Governing Board ("Board") of the Orange Unified School District ("School District"), pursuant to the provisions of the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended, being Chapter 2.5, Part 1, Division 2, Title 5 of the Government Code of the State of California ("Act"), and specifically Section 53321.5 thereof, has directed the filing of a written report as to a proposed community facilities district. All capitalized terms not otherwise defined within this Community Facilities District Report ("Report") shall have the meanings assigned to them in the Rate and Method of Apportionment ("RMA"), which is included as Exhibit A.

This community facilities district hereinafter shall be referred to as:

COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 2005-2 (DEL RIO SCHOOL FACILITIES) OF THE ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT ("CFD No. 2005-2")

WHEREAS, The Resolution of Intention to Establish a Community Facilities District and To Authorize the Levy of Special Taxes Therein ("Resolution of Intention"), adopted by the Board on January 5, 2006, did direct that the Report generally contain the following:

- 1. A brief description of the facilities by type which will be required to adequately meet the needs of CFD No. 2005-2; and
- 2. An estimate of the cost for providing the facilities, as well as an estimate of the incidental expenses associated with the formation, issuance of Bonds, and administration of the Special Taxes of CFD No. 2005-2.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Jon M. Archibald, the authorized representative of the School District, caused the Report to be prepared pursuant to the provisions of the Act, and do hereby submit this Report to the Board.

II. DESCRIPTION OF CFD

CFD No. 2005-2 is composed of approximately 73.07 gross acres in the County of Orange ("County") and the City of Orange ("City"). CFD No. 2005-2 is located on the northwest corner of Glassell Street and Lincoln Avenue (see Exhibit B for a map of the boundaries of CFD No. 2005-2) ("Project"). Table 1 shows the projected product composition of the 611 Units expected to be built in CFD No. 2005-2.

CFD No. 2005-2 is being formed pursuant to the School Impact Mitigation Agreement dated November 18, 2004 ("Agreement") between the School District and North Orange Del Rio Land, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company ("Developer"). The District has been advised that the Developer has contracted to sell the land to Lennar Centex Del Rio Partners, LLC, a Delaware limited liability company ("Builder"). The Agreement establishes (i) amounts to be financed which partially offset the facility impacts on the School District of development in CFD No. 2005-2 and (ii) terms for the establishment of CFD No. 2005-2 and the issuance of Bonds by CFD No. 2005-2. The amount of bond proceeds to be delivered to the School District is established in the Agreement as \$4.28 per square footage of Assessable Space, as defined in the Agreement, assuming Bonds are issued by July 1, 2006.

In addition, CFD No. 2005-2 is being formed parallel to Community Facilities District No. 06-1 (Del Rio Public Improvements) of the City of Orange ("CFD No. 06-1").

III. SENATE BILL 165 COMPLIANCE

After January 1, 2001, any voter approved local special tax and/or bond measure that would provide for the imposition of a special tax or sale of bonds by a local agency is subject to the requirements of Senate Bill ("SB") 165. Generally, SB 165 requires that any such measure contain a statement indicating the purpose of the special tax and/or bond; that the proceeds of the special tax and/or bond proceeds be applied only to the purpose identified; that an account be created in which the proceeds are to be deposited; and that an annual report be prepared pursuant to Section 50075.3 or 53411 of the Government Code, providing an accounting of the funds collected and expended and a status report of any project required or authorized to be funded.

The Resolution of Intention, as well as other documents approved by the Board, indicates the purpose of the Special Tax, and the Developer will provide a written acknowledgement of such purpose when the ballots are signed and returned. As of the date of this Report, no other requirements of SB 165 pertain with respect to CFD No. 2005-2. However, the School District is aware of all its obligations under SB 165 and intends to satisfy all such obligations on an ongoing basis to ensure continued compliance with SB 165 in the future.

IV. DESCRIPTION OF FACILITIES

The purpose of CFD No. 2005-2 is to provide for the cost of financing the acquisition, construction, expansion, improvement, or rehabilitation of the authorized facilities. Descriptions of the authorized facilities, which are defined in Exhibit B to the Resolution of Intention, are provided below.

Α. **General Description**

School Facilities

CFD No. 2005-2 may finance the acquisition, installation and construction of public school facilities, and include all facilities authorized by the Act. All facilities shall have a useful life of five years or greater. The improvements which can be acquired and constructed include, but are not limited to, the following: school facilities, sites, site improvements and classroom furnishings and equipment (including to the extent permitted by law, vehicles and computer equipment) and including landscaping, access roadways, drainage, sidewalks and gutters, utility lines, playground areas and equipment, classrooms, recreational facilities, onsite office space at a school, central support and administrative facilities, interim housing and transportation facilities.

The facilities listed above are representative of the types of improvements to be furnished by CFD No. 2005-2. Addition, deletion or modification of descriptions of facilities may be made consistent with the requirements of the School District, CFD No. 2005-2 and the Act.

Non-School Facilities

CFD No. 2005-2 will not finance any Non-School Facilities.

В. **Estimated Cost of Capital Improvements**

CFD No. 2005-2 is expected to issue one (1) series of Bonds to finance the acquisition, construction, expansion, improvement, or rehabilitation of the authorized facilities. The total amount of construction proceeds to be generated from the Bonds issued by CFD No. 2005-2 is projected to be \$4,593,459. This amount is an estimate and is subject to change, depending on the projected number of Units to be constructed, interest rates of the Bonds, the costs of issuance of the Bonds, and other factors to be determined at the time the Bonds are issued.

C. **Estimated Incidental Expenses**

Pursuant to Section 53340 of the Act, the proceeds of any Special Tax levied and collected by CFD No. 2005-2 may be used only to pay, in whole or in part, for the cost of providing public facilities and incidental expenses. Incidental expenses include the attributable costs of engineering, design, planning, materials testing, coordination, construction staking, and construction, together with the expenses related to issuance and sale of any "debt", as defined in Section 53317(d) of the Act, including underwriters' discount, appraisals, market studies, reserve fund, capitalized interest, bond counsel, special tax consultant, bond and official statement printing, administrative expenses of the School District, bond trustee or

fiscal agent, and any such debt and all other incidental expenses. The incidental expenses associated with the formation of CFD No. 2005-2 and the issuance of Bonds is expected to be approximately \$1,240,933. This amount includes issuance costs for the Bonds, six months (6) of capitalized interest, pre-funded administration, underwriter's discount, and a reserve fund deposit equal to (10) percent of the principal amount of the Bonds. The incidental expenses associated with the annual administration of CFD No. 2005-2 are not expected to exceed \$30,000 in Calendar Year 2006 dollars. However, these amounts are estimates and subject to change.

V. RATE AND METHOD OF APPORTIONMENT

All of the property located in CFD No. 2005-2, unless exempted by law or by Section K of the RMA, shall be taxed for the purpose of providing necessary facilities to serve CFD No. 2005-2. As shown in Exhibit A, the RMA provides information sufficient to allow each property owner within CFD No. 2005-2 to estimate the Maximum Special Tax applicable to his or her property. The discussion provided below is intended merely as a general description of the RMA, not as a substitute, and in no way supersedes the RMA.

A. Classification of Assessor's Parcels

Each Fiscal Year, beginning with Fiscal Year 2006-07, each Assessor's Parcel within CFD No. 2005-2 shall be classified as Taxable Property or Exempt Property. Each Assessor's Parcel of Taxable Property shall be further classified as Developed Property if a Building Permit for such Assessor's Parcel was issued on or before May 1 of the prior Fiscal Year, provided that (i) such Assessor's Parcel was created prior to January 1 of the prior Fiscal Year and (ii) such Assessor's Parcel is associated with a Lot, as determined reasonably by the Board. All Assessor's Parcels of Taxable Property that are not Developed Property shall be classified as Undeveloped Property. Each Assessor's Parcel that cannot be classified as Exempt Property because such classification would reduce the Acreage of all Taxable Property of CFD No. 2005-2 to less than 22.21 acres of Acreage, as described in Section K of the RMA, shall continue to be classified as Developed Property or Undeveloped Property, as applicable.

B. <u>Maximum Special Taxes</u>

The Maximum Special Tax for each Assessor's Parcel in CFD No. 2005-2 classified as Developed Property for any Fiscal Year shall be the amount determined by the greater of (i) the application of the Assigned Annual Special Tax or (ii) the application of the Backup Annual Special Tax for a given Final Map. The Maximum Special Tax for Assessor's Parcels in CFD No. 2005-2 classified as Undeveloped Property for any Fiscal Year shall be the amount determined by the application of the Assigned Annual Special Tax. Table 2 displays the Assigned Annual Special Tax rates for Developed Property.

For each Fiscal Year, commencing with Fiscal Year 2006-07, the Assigned Annual Special Tax for all Developed Property shall be increased by two percent (2.00%) of the amount in effect in the prior Fiscal Year.

The Assigned Annual Special Tax rate for an Assessor's Parcel classified as Undeveloped Property shall be \$20,842.71 per acre of Acreage. For each Fiscal Year, commencing with Fiscal Year 2006-07, the Assigned Annual Special Tax for all Undeveloped Property shall be increased by two percent (2.00%) of the amount in effect in the prior Fiscal Year.

The Backup Annual Special Tax rate for Developed Property shall be calculated as described in Section E of the RMA, whereby each Lot in a Final Map is allocated an equal share of the Special Tax obligation of the Final Map. Each July 1, commencing on the July 1 first following the initial calculation of the Backup Annual Special Tax rate for an Assessor's Parcel of Developed Property, the Backup Annual Special Tax shall be increased by two percent (2.00%) at the amount in effect the prior Fiscal Year.

C. Method of Apportionment

Commencing Fiscal Year 2006-07 and for each subsequent Fiscal Year, the Board shall levy an Annual Special Tax on each Assessor's Parcel of Developed Property in an amount equal to the Assigned Annual Special Tax applicable to each such Assessor's Parcel. Annual Special Taxes collected will be used to satisfy the Minimum Annual Special Tax Requirement for Bonds issued by CFD No. 2005-2. If additional Annual Special Taxes are needed to satisfy the Minimum Annual Special Tax Requirement, then the Board shall

Proportionately levy an Annual Special Tax on each Assessor's Parcel of Undeveloped Property, up to the Maximum Special Tax applicable to each such Assessor's Parcel, to satisfy the Minimum Annual Special Tax Requirement. If additional Annual Special Taxes are still needed to satisfy the Minimum Annual Special Tax Requirement, then the Board shall Proportionately levy an Annual Special Tax on each Assessor's Parcel of Developed Property (whose Maximum Special Tax is derived by application of the Backup Annual Special Tax), up to the Maximum Special Tax applicable to each Assessor's Parcel to satisfy the Minimum Annual Special Tax Requirement.

D. Excess Assigned Annual Special Tax

In any Fiscal Year, when proceeds of Assigned Annual Special Tax for Developed Property are greater than the Minimum Annual Special Tax Requirement then such amount shall be paid to the School District. The proceeds shall be used for acquisition, construction or financing school facilities in accordance with the Act and other applicable law as determined by the School District.

E. Prepayment of Annual Special Tax Obligations

The Annual Special Tax obligation of an Assessor's Parcel of Developed Property or an Assessor's Parcel of Undeveloped Property for which a Building Permit has been issued may be prepaid, provided that there are no delinquent Special Taxes, penalties, or interest charges outstanding with respect to such Assessor's Parcel at the time the Annual Special Tax obligation would be prepaid. The Prepayment Amount for an Assessor's Parcel shall be determined as set forth in Section H of the RMA.

F. Partial Prepayment of Annual Special Tax Obligations

The Annual Special Tax obligation of an Assessor's Parcel may be partially prepaid at the times and under the condition set forth in Section I of the RMA, provided that there are no delinquent Special Taxes, penalties, or interest charges outstanding with respect to such Assessor's Parcel at the time the Annual Special Tax obligation would be prepaid.

G. <u>Termination of Special Tax</u>

Annual Special Taxes shall be levied for a period of three (3) Fiscal Years past the life of the Bonds, provided that Annual Special Taxes shall not be levied after Fiscal Year 2050-51.

VI. BOUNDARIES OF COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT

A map of the boundaries of CFD No. 2005-2 is included as Exhibit B. The boundaries of CFD No. 2005-2 include all of the properties on which Special Taxes may be levied by CFD No. 2005-2. A boundary map of CFD No. 2005-2 is on file in the records of the County Recorder.

VII. GENERAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

The general terms and conditions of CFD No. 2005-2 are as follows:

A. Substitution of Facilities

The descriptions of the authorized facilities, as set forth herein, are general in their nature. The final nature of the authorized facilities will be determined upon the preparation of final plans and specifications. The final plans may show substitutes in lieu of, or modifications to, the proposed work in order to accomplish the authorized purposes of CFD No. 2005-2. Any such substitution shall not be considered a change or modification in the proceedings so long as the facilities are substantially similar to those set forth in this Report and are authorized by the proceedings under which CFD No. 2005-2 was formed.

B. Bonds

In order to finance the facilities set forth in this Report, it is necessary that Bonds be issued pursuant to the terms, conditions, and authorizations as set forth in the Act, commencing with Section 53311 thereof and specifically, Article 5 therein. The maximum authorized bonded indebtedness for CFD No. 2005-2 has been specified as an amount of \$9,000,000.

C. Appeals and Interpretation Procedure

According to Section L of the RMA, any property owner claiming that the amount or application of the Special Tax is not correct may file a written notice of appeal with the Board not later than twelve (12) months after having paid the first installment of the Special Tax that is disputed. In order to be considered sufficient, any claim of appeal must: (i) specifically identify the property by address and Assessor's Parcel Number; (ii) state the amount in dispute and whether it is the whole amount or only a portion of the Special Tax; (iii) state all grounds on which the property owner is disputing the amount or application of the Special Tax, including a reasonably detailed explanation as to why the amount or application of such Special Tax is incorrect; (iv) include all documentation, if any, in support of the claim; and (v) be verified under penalty of perjury by the person who paid the Special Tax or his or her guardian, executor or administrator. A representative(s) of CFD No. 2005-2 ("Representative") shall promptly review the claim, and if necessary, meet with the property owner, consider written and oral evidence regarding the amount of the Special Tax, and rule on the claim. The decisions of the Representative(s) shall be final and binding. If the representative's decision requires that the Special Tax for an Assessor's Parcel be modified or changed in favor of the property owner, a cash refund shall not be made (except for the last year of levy), but an adjustment shall be made to the Annual Special Tax on that Assessor's Parcel in the subsequent Fiscal Year(s).

RATE AND METHOD OF APPORTIONMENT FOR COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 2005-2 (DEL RIO SCHOOL FACILITIES) OF ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

The following sets forth the Rate and Method of Apportionment for the levy and collection of Special Taxes of Orange Unified School District ("School District") in Community Facilities District CFD No. 2005-2 (Del Rio School Facilities) of Orange Unified School District ("CFD No. 2005-2"). An Annual Special Tax shall be levied on and collected in CFD No. 2005-2 each Fiscal Year in an amount determined through the application of the Rate and Method of Apportionment described below. All of the real property in CFD No. 2005-2, unless exempted by law or by the provisions hereof, shall be taxed for the purposes, to the extent, and in the manner herein provided.

SECTION A DEFINITIONS

The terms hereinafter set forth have the following meanings:

- "Acreage" means the number of acres of land area of an Assessor's Parcel as shown on an Assessor's Parcel Map, or if the land area is not shown on an Assessor's Parcel Map, the Board may rely on the land area shown on the applicable Final Subdivision Map, parcel map, condominium plan, or other recorded County parcel map.
- "Act" means the Mello-Roos Communities Facilities Act of 1982 as amended, being Chapter 2.5, Division 2 of Title 5 of the Government Code of the State of California.
- "Administrative Expenses" means any ordinary and necessary expense incurred by the School District on behalf of CFD No. 2005-2 related to the determination of the amount of the levy of Special Taxes, the collection of Special Taxes including the reasonable expenses of collecting delinquencies, the administration of Bonds, the proportionate payment of salaries and benefits of any School District employee whose duties are directly related to the administration of CFD No. 2005-2, and costs otherwise incurred in order to carry out the authorized purposes of CFD No. 2005-2.
- "Annual Special Tax" means the Special Tax actually levied in any Fiscal Year on any Assessor's Parcel.
- "Assessor's Parcel" means a lot or parcel of land designated on an Assessor's Parcel Map with an assigned Assessor's Parcel Number within the boundaries of CFD No. 2005-2.
- "Assessor's Parcel Map" means an official map of the Assessor of the County designating parcels by Assessor's Parcel Number.
- "Assessor's Parcel Number" or "APN" means that number assigned to an Assessor's Parcel by the County for purposes of identification.
- "Assigned Annual Special Tax" means the Special Tax of that name described in Section D.

- "Attached Unit" means a Unit that is located within a building in which each of the individual Units has or shall have at least one common wall with another Unit.
- "Backup Annual Special Tax" means the Special Tax of that name described in Section E.
- "Board" means the Board of Education of Orange Unified School District or its designee as the legislative body of CFD No. 2005-2.
- "Bond Index" means the national Bond Buyer Revenue Bond Index, commonly referenced as the 25-Bond Revenue Index. In the event the Bond Index ceases to be published, the index used shall be based on a comparable index for revenue bonds maturing in 30 years with an average rating equivalent to Moody's A1 and S&P's A-plus, as reasonably determined by the Board.
- "Bonds" means any obligation to repay a sum of money, including obligations in the form of bonds, notes, certificates of participation, long-term leases, loans from government agencies, or loans from banks, other financial institutions, private businesses, or individuals, or long-term contracts, or any refunding thereof, which obligation may be incurred by CFD No. 2005-2.
- "Building Permit" means a permit for the construction of one or more Units issued by the City for the construction of Units within the City, or another public agency in the event the City no longer issues permits for the construction of Units within CFD No. 2005-2. For purposes of this definition, "Building Permit" shall not include permits for construction or installation of commercial/industrial structures, parking structures, retaining walls, utility improvements, or other such improvements not intended for human habitation.
- "Building Square Footage" or "BSF" means the square footage of assessable internal living space of a Unit, exclusive of any carports, walkways, garages, overhangs, patios, enclosed patios, detached accessory structure, or other structures not used as living space, as determined by reference to the Building Permit for such Unit.
- "Calendar Year" means the period commencing January 1 of any year and ending the following December 31.
- "CFD No. 2005-2" means Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 (Del Rio School Facilities) of Orange Unified School District.
- "City" means the City of Orange.
- "County" means the County of Orange, State of California.
- "Detached Unit" means a Unit which is not an Attached Unit.
- "Developed Property" means all Assessor's Parcels of Taxable Property for which Building Permits were issued on or before May 1 of the prior Fiscal Year, provided that such Assessor's Parcels were created on or before January 1 of the prior Fiscal Year and that each such Assessor's Parcel is associated with a Lot, as determined reasonably by the Board.
- "Exempt Property" means all Assessors' Parcels designated as being exempt from Special Taxes in Section K.

- "Final Subdivision Map" means a final tract map, parcel map, lot line adjustment, or functionally equivalent map or instrument that creates building sites, recorded in the County Office of the Recorder.
- "Fiscal Year" means the period commencing on July 1 of any year and ending the following June 30.
- "Lot" means an individual legal lot created by a Final Subdivision Map for which a Building Permit for residential construction has been or could be issued. Notwithstanding the foregoing, in the case of an individual legal lot created by such a Final Subdivision Map upon which condominium units are entitled to be developed but for which a condominium plan has not been recorded, the number of Lots allocable to such legal lot for purposes of calculating the Backup Special Tax applicable to such Final Subdivision Map shall equal the number of condominium units which are permitted to be constructed on such legal lot as shown on such Final Subdivision Map.
- "Maximum Annual Special Tax" means the maximum Special Tax, determined in accordance with Section C that can be levied by CFD No. 2005-2 in any Fiscal Year on any Assessor's Parcel of Taxable Property.
- "Minimum Annual Special Tax Requirement" means the amount required in any Fiscal Year to pay: (i) the debt service or the periodic costs on all outstanding Bonds, (ii) Administrative Expenses of CFD No. 2005-2, (iii) the costs associated with the release of funds from an escrow account, and (iv) any amount required to establish or replenish any reserve funds established in association with the Bonds, less (v) any amount available to pay debt service or other periodic costs on the Bonds pursuant to any applicable bond indenture, fiscal agent agreement, or trust agreement.
- "Partial Prepayment Amount" means the amount required to prepay a portion of the Annual Special Tax obligation for an Assessor's Parcel, as described in Section I.
- "Prepayment Administrative Fees" means the fees and expenses associated with the prepayment, including the costs of computation of the Prepayment Amount, costs of redeeming Bonds, and costs of recording any notices to evidence the prepayment and redemption of Bonds.
- "Prepayment Amount" means the amount required to prepay the Annual Special Tax obligation in full for an Assessor's Parcel, as described in Section H.
- "Present Value of Taxes" means the present value of any Special Tax applicable to such Assessor's Parcel in the current Fiscal Year not yet received by the School District for CFD No. 2005-2, plus the expected Annual Special Tax applicable to such Assessor's Parcel in each remaining Fiscal Year until the termination date specified in Section J, using as the discount rate the lesser of (i) the Yield On The Bonds after Bond issuance or (ii) the most recently published Bond Index prior to Bond issuance.
- "Proportionately" means that the ratio of the actual Annual Special Tax levy to the applicable Assigned Annual Special Tax is equal for all applicable Assessors' Parcels.
- "Reserve Fund Credit" (if any) means, for each owner of an Assessor's Parcel wishing to prepay the Annual Special Tax obligation of such Assessor's Parcel, an amount equal to the reduction in the

reserve requirement for the outstanding Bonds resulting from the redemption of Bonds with the applicable prepaid Special Taxes. In the event that a surety bond of other credit instrument satisfies the reserve requirement or the reserve requirement is under-funded at the time of the prepayment, no Reserve Fund Credit shall be given.

"School District" means Orange Unified School District

"Special Tax" means any of the special taxes authorized to be levied by CFD No. 2005-2 pursuant to the Act and this Rate and Method of Apportionment.

"Taxable Property" means all Assessors' Parcels which are not Exempt Property.

"Undeveloped Property" means all Assessors' Parcels of Taxable Property which are not Developed Property.

"Unit" means each separate residential dwelling unit which comprises an independent facility capable of conveyance separate from adjacent residential dwelling units.

"Yield On The Bonds" means the arbitrage yield for the last series of Bonds issued.

SECTION B CLASSIFICATION OF ASSESSOR'S PARCELS

For each Fiscal Year, beginning with Fiscal Year 2006-07, each Assessor's Parcel within CFD No. 2005-2 shall be classified as Taxable Property or Exempt Property. Furthermore, each Assessor's Parcel of Taxable Property shall be classified as Developed Property or Undeveloped Property. For each Assessor's Parcel of Developed Property, it shall be assigned to a Special Tax class based on the Building Square Footage of the Unit as listed on the Building Permit(s) issued for each Assessor's Parcel.

SECTION C MAXIMUM SPECIAL TAXES

1. Developed Property

The Maximum Special Tax for each Assessor's Parcel classified as Developed Property for any Fiscal Year shall be the amount determined by the greater of (i) the application of the Assigned Annual Special Tax or (ii) the application of the Backup Annual Special Tax.

2. Undeveloped Property

The Maximum Special Tax for each Assessor's Parcel classified as Undeveloped Property for any Fiscal Year shall be the amount determined by the application of the Assigned Annual Special Tax.

SECTION D ASSIGNED ANNUAL SPECIAL TAXES

1. Developed Property

The Assigned Annual Special Tax in Fiscal Year 2005-06 for each Assessor's Parcel of Developed Property shall be the amount determined by reference to Table 1.

For each Fiscal Year, commencing with Fiscal Year 2006-07, the Assigned Annual Special Tax for all Developed Property shall be increased by two percent (2.00%) of the amount in effect in the prior Fiscal Year.

2. <u>Undeveloped Property</u>

The Assigned Annual Special Tax rate in Fiscal Year 2005-06 for an Assessor's Parcel classified as Undeveloped Property shall be \$20,842.71 per acre of Acreage.

For each Fiscal Year, commencing with Fiscal Year 2006-07, the Assigned Annual Special Tax for all Undeveloped Property shall be increased by two percent (2.00%) of the amount in effect in the prior Fiscal Year.

SECTION E BACKUP ANNUAL SPECIAL TAXES

Each Fiscal Year, each Assessor's Parcel of Developed Property shall be subject to a Backup Annual Special Tax. The Backup Annual Special Tax rate for Developed Property within a Final Subdivision Map shall be the rate per Lot calculated according to the following formula in Fiscal Year 2006-07 or such later Fiscal Year in which such Final Subdivision Map is created:

The terms above have the following meanings:

B = Backup Annual Special Tax per Lot in each Fiscal Year

U = Assigned Annual Special Tax per acre of Acreage for Undeveloped Property in the Fiscal Year the calculation is performed

A = Acreage of Taxable Property in such Final Subdivision Map after subtracting the Exempt Property as determined by the Board in Section K

L = Lots in the Final Subdivision Map

Each July 1, commencing the July 1 first following the initial calculation of the Backup Annual Special Tax rate for an Assessor's Parcel of Developed Property, the Backup Annual Special Tax shall be increased by two percent (2.00%) of the amount in effect the prior Fiscal Year.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, if all or any portion of the Final Subdivision Map(s) described in the preceding paragraph is subsequently changed or modified, then the Backup Annual Special Tax for each Assessor's Parcel of Developed Property in such Final Subdivision Map area that is changed or modified shall be a rate per square foot of Acreage calculated as follows:

- 1. Determine the total Backup Annual Special Taxes anticipated to apply to the changed or modified Final Subdivision Map area prior to the change or modification.
- 2. The result of paragraph 1 above shall be divided by the Acreage of Taxable Property which is ultimately expected to exist in such changed or modified Final Subdivision Map area, as reasonably determined by the Board.
- 3. The result of paragraph 2 above shall be divided by 43,560. The result is the Backup Annual Special Tax per square foot of Acreage which shall be applicable to Assessor's Parcels of Developed Property in such changed or modified Final Subdivision Map area for all remaining Fiscal Years in which the Special Tax may be levied. Each July 1, commencing the July 1 first following the initial calculation of the revised Backup Annual Special Tax rate for an Assessor's Parcel of Developed Property, the Backup Annual Special Tax shall be increased by two percent (2.00%) of the amount in effect the prior Fiscal Year. The Backup Annual Special Tax for an Assessor's

Parcel of Developed Property in a Final Subdivision Map that is not changed or modified shall not be recalculated.

SECTION F EXCESS ASSIGNED ANNUAL SPECIAL TAX FROM DEVELOPED PROPERTY

In any Fiscal Year, when proceeds of Assigned Annual Special Tax for Developed Property are greater than the Minimum Annual Special Tax Requirement, then such amount shall be paid to the School District. The proceeds shall be used for acquisition, construction or financing school facilities in accordance with the Act and other applicable law as determined by the School District.

SECTION G METHOD OF APPORTIONMENT OF THE ANNUAL SPECIAL TAX

Commencing Fiscal Year 2006-07 and for each subsequent Fiscal Year, the Board shall levy Annual Special Taxes as follows:

Step One: The Board shall levy an Annual Special Tax on each Assessor's Parcel of Developed

Property in an amount equal to the Assigned Annual Special Tax applicable to each

such Assessor's Parcel.

Step Two: If the sum of the amounts levied in step one is insufficient to satisfy the Minimum

Annual Special Tax Requirement, then the Board shall Proportionately levy an Annual Special Tax on each Assessor's Parcel of Undeveloped Property, up to the Maximum Special Tax applicable to each such Assessor's Parcel, to satisfy the

Minimum Annual Special Tax Requirement.

Step Three: If the sum of the amounts levied in steps one and two is insufficient to satisfy the

Minimum Annual Special Tax Requirement, then the Board shall Proportionately levy an Annual Special Tax on each Assessor's Parcel of Developed Property whose Maximum Special Tax is derived by application of the Backup Annual Special Tax, up to the Maximum Special Tax applicable to each such Assessor's Parcel, to satisfy

the Minimum Annual Special Tax Requirement.

SECTION H PREPAYMENT OF ANNUAL SPECIAL TAXES

The Annual Special Tax obligation of an Assessor's Parcel of Developed Property or an Assessor's Parcel of Undeveloped Property for which a Building Permit has been issued may be prepaid. An owner of an Assessor's Parcel intending to prepay the Annual Special Tax obligation shall provide CFD No. 2005-2 with written notice of intent to prepay. Within thirty (30) days of receipt of such written notice, the Board shall reasonably determine the Prepayment Amount of such Assessor's Parcel and shall notify such owner of such Prepayment Amount. In addition, any property owner prepaying his or her Annual Special Tax obligation must also pay all delinquent Special Taxes, interest and penalties owing on the Assessor's Parcel on which payment is being made, if any. The Prepayment Amount shall be calculated according to the following formula:

$$P = PVT - RFC + PAF$$

The terms above have the following meanings:

P = Prepayment Amount PVT = Present Value of Taxes RFC = Reserve Fund Credit

PAF = Prepayment Administrative Fees

Notwithstanding the foregoing, no prepayment will be allowed unless the amount of Annual Special Taxes that may be levied on Taxable Property, net of Administrative Expenses, shall be at least 1.1 times the regularly scheduled annual interest and principal payments on all currently outstanding Bonds in each future Fiscal Year and such prepayment will not impair the security of all currently outstanding Bonds, as reasonably determined by the Board. Such determination shall include identifying all Assessors' Parcels that are expected to become Exempt Property.

SECTION I PARTIAL PREPAYMENT OF ANNUAL SPECIAL TAXES

The Annual Special Tax obligation of an Assessor's Parcel may be partially prepaid at the times and under the conditions set forth in this section, provided that there are no delinquent Special Taxes, penalties, or interest charges outstanding with respect to such Assessor's Parcel at the time the Annual Special Tax obligation would be prepaid.

1. Partial Prepayment Times and Conditions

Prior to the issuance of the first Building Permit for the construction of a production Unit on a Lot within a Final Subdivision Map area, the owner of no less than all the Taxable Property within such Final Subdivision Map area may elect in writing to the Board to prepay a portion of the Annual Special Tax obligations for all the Assessor's Parcels within such Final Subdivision Map area, as calculated in Section I.2. below. The partial prepayment of each Annual Special Tax obligation shall be collected prior to the issuance of the first Building Permit with respect to each Assessor's Parcel.

2. Partial Prepayment Amount

The Partial Prepayment Amount shall be calculated according to the following formula:

$$PP = P_H \times F$$

The terms above have the following meanings:

PP = the Partial Prepayment Amount

P_H = the Prepayment Amount calculated according to Section H

F = the percent by which the owner of the Assessor's Parcel is partially prepaying the Annual Special Tax obligation

3. Partial Prepayment Procedures and Limitations

With respect to any Assessor's Parcel that is partially prepaid, the Board shall indicate in the

records of CFD No. 2005-2 that there has been a partial prepayment of the Annual Special Tax obligation and shall cause a suitable notice to be recorded in compliance with the Act to indicate the partial prepayment of the Annual Special Tax obligation and the partial release of the Annual Special Tax lien on such Assessor's Parcel, and the obligation of such Assessor's Parcel to pay such prepaid portion of the Annual Special Tax shall cease. Additionally, the notice shall indicate that the Assigned Annual Special Tax and the Backup Annual Special Tax for the Assessor's Parcels have been reduced by an amount equal to the percentage which was partially prepaid.

Notwithstanding the foregoing, no partial prepayment will be allowed unless the amount of Annual Special Taxes that may be levied on Taxable Property after such partial prepayment, net of Administrative Expenses, shall be at least 1.1 times the regularly scheduled annual interest and principal payments on all currently outstanding Bonds in each future Fiscal Year.

SECTION J TERMINATION OF SPECIAL TAX

Annual Special Taxes shall be levied for a period of three (3) Fiscal Years past the life of the Bonds, provided that Annual Special Taxes shall not be levied after Fiscal Year 2050-51.

SECTION K EXEMPTIONS

The Board shall classify as Exempt Property (i) Assessor's Parcels owned by the State of California, Federal or other local governments, (ii) Assessor's Parcels which are used as places of worship and are exempt from ad valorem property taxes because they are owned by a religious organization, (iii) Assessor's Parcels used exclusively by a homeowners' association, (iv) Assessor's Parcels with public or utility easements making impractical their utilization for other than the purposes set forth in the easement, (v) Assessor's Parcels developed or expected to be developed exclusively for non-residential use, including any use directly servicing any non-residential property, such as parking, as reasonably determined by the Board, and (vi) any other Assessor's Parcels at the reasonable discretion of the Board, provided that no such classification would reduce the sum of all Taxable Property to less than 22.21 acres of Acreage. Notwithstanding the above, the Board shall not classify an Assessor's Parcel as Exempt Property if such classification would reduce the sum of all Taxable Property to less than 22.21 acres of Acreage. Assessor's Parcels which cannot be classified as Exempt Property because such classification would reduce the Acreage of all Taxable Property to less than 22.21 acres of Acreage will continue to be classified as Developed Property or Undeveloped Property, as applicable, and will continue to be subject to Special Taxes accordingly.

SECTION L CLAIMS

Any property owner claiming that the amount or application of the Special Tax is not correct may file a written notice of appeal with the Board not later than twelve months after having paid the first installment of the Special Tax that is disputed. In order to be considered sufficient, any claim of appeal must: (i) specifically identify the property by address and Assessor's Parcel Number; (ii) state the amount in dispute and whether it is the whole amount or only a portion of the Special Tax; (iii) state all grounds on which the property owner is disputing the amount or application of the

Special Tax, including a reasonably detailed explanation as to why the amount or application of such Special Tax is incorrect; (iv) include all documentation, if any, in support of the claim; and (v) be verified under penalty of perjury by the person who paid the Special Tax or his or her guardian, executor or administrator. A representative(s) of CFD No. 2005-2 ("Representative") shall promptly review the claim, and if necessary, meet with the property owner, consider written and oral evidence regarding the amount of the Special Tax, and rule on the claim. The decisions of the Representative(s) shall be final and binding. If the Representative's decision requires that the Special Tax for an Assessor's Parcel be modified or changed in favor of the property owner, a cash refund shall not be made (except for the last year of levy), but an adjustment shall be made to the Annual Special Tax on that Assessor's Parcel in the subsequent Fiscal Year(s) as the Representative's decisions shall indicate.

SECTION M MANNER OF COLLECTION

The Annual Special Tax shall be collected in the same manner and at the same time as ordinary *ad valorem* property taxes, provided, however, that CFD No. 2005-2 may collect Annual Special Taxes at a different time or in a different manner if necessary to meet its financial obligations, including the ability to direct bill the properties in CFD No. 2005-2.

RESOLUTION NO. 32-05-06

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT ESTABLISHING COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 2005-2 (DEL RIO SCHOOL FACILITIES) OF THE ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, PROVIDING FOR A SPECIAL TAX TO PAY FOR CERTAIN PUBLIC FACILITIES AND BONDED INDEBTEDNESS, CALLING A SPECIAL ELECTION TO SUBMIT TO THE RESPECTIVE QUALIFIED ELECTORS THE QUESTION OF LEVYING SUCH SPECIAL TAX, AUTHORIZING ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE PUBLIC FACILITIES AND ESTABLISHING AN APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT FOR THE COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT AND DESIGNATING THE ELECTION OFFICIAL FOR SUCH MATTERS

WHEREAS, the Board of Education (the "Board of Education") of the Orange Unified School District, Orange County, California (the "School District") on January 5, 2006, duly adopted Resolution No. 30-05-06 (the "Resolution of Intention") declaring its intention to establish "Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 (Del Rio School Facilities) of the Orange Unified School District" (the "Community Facilities District No. 2005-2"), and to levy special taxes to pay for certain public facilities and bonded indebtedness under and pursuant to the terms and provisions of the "Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982" (the "Act"), being Chapter 2.5, Part 1, Division 2, Title 5 of the Government Code of the State of California, and calling a public hearing on the question of the establishment of such Community Facilities District No. 2005-2; and

WHEREAS, prior to the time for such hearing, in accordance with said Resolution of Intention, a report on such proposal entitled "Community Facilities District Report for Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 (Del Rio School Facilities) of the Orange Unified School District" and dated on or prior to the date of the public hearing was filed with the Board of Education (the "CFD Report"), and such CFD Report was filed with the Superintendent of the School District and is incorporated herein and made a part of the record of the hearing on said Resolution of Intention; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Resolution of Intention, a noticed public hearing was held by the Board of Education on February 9, 2006, at the regular meeting place of the Board of Education, 1401 North Handy Street, Orange, California 92867, at which hearing the Board of Education considered the establishment of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, the type and extent of the proposed public facilities (the "Facilities"), the proposed rate and method of apportionment of special tax for Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 as set forth in Exhibit C of the Resolution of Intention (the "Rate and Method"), the proposed appropriations limit for Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, the necessity for incurring bonded indebtedness for Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 to finance the Facilities and all other matters as set forth in the Resolution of Intention; and at the above-mentioned time and place for such public hearing, all persons interested, including all taxpayers, property owners and registered voters within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, were given an opportunity to appear and be heard, and the testimony of all interested persons for or against the establishment of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, the financing of the Facilities, the levy of the special tax, the extent of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, the establishment of an appropriations limit for Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, the necessity for incurring bonded indebtedness by Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 to finance the Facilities and any other matters set forth in said Resolution of Intention, were heard; and

WHEREAS, said public hearing was conducted as announced on February 9, 2006, at which time all of the foregoing matters were considered and the Board of Education at the conclusion of said hearing was fully advised in the premises and was authorized to proceed as hereinafter provided; and

WHEREAS, on the basis of all of the foregoing, the Board of Education has determined at this time to proceed with the establishment of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 as provided by said Resolution of Intention to submit to the qualified electors of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 the propositions in substantially the form attached hereto as Exhibit A, to authorize the levy of a special tax pursuant to the Rate and Method and to pay for the Facilities proposed to be provided for Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 as described in Exhibit B to the Resolution of Intention; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has determined, based on a Certificate of the Executive Director, Facilities and Planning, that there are no registered voters residing in Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 and that the qualified electors in Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 are the owners of land within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education has received the "Petition (including Consent and Waiver)" or a Consent and Waiver of the owners of land within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 waiving certain election requirements; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education is fully advised in the premises;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. All of the above recitals are true and correct.

Section 2. The Board of Education, acting as the legislative body of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, hereby approves and adopts said Resolution of Intention, notice of which was published and mailed prior to the public hearing as required by law, and, except as otherwise provided herein, reconfirms all of its findings and determinations contained in said Resolution of Intention. The Board of Education hereby approves and adopts the Rate and Method and the manner of collection of the special tax as set forth in Exhibit C of the Resolution of Intention and which also appears as Exhibit A to the CFD Report. To the extent required by Section 53325.1(a) of the Act, all of the information contained in the Resolution of Intention is incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

Section 3. The Board of Education hereby approves and ratifies the map filed by or on behalf of the District Superintendent in the Office of the County Recorder of the County of Orange as the boundaries of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 (the "Map"), subject to modifications made at the time of adoption of this Resolution. In accordance with Section 3111 and 3113 of the California Streets and Highways Code, said map was recorded on January 10, 2006, as Instrument Number 2006-0000-17965, in Book 91, Page 22 in the Book of Maps of Assessments and Community Facilities Districts in the County Recorder's Office of the County of Orange. In accordance with Section 53325.5 of the Act, the Board of Education hereby approves the boundaries of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 as referenced in the Resolution of Intention. The special tax for Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 shall be as set forth in the Rate and Method; and the boundaries of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 shall be as set forth in the Map, both in the form incorporated herein and made a part hereof.

Section 4. The Board of Education finds and determines that written protests to the establishment of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, or the extent thereof, or to the acquisition,

installation, construction and installation of the Facilities, the type or extent of the Facilities, the levy of the special tax proposed to be levied in Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 and the incurring of indebtedness or any other matters set forth in the Resolution of Intention are insufficient in number and in amount under the Act to require abandonment of these proceedings, and the Board of Education hereby further orders and determines that all protests to the establishment of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, or the extent thereof, the acquisition, installation or construction of Facilities, or the type and extent of the Facilities, the necessity to incur bonded indebtedness, or the establishment of the appropriations limit, or the levy of the special tax proposed to be levied within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 or any other matters set forth in the Resolution of Intention are hereby overruled and denied. The proposed formation of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 and the levy of the special tax to be levied in Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 have not been precluded by majority protest pursuant to Section 53324 of the Act.

Section 5. Consistent with Section 53325.6 of the Act, the Board of Education finds and determines that the land within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, if any, devoted primarily to agricultural, timber or livestock uses and being used for the commercial production of agricultural, timber or livestock products will be benefited by the Facilities proposed to be provided.

Section 6. The Board of Education finds and determines that all prior proceedings had and taken by the Board of Education with respect to the formation of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 are valid and in conformity with the requirements of law, including the Act, and the Board of Education determines to proceed to establish Community Facilities District No. 2005-2. This finding is made in accordance with Section 53325.1(b) of the Act. Accordingly, the Board of Education finds, determines and orders that, consistent with the Resolution of Intention, Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 is hereby formed under and pursuant to the terms and provisions of the Act, the boundaries of which are as set forth on the Map.

Section 7. A general description of the Facilities which the Board of Education is authorized by law to acquire or construct is set forth in Exhibit B to the Resolution of Intention, and the Board of Education hereby finds and determines that such Facilities shall constitute the authorized Facilities for Community Facilities District No. 2005-2.

Section 8. Except where funds are otherwise available, a special tax sufficient to pay for all the Facilities, including paying directly or indirectly for the acquisition, installation and construction of Facilities, and the payment of interest on and principal of bonds proposed to be issued to finance the Facilities, to create or replenish any necessary reserve funds and to repay funds advanced to or on behalf of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, to pay annual administration expenses of the School District and Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 in determining, authorizing, apportioning, levying, collecting and administering such special taxes secured by recordation of a continuing lien against all non-exempt real property in Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, will be levied annually on properties within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2. For particulars as to the Rate and Method and the manner of collection of the special tax for Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, reference is made to Rate and Method which sets forth the rate and method of apportionment and the manner of collection of such special tax in sufficient detail to allow each landowner or resident within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 to estimate the maximum amount that such person will have to pay for the Facilities or for principal or interest on bonds issued with respect thereto. The special tax will be collected in the same manner and at the same time as ad valorem property taxes and subject to the same penalties and provisions on delinquency, however the special tax may be billed and collected at a different time or in a different manner if necessary for Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 to meet its financial obligations and if so billed and collected, a delinquent penalty of 10% of the special tax will attach at 5:00 p.m. on the date the special tax becomes delinquent and interest at 1.5% per month of the special tax will attach on the July 1 after the delinquency date and the first of each month thereafter until redeemed.

The maximum special tax applicable to a parcel to be used for private residential purposes, as set forth in Exhibit A of the CFD Report, is specified as a dollar amount which shall be calculated and established not later than the date on which the parcel is first subject to tax because of its use for private residential purposes, and such amount shall not be increased over time by an amount in excess of 2 percent per year. The tax year after which no further special tax shall be levied to pay for public facilities against any parcel used for private residential purpose is three Fiscal Years past the life of the Bonds, provided that annual special taxes shall not be levied after Fiscal Year 2050-2051. Under no circumstances will the special tax to be levied against any parcel subject to the foregoing sentence be increased as a consequence of delinquency or default by the owner of any other parcel or parcels within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 by more than 10 percent. As specified by the Act, for purposes of this paragraph, a parcel shall be considered "used for private residential purposes" not later than the date on which an occupancy permit for private residential use is issued.

Section 9. The Board of Education hereby declares that the question of levying a special tax within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 and of incurring bonded indebtedness in an amount not to exceed \$9,000,000 shall be submitted to the qualified electors within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, in accordance with and subject to the Act and the waivers of the landowners, all the terms of which shall be applicable to such election.

Pursuant to Section 53351(c) of the Act, the Board of Education hereby determines that Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 will pay for the bonded indebtedness to finance Facilities. The whole of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, as indicated on the Map approved by the Board of Education on this date, will be benefited by such bonded indebtedness and will be subject to a special tax to pay for such bonded indebtedness, as set forth herein. The amount of the proposed bonded indebtedness authorized to be incurred to finance all or a portion of the Facilities (including incidental expenses as authorized by the Act) shall not exceed \$9,000,000. The maximum term of the bonds shall not exceed thirty-three (33) Fiscal Years after the date of the issuance of said bonds.

The bonds shall bear interest at a rate or rates established at such times as the bonds are sold in one or more series at fixed or variable interest rates. The maximum annual rate or rates of interest to be paid on the bonds shall not exceed the maximum annual rate permitted by law at the time of the sale of the bonds. The actual rate or rates and times of payment to be determined at the time or times of sale thereof, payable either (i) semiannually, commencing the first March 1 or September 1 following their date, or (ii) to the extent permitted by law, as set forth in the fiscal agent agreement or indenture pursuant to which such bonds are issue.

Section 10. It is hereby further determined that there is no *ad valorem* property tax currently being levied on property within proposed Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 for the exclusive purpose of paying the principal of or interest on bonds or other indebtedness incurred to finance the construction of capital facilities which provide the same services to the territory of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 as are proposed to be provided by the Facilities to be financed by Community Facilities District No. 2005-2.

Section 11. The office which will be responsible for preparing annually a current roll of special tax levy obligations by assessor's parcel number and which will be responsible for estimating future special tax levies pursuant to Section 53340.1 of the Act is the Office of the Executive Director,

Facilities and Planning, 726 West Collins Avenue, Orange, CA 92867-5514. The Executive Director, Facilities and Planning, is further directed to establish procedures to promptly respond to inquires concerning current and future tax liability. The District Superintendent shall prepare, or cause to be prepared, a form of notice of special tax lien for Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 as set forth in Section 53340.2 of the Act and to prepare information required to be filed with the California Debt and Investment Advisory Commission by October 30 of each year as required by Section 53359.5 of the Act and to notify the Commission within 10 days of the failure to pay principal and interest due on any scheduled payment date of any bonds if funds are withdrawn from a reserve fund to pay principal and interest on such bonds.

Section 12. Upon recordation of a notice of special tax lien for Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 pursuant to Section 3114.5 of the California Streets and Highways Code, a continuing lien to secure the levy of the special tax within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 shall attach to all non-exempt real property in Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, and this lien shall continue in force and effect until the special tax obligation is paid and permanently satisfied and the lien canceled in accordance with law or until collection of the tax by the Board of Education ceases in accordance with the Rate and Method.

Section 13. As the District Superintendent has determined, or caused to be determined, that there are fewer than 12 registered voters within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, the levy of the special tax, the incurring of bonded indebtedness and the establishment of the appropriations limitation shall be submitted to the owners of land within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 as the qualified electors of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, with each acre or portion thereof within an ownership representing one (1) vote. The requirements of Section 53326 of the Act pertaining to the shortening of time and the requirement for notice having been waived by each landowner within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, upon the concurrence with such waiver by the Election Official as designated by the Board of Education in the Resolution of Intention, a special election shall be and is hereby called and ordered to be held on February 9, 2006, at 7:30 p.m. or as soon thereafter as the election can be scheduled, at which election there shall be submitted to the qualified electors within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, the ballot proposition authorizing the levy of a special tax shall be consolidated with the ballot proposition authorizing the issuance of bonded indebtedness which shall read as set forth in Exhibit A hereto, with appropriate changes to implement this Resolution. The ballots for the special election in Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 shall be distributed by personal delivery to each of the landowners. Pursuant to Section 53326(b) of the Act, with respect to the election by landowners, the Board of Education has determined that the Facilities to be financed by Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 are necessary to meet increased demands placed upon local agencies as a result of development within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2. Each landowner shall have one vote for each acre or portion thereof that he, she or it owns within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, as provided in Section 53326 and Section 53351 of the Act.

Section 14. If the propositions for the levying of such special tax, incurring bonded indebtedness and establishing the appropriations limit receive the approval of more than two-thirds (2/3) of the votes cast on the propositions, the Board of Education, as the legislative body for the Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, may levy the special tax within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 and incur said indebtedness.

Section 15. The District Superintendent, or such District officer or employee as the Superintendent shall designate, to serve as the election official (the "Election Official") was designated in the Resolution of Intention as the election official for the purposes of conducting the election in

Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 and is hereby requested to take all steps necessary to hold the election in accordance with the Act and these specifications.

Section 16. The Election Official is authorized to canvass the returns of the election pursuant to applicable State law, and the Board of Education is thereafter authorized to certify the results of the election.

- (a) Said special election shall be held and conducted, and the votes canvassed and the returns made, and the results thereof ascertained and determined, as herein provided; provided, however, that such specification may be waived by the landowners if such waiver is concurred with by the Election Official.
- (b) The requirements of Section 53326 of the Act have been waived by each landowner in Community Facilities District No. 2005-2; the ballots for the special election shall be distributed by personal delivery to each of the landowners. Each landowner shall have one vote for each acre or portion thereof that he, she or it owns within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, which number of votes to be voted shall be specified on the ballot provided to such landowner, as provided in Section 53326 of the Act.
- (c) On the ballots to be used at said special election, in addition to all other matters required by law to be printed thereon, shall appear the appropriate propositions described in Section 13 hereof for Community Facilities District No. 2005-2. Each voter to vote for said propositions and for levying said special tax, incurring said bonded indebtedness and establishing such appropriations limit shall mark the ballot card in the spaces opposite the word "YES" or to vote against said propositions and against levying said special tax, establishing such appropriations limit and incurring said bonded indebtedness shall mark the ballot card in the spaces opposite the word "NO."
- (d) The ballots to be used at the special election must be received by the Election Official, at the School District's offices located at 1401 North Handy Street, Orange, California 92867 by 9:30 p.m. the date of the election at which time the election shall be closed, and the election shall be closed on any earlier date or time if all the qualified voters have voted.
- (e) The Election Official shall commence the canvass of the returns of each special election upon closing of the election and at the conclusion thereof shall determine the results of the special election and shall certify said results to the Board of Education.
- (f) The Board of Education shall declare the results of said special election as soon as practicable and not later than the next regular meeting following the date of the election and shall cause to be spread upon its minutes a statement of the results of said special election as ascertained by said canvass.

Section 17. The Election Official has previously distributed, or caused to be distributed, to the owners of land within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 copies of this Resolution, together with a description and the Map of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 in sufficient scale and clarity to show the boundaries thereof and the Assessor's parcel numbers for the land therein.

Section 18. If two-thirds (2/3) of the votes cast within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 upon the question of levying such special tax and incurring bonded indebtedness are cast in favor of levying that tax, as determined by the Board of Education after the canvass of the returns of such

election, the Board of Education may levy such special taxes and incur such indebtedness within the territory of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 under the Act in the amounts and for the purposes as specified in this Resolution. Such special tax may be levied only at the respective rate and may be apportioned only in the manner specified in this Resolution, subject to the Act, except that such special tax may be levied at a rate lower than that specified herein.

Section 19. Section 53314.9 of the Act provides that, at any time either before or after the formation of a community facilities district, the legislative body of the local agency conducting the proceedings to form such community facilities district may accept advances of funds from any source, including, but not limited to, private persons or private entities and may provide, by resolution, for the use of those funds for any authorized purpose, including, but not limited to, paying any cost incurred by such local agency in creating such community facilities district. Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 may repay the funds received pursuant to the Deposit and Reimbursement Agreement previously approved by the Board, if the voters of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 approve the proposed special tax at the election to be conducted pursuant to the Act.

Section 20. Proceeds of the special tax shall be applied only to the specific purposes authorized with respect to Community Facilities District No. 2005-2. The proceeds shall be deposited in an account in accordance with the indenture of trust or fiscal agent agreement relating to bonds issued with respect to CFD No 2005-2. The Superintendent or his designee, shall prepare, or cause to be prepared, an annual report to be filed with the Board of Education on or before June 30 of each year indicating the amount of funds collected and expended and the status of any project required or authorized to be funded.

Section 21. The officers of the School District and their authorized representatives, are, and each of them acting alone is, hereby authorized to execute any and all documents and agreements and do and perform any and all acts and things, from time to time, consistent with this Resolution and necessary or appropriate to carry the same into effect and to carry out its purpose.

Section 22. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

PROPOSITION A:

Shall Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 (Del Rio School Facilities) of the Orange Unified School District be authorized to incur a bonded indebtedness in the maximum principal amount of \$9,000,000, with interest at a rate or rates not to exceed the maximum interest rate permitted by law, to finance the Facilities and the incidental expenses described in Resolution No. 30-05-06 of the Board of Education of the Orange Unified School District?

PROPOSITION B:

Shall Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 (Del Rio School Facilities) of the Orange Unified School District be authorized to levy a special tax with a rate and method of apportionment as provided in Resolution No. 30-05-06 of the Board of Education of the Orange Unified School District to pay for the Facilities, incidental expenses and other purposes designated in Resolution No. 30-05-06, including paying directly or indirectly for the acquisition, installation and construction of Facilities, and the payment of the principal of and interest on bonds or refunding bonds issued by Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 (Del Rio School Facilities) of the Orange Unified School District to finance the Facilities, financing costs and incidental expenses, including all or a portion of the design, acquisition, installation, construction and equipping of certain real and other tangible property with an estimated useful life of five years or longer authorized by the Act, including school sites and facilities and appurtenances thereto, all as more particularly described in Exhibit B to Resolution No. 30-05-06 adopted by the Board of Education of the Orange Unified School District on January 5, 2006?

PROPOSITION C:

WHEREAS, on January 5, 2006, the Board of Education ("Board") of the Orange Unified School District (the "School District") adopted Resolution No. 30-05-06 stating its intention to form Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 (Del Rio School Facilities) of the Orange Unified School District" (the "Community Facilities District No. 2005-2") pursuant to the Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982, as amended, (the "Act"); and

WHEREAS, on January 5, 2006, the Board also adopted Resolution No. 31-05-06 stating its intention to incur bonded indebtedness in an amount not to exceed \$9,000,000 within proposed Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 for the purpose of financing certain public facilities; and

WHEREAS, on February 9, 2006, the Board concluded a noticed hearing, as required by the Act, relative to the determination to proceed with the formation of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, the adoption of a rate and method of apportionment of the special taxes to be levied within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, to pay the principal and interest on the proposed indebtedness and to pay other obligations of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, all as set forth in the proceedings relating to Community Facilities District No. 2005-2; and

WHEREAS, at said hearing all persons desiring to be heard on all matters pertaining to the formation of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 and the levy of special tax were heard and a full and fair hearing was held and completed; and

WHEREAS, the Board, subsequent to such hearing, adopted a Resolution establishing Community Facilities District No. 2005-2; and

WHEREAS, on February 9, 2006, the Board concluded a noticed hearing as required by the Act relative to the necessity for authorizing bonded indebtedness in the Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, the purpose for which the bonds are to be issued, the amount of the proposed debt, the maximum term of the bonds and the maximum annual rate of interest to be paid thereon.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Orange Unified School District, acting as the Legislative Body of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 (Del Rio School Facilities) of the Orange Unified School District, as follows:

Section 1. It is necessary to incur bonded indebtedness of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 in a maximum aggregate principal amount of \$9,000,000.

Section 2. The bonded indebtedness is incurred for the purpose of financing school facilities described in Exhibit "B" to Resolution No. 30-05-06 (the "Facilities"), and the costs of selling bonds to finance costs of the Facilities among other things. The Board hereby further determines that the school facilities which are part of the Facilities to be financed through Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 are

necessary to meet increased demands on the School District as a result of development occurring, or to occur, within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2.

Section 3. All property within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 not otherwise exempt from the levy of the special taxes pursuant to the Rate and Method of Apportionment of Special Taxes provided by Resolution No. 30-05-06 shall pay for the bonded indebtedness.

Section 4. The maximum term of bonds issued by Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 shall not exceed thirty-three (33) Fiscal Years after the date of issuance of said bonds.

Section 5. The bonds shall bear interest at a rate or rates established at such times as the bonds are sold in one or more series at fixed or variable interest rates. The maximum annual rate or rates of interest to be paid on the bonds shall not exceed the maximum annual rate permitted by law at the time of the sale of the bonds. The actual rate or rates and times of payment to be determined at the time or times of sale thereof, payable either (i) semiannually, commencing the first March 1 or September 1 following their date, or (ii) to the extent permitted by law, as set forth in the fiscal agent agreement or indenture pursuant to which such bonds are issue.

Section 6. A consolidated Community Facilities District Election ("Election") is hereby called and ordered for February 9, 2006, to include a proposition on authorization to incur bonded indebtedness in an amount not to exceed \$9,000,000 to finance the Facilities. Pursuant to documents furnished to the Board, the Board hereby determines that there are less than twelve (12) registered voters within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 and therefore orders that the Election shall be a landowner voter election with each landowner having one (1) vote per acre of land, or portion thereof, which they own and which is within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 as provided in Section 53326 of the Act. Pursuant to Section 53326(b) of the Act, the Election shall be consolidated with an election on a proposition to levy the special taxes within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 and to establish an appropriations limit for Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, as described within the Resolution of Formation adopted on February 9, 2006. A form of the ballot for the consolidated Election is attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and made a part hereof by this reference.

Section 7. A tax rate statement shall be furnished to the qualified electors pursuant to Elections Codes Sections 9400-9404, unless waived by the electors.

Section 8. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 53327(b) of the Act, the Board hereby directs that the School District's Superintendent, or his written designee, shall be the Election Official ("Election Official") for this Election. The Election Official shall take all actions necessary to conduct the Elections described herein. The Election Official is authorized to conduct the elections following the adoption of the Resolution of Formation and this resolution, and all ballots shall be received by, and the Election Official shall close the election by, 9:30 p.m. on the election day; provided the elections shall be closed at such earlier time as all qualified electors have voted as provided in Section 53326(d) of the Act. Pursuant to Section 53326 of the Act, the ballots for the special elections shall be distributed in person or by mail with return postage prepaid to the landowner of record within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 as of the close of the February 9, 2006, hearing regarding the formation of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2.

FIRST READING OF RESOLUTION AND ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, ACTING *EX OFFICIO* AS THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 2005-2 (DEL RIO SCHOOL FACILITIES) OF THE ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, AUTHORIZING THE LEVY OF A SPECIAL TAX WITHIN COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTRICT NO. 2005-2 (DEL RIO SCHOOL FACILITIES) OF THE ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT

WHEREAS, the Board of Education (the "Board of Education") of the Orange Unified School District, California ("the School District") on January 5, 2006, duly adopted Resolution No. 30-05-06 and Resolution No. 31-05-06 declaring its intention to establish Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 (Del Rio School Facilities) of the Orange Unified School District (the "Community Facilities District No. 2005-2"), to levy special taxes to pay for certain public facilities in and for Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 and to issue bonds secured by a special tax to finance certain facilities of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 under and pursuant to the terms and provisions of the "Mello-Roos Community Facilities Act of 1982" (the "Act"), being Chapter 2.5, Part 1, Division 2, Title 5 of the Government Code of the State of California, and calling a public hearing on the question of the establishment of such Community Facilities District No. 2005-2; and

WHEREAS, notices were published and mailed as required by law relative to the intention of the Board of Education to form Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, including the territory referenced in Resolution No. 30-05-06, to levy a special tax and to incur bonded indebtedness; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing has been duly convened and held on February 9, 2006 in connection with the formation of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 and the authorization of the issuance of bonds, at which hearing the Board of Education considered the establishment of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, the type and extent of the proposed Facilities (as defined in Resolution No. 30-05-06), the proposed rate and method of apportionment of special tax (the "Rate and Method"), the proposed appropriations limit therefor, the necessity for incurring bonded indebtedness to finance Facilities and all other matters as set forth in Resolution No. 30-05-06 and Resolution No. 31-05-06, and at the above-mentioned public hearing, all persons interested, including all taxpayers, property owners and registered voters within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, were given an opportunity to appear and be heard, and the testimony of all interested persons for or against the establishment of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, the levy of the special tax, the extent of Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, the establishment of an appropriations limit for Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, the necessity for incurring bonded indebtedness to finance the Facilities, and any other matters set forth in said Resolution Nos. 30-05-06 and 31-05-06, were heard and considered and the Board of Education at the conclusion of said hearing was fully advised in the premises, and was authorized to proceed; and

WHEREAS, following such public hearing, the Board of Education duly adopted a Resolution establishing Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 and approving the Rate and Method as set forth therein and a Resolution authorizing the issuance of bonded indebtedness to be incurred to finance the Facilities (including incidental expenses as authorized by the Act) in the maximum amount of \$9,000,000 and called an election within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 on the propositions of levying a special tax, authorizing the issuance of bonds and establishing an appropriations limit; and

WHEREAS, on February 9, 2006, an election was held in Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 in which the qualified electors approved by more than a two-thirds vote of the votes cast the propositions of levying a special tax, incurring bonded indebtedness and establishing an appropriations limit; and

WHEREAS, on February 9, 2006, the Board of Education adopted a Resolution which certified the results of the February 9, 2006 election within Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 conducted by an Election Official on behalf of the Board of Education of the School District, which results showed that more than two-thirds of the votes cast were in favor of the propositions to levy the special tax, issue bonds and establish an appropriations limit;

WHEREAS, such bonded indebtedness and interest thereon will be payable from a special tax levied and collected in accordance with and subject to the maximum rates applicable thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Education is fully advised in the premises;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT, ACTING IN ITS CAPACITY AS THE LEGISLATIVE BODY OF COMMUNITY FACILITIES DISTICT NO. 2005-2, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. All of the above recitals are true and correct.

Section 2. By the passage of this resolution and ordinance, the Board of Education authorizes the levy of a special tax pursuant to the Rate and Method which is hereby incorporated by reference herein.

Section 3. The Board of Education is hereby further authorized each year by ordinance or by resolution, if then permitted by applicable law, to determine the specific special tax rate and amount to be levied on each parcel of land for the next fiscal year, except that the special tax rate to be levied shall not exceed that set forth in the Rate and Method.

Section 4. Properties or entities of the state, federal or other local governments shall be exempt from the above-referenced and approved special tax only to the extent set forth in the Rate and Method, and otherwise shall be subject to tax consistent with the provisions of Sections 53317.3, 53317.5, and 53340.1 of the Act in effect as of the date of adoption of this Ordinance and Resolution.

Section 5. All of the collections of the special tax shall be used as provided for in the Act and the proceedings conducted for Community Facilities District No. 2005-2. The special tax shall be levied only so long as needed for its purpose as described in said proceedings.

Section 6. The above authorized special tax shall be collected in the same manner as ordinary *ad valorem* property taxes are collected and shall be subject to the same penalties and the same procedure, sale and lien priority in case of delinquency as is provided for *ad valorem* taxes, as such procedures may be modified by law or by the Board of Education from time to time and may be collected by direct billing by Community Facilities District No. 2005-2, however the special tax may be billed and collected at a different time or in a different manner if necessary for Community Facilities District No. 2005-2 to meet its financial obligations and if so billed and collected, a delinquent penalty of 10% of the special tax will attach at 5:00 p.m. on the date the special tax becomes delinquent and interest at 1.5% per

month of the special tax will attach on the July 1 after the delinquency date and the first of each month thereafter until redeemed.

Section 7. As a cumulative remedy, if any amount levied pursuant hereto as a special tax for payment of bond interest or principal, together with any penalties and other charges accruing under this Resolution and Ordinance are not paid when due, the Board of Education may bring by an action brought in the superior court to foreclose any lien therefor.

Section 8. The President of the Board of Education shall sign and the Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this Resolution and Ordinance and shall cause the same to be published and posted pursuant to the provisions of law in that regard.

Section 9. This resolution and ordinance shall be in full force and effect thirty (30) days after its final passage in accordance with the provisions of the California Government Code and the specific authorization for adoption is pursuant to the provisions of Section 53340 of the Act.

TOPIC:

ALTERNATE RETIREMENT SYSTEM FOR QUALIFIED PART-TIME, SEASONAL AND TEMPORARY EMPLOYEES

DESCRIPTION:

The District is required, on behalf of each part time employee, to contribute to Social Security or to a government-approved alternate retirement system. The Public Agency Retirement System (PARS) has made such a system available to the District and its eligible employees known as the Alternate Retirement System. (ARS). The PARS ARS program qualifies under all applicable government code sections and meets the meaning of the term "retirement system" as given by the Federal Social Security Act.

If approved by the Board, the ARS would take the place of social security for all employees who are not members of either the California Public Retirement System or the State Teachers Retirement System. Those classified bargaining unit members who are currently enrolled in social security would have the option to choose ARS or remain in social security. All others (part-time, seasonal and temporary employees) would be automatically enrolled in the ARS.

A Memorandum of Understanding has been signed by the California School Employees Association which specifies the details of plan for its eligible part-time unit members.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Savings to the District will vary from year to year depending on the number of eligible employees enrolled in the ARS. The potential maximum yearly General Fund savings is \$114,000 with one hundred percent participation of eligible employees. It is expected that participation will begin at a minimum level and grow each year. Savings resulting from enrollment of eligible classified unit members will be allocated through negotiations with the classified bargaining unit.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the attached Board Resolution authorizing participation in the PARS Alternate Retirement System.

RESOLUTION TO APPROVE AN ALTERNATE RETIREMENT SYSTEM FOR QUALIFIED PART-TIME, SEASONAL AND TEMPORARY EMPLOYEES

WHEREAS, it is determined to be in the District's best interest and its employees to provide a Qualifying Retirement System for all its employees not currently eligible for such a Qualifying Retirement System, thereby meeting the requirements of Section 11332 of the Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act (OBRA 90) and Section 3121(b)(7)(F) of the Internal Revenue Code (ITC);

WHEREAS, the Public Agency Retirement System (PARS) has made such a system available to the District and its eligible employees and qualifies under California Government Code Sections 53215-53224 and 20000, Education Code Section 22000, OBRA 90 Section 11332, IRC Sections 3121(b)(7)(F) and 457(b) and meets the meaning of the term "retirement system" as given by Section 218(b)(4) of the Federal Social Security Act.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- The Board of Education hereby adopts the PARS 457 Trust, including the PARS Section 457 FICA Alternate Retirement System, effective February 1, 2006, the effective date for the benefit of employees on that date and hired thereafter; and
- 2. The Board of Education hereby appoints the PARS as Trust Administrator to the PARS Trust, to provide administrative and consulting services with respect to the PARS ARS; and
- 3. The Board of Education hereby appoints the Assistant Superintendent, Business Services or his/her successor or his/her designee as the District's Plan Administrator for the PARS Section 457 FICA Alternate Retirement System; and
- 4. The District's Plan Administrator is hereby authorized to implement the plan(s), execute the PARS legal documents on behalf of the District and to take whatever additional actions are necessary to maintain the District's participation in PARS and to maintain PARS compliance of any relevant regulation issued or as may be issued; therefore, authorizing him/her to take whatever additional actions are required to administer the District's PARS plan(s).

TOPIC: PROPOSED BOARD POLICY 6146.45 – WAIVER OF THE

CALIFORNIA HIGH SCHOOL EXIT EXAMINATION FOR

STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES - FIRST READING

DESCRIPTION: Board Policies and Administrative Regulations are routinely

reviewed and updated when changes in law occur or when a specific need arises. The Superintendent is charged with the continuous and orderly review of existing policies and regulations as well as the development of new policies when

appropriate.

Board Bylaw 9311 states:

"Prior to adoption, policies shall be given two readings by the Board unless the second reading is waived by Board action. As its second reading the policy may be adopted by a majority vote of all members of the Board. The Board may waive the second reading and take action or may require additional readings."

The following proposed Board Policy is presented for a first reading:

 BP 6146.45 Waiver of the California High School Exit Examination for Students with Disabilities

FISCAL IMPACT: This item has no fiscal impact.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education receive the

attached new Board Policy – Waiver of the California High School Exit Examination for Students with Disabilities - for a

first reading.

Instruction

Waiver of the California High School Exit Examination for Students with Disabilities

At the parent or guardian's request, the school principal shall submit a request for a waiver of the requirement to successfully pass the high school exit examination to the Board of Education for a pupil with a disability who has taken the high school exit examination with modifications that alter what the test measures and has received the equivalent of a passing score on one or both subject matter parts of the high school exit examination.

The Board may waive the requirement to successfully pass one or both subject matter parts of the high school exit examination for a pupil with a disability if the principal certifies to the Board that the pupil has all of the following:

- 1. An Individualized Education Program (IEP) adopted pursuant to the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. 1400 et seq.) or a plan adopted pursuant to Section 504 of the federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. Sec. 794(a)) in place that requires the modifications to be provided to the pupil when taking the high school exit examination.
- 2. Sufficient high school level coursework either satisfactorily completed or in progress in a high school level curriculum sufficient to have attained the skills and knowledge otherwise needed to pass the high school exit examination.
- 3. An individual score report for the pupil showing that the pupil has received the equivalent of a passing score on the high school exit examination while using a modification that fundamentally alters what the high school exit examination measures as determined by the State Board of Education.

TOPIC:

TEACHER ASSIGNMENT/CONSENT - VARIABLE OR SHORT TERM WAIVER

DESCRIPTION:

The California Education Code authorizes, under the provision of Section 44830(a), Variable Term Waivers that have to do with educator preparation and credentialing, and with the ability of employers to employ or assign persons who are not appropriately credentialed for their assignment. Requests for Variable Term Waivers may be submitted by employing agencies to solve a temporary certification or assignment problem, when the employing agency finds there are an insufficient number of certificated persons who meet the specified employment criteria for a position.

The California Education Code authorizes, under the provision of Section 80122 employing agencies to grant a short-term waiver provided it is issued one time only for any one credentialed teacher and one time only for a given classroom. They are valid for no more than one semester.

The teacher(s) whose name(s) is/are listed on the attached has/have met the requirements, has/have consented to the assignment, and has/have been judged by the site administrator to be competent in the subject matter. Likewise. all other means of credentialing and reassignment have been explored. The passage of this waiver will allow us to remain compliant with SB 435, which requires that all teachers be appropriately assigned.

The student cost and teacher substitute cost will be covered by School and Library Improvement funds.

APPROVAL OF E-RATE TELECOMMUNICATIONS CONTINGENT CONTRACTS - FUNDING YEAR 9: JULY 1, 2006 – JUNE 30, 2007

DESCRIPTION:

In accordance with the federally funded E-rate program, an application has been submitted for telephone services, network equipment and wiring (CAT 6, Fiber, and Conduit). A competitive Request for Proposal process was conducted calling for qualified contractors. Contracts associated with E-rate will be conditional upon Year 9 E-rate funding, and the District's willingness and continued ability to fund the discounted E-rate project costs.

Telephone Services

SBC will continue to provide telecommunications services based on the existing district contract for local and long distance services. It is anticipated that OUSD will benefit from a reduction of up to \$320,000 in telephone billing costs for the 2006-07 fiscal year.

Cellular Services

Verizonwireless will provide cellular services on a month-tomonth basis. It is anticipated that OUSD will benefit from a reduction of up to \$24,000 in cellular billing costs for the 2006-07 fiscal year.

Network Equipment and Cabling

For E-rate Funding Year 9, it is anticipated that thirteen schools will participate in the program and will qualify for discounts of 78% to 80%. The schools are California, Cambridge, Esplanade. Fairhaven, Fletcher, Jordan, La Veta, Lampson, Orange HS, Palmyra, Riverdale, Taft, and Yorba MS. E-rate discounts are applied to the full price of eligible services, and the district is responsible for paving the remaining costs after E-rate discounts are applied by the School & Libraries Division (SLD). The eligible services will upgrade network hardware (switches and routers) and cable classrooms. The District issued a Request for Proposals for contractors to bid on network equipment and cabling services for District school sites. The District received six (6) responsive proposals. The proposals were evaluated by a District staff evaluation team. Award is recommended to the lowest responsive offerors, SBC in an amount not to exceed \$363,038.33 for equipment and Stone Electric, Inc. in an amount not to exceed \$212,238.86 for cabling. The total project cost is \$575,277.19 with a possible E-Rate Discount of \$451,999.28. The total District match for all 13 sites will not exceed \$124,000.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Not to exceed \$124,000 from EdTech, Maintenance, Facilities/Planning, Site Categorical, Lottery and grant funds.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the E-rate contracts contingent on the District's continued ability to meet the discounted match.

COUNTY

DESCRIPTION: On June 20, 1997, the Orange County Board of Education

approved the "County-Wide Expulsion Plan" providing educational services for all expelled students in Orange County. This plan was developed in conjunction with the 28

school districts in Orange County.

Each district's governing board adopted an expulsion plan for their respective districts to fulfill the requirements of Education

Code 48926.

Education Code 48916.1 requires an update to the plan be sent to the Superintendent of Public Instruction every three years. The most recent was submitted February 20, 2003.

The Office of Child Welfare and Attendance processes the District's expulsions and is recommending that the District continue to participate in the "County-Wide Expulsion Plan" and be included in the pending triennial update to be submitted to the Orange County Department of Education by Friday, March 17, 2006, and to the California Department of Education by

Friday, June 30, 2006.

FISCAL IMPACT: This item has no fiscal impact.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the

Orange Unified School District's participation in the county-

wide expulsion plan for Orange County.

PLAN FOR PROVIDING EDUCATIONAL SERVICES TO ALL EXPELLED STUDENTS IN ORANGE COUNTY

Executive Brief

FINAL DRAFT

On June 20, 1997, the Orange County Board of Education approved the Countywide Expulsion Plan providing educational services for all expelled students in Orange County. This plan was developed in conjunction with the twenty-eight school districts in Orange County. Each district's governing board adopted the expulsion plan for their respective districts. The plan was developed to fulfill the requirements of Education Code Section 48926. Education Code 48916.1, also requires an update to the plan, be sent to the Superintendent of Public Instruction, including the outcome data pursuant to Section 48916.1 every three years thereafter. Beginning September 2005, our review process included a series of District focus groups to review current plans and address gaps in services. The 2006 triennial review will be submitted to the California Department of Education June 30, 2006.

The Countywide Expulsion Plan for expelled students encompasses the following:

- Enumerates existing educational alternatives for expelled pupils.
- General provisions outlining previously identified gaps that have been addressed and eliminated.
- Identified progress made of the previously existing gap to provide services for elementary students
- Addresses areas for improvement of newly identified gaps

The plan also identifies alternative placements for pupils who are expelled and placed in district community day school programs, but who fail to meet the terms and conditions of their rehabilitation plan or who pose a danger to other district pupils, as determined by the governing board.

In addition, Education Code 48916.1 requires that "at the time an expulsion of a pupil is ordered, the governing board of the school district shall ensure that an educational program is provided to the pupil who is subject to the expulsion order for the period of the expulsion." School districts within Orange County and the Orange County Department of Education provide numerous opportunities for students who are in need of traditional and/or alternative education options. Collaboration between the 28 school districts and the Orange County Department of Education has significantly remediated the gaps identified in the 2000-2003 Expulsion Plan. Thus, a continuum of alternatives is provided within the local school districts and the Orange County Department of Education. This amended 2006 Educational Service Plan furnishes the framework for providing educational programs and services to all expelled students in Orange County.

General Provisions

A student whose behavior has resulted in an expulsion is provided a rehabilitation plan which ensures placement in an educational program. All educational alternatives provided by Orange County school districts are not available to all expelled students. Type of offense, location of offense, grade level of the student and nature of the students individualized needs all have the potential to restrict the educational alternative available to the student during the period of expulsion. Students expelled for any of the offenses listed in subdivision (a) or (c) of Section 48915 of the California Education Code shall not be permitted to enroll in any district-operated program during the period of expulsion unless it is a community day school (E.C. 48915.2).

All expelled students shall be referred to an educational placement that is 1) not situated at a comprehensive middle, junior, or senior high school, or at any elementary school, and 2) not housed at the school site attended by the student at the time of the offense (E.C. 48915). In addition to the requirements stated above, such factors as district size, district level alternatives, county level alternatives, and district philosophy can influence the decisions by a district board of education regarding what educational alternatives are appropriate for the students who are expelled.

School District Educational Alternatives for Expelled Students

The governing board of each school district will determine which educational alternatives are appropriate and available. Educational alternatives throughout Orange County for students recommended for expulsion include, but are not limited to the following options:

- 1. Expulsion, suspended order, with placement on the same school campus (E.C. 48917 (a).
- 2. Expulsion, suspended order, with placement on a different school campus within the district (E.C. 48917 (a).
- 3. Expulsion with referral to a district community day school program, if available (E.C. 48660).
- 4. Expulsion with subsequent transfer to another district.
- 5. Expulsion with referral to the Orange County Department of Education, Alternative, Community and Correctional Education Schools and Services (ACCESS) (E.C. 1981 I.

Actual referral to a district community day school or county community school is made by the school district governing board with recommendations from the district discipline review board, School Attendance Review Board (SARB), or by another established district referral process as required by statute.

Special Circumstances for Expelled Students Addressing Gaps

Previously identified gaps have been addressed and considerable improvement has been made through a collaboration process between the twenty eight Orange County School Districts and the Orange County Department of Education. The twenty eight School Districts in Orange County and the Orange County Department of Education have committed themselves to an on-going process to resolve the remaining identified gaps. (See table: Indicators of a Strong Countywide Networking)

Special Education Students

Students with identified exceptional needs shall be referred to the county program pursuant to the Individualized Education Program (IEP) or 504 process as outlined in Ed. Code 48915.5. School districts must take into consideration the contents of the student's IEP when making placement recommendations. Any change in placement requires the school district to convene an IEP meeting. The IEP team identifies a special education program and related services appropriate for the student. Placement options may include district, SELPA, or county operated program.

- If the district refers the expelled student to the Orange County Department of Education, the district shall convene an IEP meeting prior to the referral, to jointly identify an appropriate special education program and related services. A representative from the Orange County Department of Education shall participate in the IEP meeting. The district or Orange County Superintendent, as identified in the SELPA Plan, will provide special education services to these students.
- When the Individualized Education Program cannot be implemented within the Orange County Department of Education, the district of residence is responsible for providing Free and Appropriate Public Education (FAPE) within the continuum of program options identified in their SELPA plan.

Expelled Students Who Commit Subsequent Violation(s)

The placement of expelled students who commit subsequent expellable violations will be placed in one of the following options:

- If the student commits a subsequent violation of Education Code 48900, the student may be referred to another district alternative program or to the Orange County Department of Education.
- If the expelled student commits another violation of the Education Code while enrolled in OCDE, the student will be placed at another community school site within the Principal Administrative Region (PAR) or transferred to another region operated by the Orange County Department of Education, in accordance with Board Policy.

Expelled Students Who Fail District Community Day School

An expelled student who fails his/her placement in a district community day school program may be placed in one of the following options:

- Other existing district educational alternatives.
- Orange County Department of Education, Alternative, Community and Correctional Education Schools and Services or the Division of Special Education Services.

County Office Options

The Orange County Department of Education is committed to providing a spectrum of educational options for students expelled from Orange County school districts. Our mission is to care for, teach, and inspire all ACCESS students to discover their potential, develop their character, and maximize their learning so they may become successful contributors to society. Educational options are provided through the Division of Alternative Education, known as Alternative, Community, and Correctional Education Schools and Services (ACCESS), and the Division of Special Education Services.

The policy of each individual school district affects how the Orange County Department of Education will meet the needs of that particular school district. Some districts use the Orange County Department of Education programs as educational options for those students expelled under Education Code 48900.

The Orange County Department of Education provides an interim alternative educational setting while school districts search for permanent placements for students (not excluding county options). In addition to programs operated by the Division of Special Education Services, The Division of Alternative Education provides options for expelled youth at over 100 sites contained within 7 regions located throughout the county. Regional options may include:

- Classroom instruction serving grades 7-12, delivered daily for 240-270 minutes are aligned with the State Frameworks/Standards.
- Contracted study programs for students who elect, with parent/teacher approval, not to participate in daily classroom instructional programs. These contracted study programs (Independent Study) require students to complete a minimum of 20 hours per week of educational product.
- Middle school regional programs serving grades 5-8, delivered daily for 240-270 minutes are aligned with the State Frameworks/Standards.
- Alternative Academies serving grades 3-5, are an option in regions that have sufficient number of referred students to sustain a regional program.
- Alternative school program for homeless children and youth, grades K-8, located in Orange.
- Parent directed home instruction through Community Home Education Program and Pacific Coast High School.
- After school programming exists at 13 community school sites in ACCESS.

<u>Referral Process to the Orange County Department of Education</u> <u>Alternative Community Correctional Education School and Services</u> (ACCESS)

The school district of residence maintains the responsibility for developing a rehabilitation plan for expelled students, referring students to an appropriate educational setting. Expelled students who complete their rehabilitation plan obligations are reviewed by the district for possible return to district of residence programs. Expelled students who fail to meet the terms and conditions of the district rehabilitation plan may be referred to an appropriate educational setting within another district alternative program, district community day school program, or the Orange County Department of Education.

An Individual Learning Plan (ILP) will be developed for expelled students referred to the Orange County Department of Education, Alternative, Community and Correctional Education Schools and Services (ACCESS). Part of this plan includes a goal of returning the student to the school district of residence at completion of the district expulsion.

Referrals to the county operated alternative, community school programs may be made directly to the ACCESS Regional Offices listed below. Referrals to programs operated by the Division of Special Education Services, (students with low incident disabilities and emotional disturbances) shall be made to the Director of Special Schools, Jim Gerard, at (714) 966-4133.
