SALARY ADJUSTMENT FOR LEADERSHIP EMPLOYEES, AND ATTACHED AB 1200 INFORMATION

DESCRIPTION:

Based upon Board direction, the Superintendent has met and conferred with representatives from the leadership group on the topic of compensation for leadership employees. The leadership group representatives communicated to the Superintendent that in the interest of retaining comparability with similar employees in other Orange County unified school districts, the leadership group requests a leadership salary schedule adjustment which correlates to that of other employee groups in the District.

In consideration of the leadership compensation request, a study of leadership compensation increases was conducted for the ten (10) comparable unified school districts in Orange County for the past three school years. That study indicates that for the current school year, of the six (6) comparable unified school districts that have settled with leadership employees, the leadership salaries for four (4) out of the six (6) have been increased by the same percentage as all other bargaining units, and six (6) out of six (6) provided the same percentage increase for leadership as for at least one of the other bargaining groups. The study also indicates that for the 2005-2006 school year, eight (8) out of ten (10) comparable unified school districts in Orange County provided the same percentage increase for all groups, including leadership, and ten (10) out of ten (10) provided the same percentage increase for leadership as for their teacher's group. For the 2004-2005 school year, again, eight (8) out of ten (10) comparable unified school districts in Orange County provided the same percentage increase for all groups, including leadership, and ten (10) out of ten (10) provided the same percentage increase for leadership as for at least one of the other bargaining groups.

For the 2006-2007 school year, the Board of Education has approved a 6% salary increase, effective July 1, 2006, for the classified and certificated bargaining units. Consistent with past years, the Board of Education has approved leadership salary schedule adjustments that correlate to those of the other employee groups.

FISCAL IMPACT:

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve a 6% salary schedule adjustment for leadership employees, effective July 1, 2006.

INFORMATION/DISCUSSION ITEMS

ANNUAL AUDIT REPORT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2005-2006

DESCRIPTION:

Christy White, a partner in the firm of Nigro, Nigro & White will present information from the 2005-2006 audit report. The independent audit is designed to encourage sound fiscal practices, to promote efficient and effective use of public funds, and to determine the integrity of the financial accounting and reporting systems. The Education Code requires that the independent audit be submitted to the State Controller's Office, federal agencies, and the Orange County Department of Education. The State Controller's Office reviews each independent audit and approves or disapproves the audit report within three to four months of receipt.

The general objectives of an audit are to determine whether: (1) the District's financial statements are presented fairly in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles; (2) there is effective District control over and proper accounting for revenues, expenditures, assets, and liabilities; (3) state and federal reports and claims for advances or reimbursements contain accurate and reliable financial data and are presented in accordance with the terms of applicable agreements; and (4) state and federal funds are being expended in accordance with the terms of applicable agreements and those provisions of law or regulations that could have a material effect on the financial statements or on the awards tested.

The independent audit of the 2005-2006 fiscal records for Orange Unified School District indicates a positive financial status and ongoing maintenance and improvement of appropriate internal controls. The ending balances for all funds have been verified to be those previously stated in the District's SACS Financial Reporting documents on file with the State of California Department of Education and those indicated in the independent accounting system of the Orange County Department of Education, which maintains ledgers on all payroll, warrant, and financial transactions of any sort of each school district located within Orange County.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This item has no fiscal impact.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education receive the 2005-2006 independent audit report.

DECLARATION OF SURPLUS ITEMS AND AUTHORIZATION TO ENTER INTO CONTRACTS AND DISPOSE OF SURPLUS ITEMS

DESCRIPTION:

District sites and programs have accumulated various pieces of equipment, vehicles, materials, and other District items that are obsolete, beyond economical repair, or are no longer required within the current curriculum or for other school purposes. Education Code Section 17545 *et seq* and Board Policy 3270(a) provide for the sale of District items. A list of items to be declared surplus is attached and the items will be dispositioned by public or private sale. All items are subject to reallocation within the District prior to sale.

The District is planning to dispose of surplus items using the most effective public and private sale methods including utilizing the professional services of General Auction Company and other firms as needed. Public sale of District surplus items will be conducted at the General Auction Company located at 7015 Knott Avenue, Buena Park at regularly scheduled auctions through June 30, 2007.

The District received quotes based upon fees and a percentage of gross sales as follows.

35% of gross sales

Based upon the quotations and service, staff recommends contracting with the General Auction Company for compensation of 25% of gross sales proceeds and related vehicle transfer fee expenses for most categories of items.

The District regularly collects large numbers of obsolete and damaged electronic equipment such as computer monitors, CPUs, keyboards, and the like. These particular items take up a lot of District space and are becoming increasingly difficult to dispose of due to marketplace changes and environmental law changes. The District plans to dispose of these types of obsolete electronic components and other miscellaneous items on a regular basis throughout the year, in order to avoid accumulation and potential costs in the near future to dispose of these items. Damaged units are discarded. Saleable units

OUSD/Archibald/Kemp Board Agenda December 14, 2006 will be sold and other units may be donated to local charitable organizations such as Goodwill Industries.

The firm of EZ Recycling, Inc. has submitted an offer to collect the electronic components and provide certificates of destruction or remanufacturing at no cost to the District. It is recommended that the District utilize the services of this firm as may be needed for these components and thereby save up to \$30 per unit in potential disposal charges.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Income less commission expenses of 25% of gross sales.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education declare the items listed as surplus and approve the disposition of the District surplus items in accordance with Education Code Section 17545 and Board Policy 3270. It is also recommended that the Board of Education authorize the District to enter into appropriate contracts with General Auction Company, EZ Recycling, Inc., and other firms and organizations as needed for the sale or disposition of District surplus items.

CLASSIFIED POSITION RECLASSIFICATION: ADMINISTRATIVE SECRETARY

DESCRIPTION:

The Business Services Division does not currently maintain a secretarial position in the purchasing office. There is a need, however, to provide ongoing secretarial support to the Director of Purchasing. The Business Services Division has maintained two classified positions with the title Purchasing Clerk in support of the position of Director, Purchasing. One of the incumbents in the Purchasing Clerk classification is currently providing secretarial assistance to the Purchasing Director. It is recommended that the Purchasing Clerk incumbent who is currently providing secretarial assistance to the Purchasing Director be reclassified to a secretarial classification. In alignment with the District's table of classification, the appropriate secretarial classification to be assigned to work in support of a Director of Purchasing is that of Administrative Secretary. As a result, the recommendation is to reclassify one Purchasing Clerk position to Administrative Secretary and to eliminate one Purchasing Clerk position.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The cost of the salary adjustment to reclassify one position from Purchasing Clerk to Administrative Secretary is \$6,732 including statutory benefits.

This memorandum was provided to the Board under separate cover and available to preview in the Educational Services office.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The estimated billing for 2006-2007 will be based on actual information for 2005-2006 plus COLA as set forth in the most current state budget, plus any budgeting projections for step and column, and salary and benefit increases.

RESOLUTION NO. 17-06-07: SIGNATURE AUTHORIZATION UPDATE

DESCRIPTION:

Authorization of signatures is an item which is routinely updated to reflect changes in personnel and to comply with the requirements of the California Education Code.

As the agency which ultimately releases District payrolls and warrants, the Orange County Department of Education (OCDE) must maintain on file the approved signature authorizations for all school districts. The signatures are applicable to various documents which are approved by the Board of Education and in compliance with the Education Code and other pertinent state and federal laws. The administrative/leadership employees for whom the signature authorizations are designated do not transfer that authority to any staff members.

Purchase orders are processed within the limitations of existing site/program budgets, with the P.O. listing submitted to the Board of Education at each meeting. Non-routine expenditures for consultants, contracts, major facility additions, etc. are submitted to the Board separately for authorization. Before the preparation of a warrant, it is determined that the proper authorizations and approvals exist. Warrants prepared by the District are forwarded to the OCDE for review of documentation, county signature, and entry to OUSD's county ledgers before they are returned to the District for release to vendors, consultants, or contractors. Purchase orders, bid documents, warrants, payrolls, federal/state/county documents, etc. are audited by the District's independent audit firm.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This item has no fiscal impact.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education adopt Resolution No. 17-06-07 granting signature authorization for specific District administrative/leadership employees as indicated on the attached document.
