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TOPIC: **ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT LEGISLATIVE COALITION – APPROVAL OF BYLAWS, SECOND READING**

DESCRIPTION: The Bylaws Sub-committee of the Legislative Coalition reviewed and revised its Bylaws, which were subsequently approved by the members of the Legislative Coalition. The revised Bylaws were presented for a first reading at the January 18<sup>th</sup> meeting. The Board of Education discussed the proposed Bylaws and recommended certain revisions. Those suggested revisions are indicated in italicized bold print and strikeouts.

The Bylaws, as revised, are being presented tonight for a second reading.

FISCAL IMPACT: This item has no fiscal impact

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended the Board of Education receive the Bylaws of the Legislative Coalition for a second reading.

**Orange Unified School District**  
**Legislative Coalition**  
***BYLAWS***

**Mission Statement**

The Legislative Coalition of the Orange Unified School District shall bring together distinct parties from throughout the District for the purposes of understanding and promoting educational legislation.

**ARTICLE I – NAME**

This committee shall be known as the Legislative Coalition (Coalition) of the Orange Unified School District (District).

**ARTICLE II - PURPOSE**

The Coalition exists to develop and communicate an approved platform from the ~~Orange Unified School District~~ to elected officials and to increase school-community awareness of legislative issues.

The Coalition shall study legislative issues related to the ~~Orange Unified School District~~ and submit recommendations to the Board of Education (Board) for possible action.

**ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP**

**Section 1: Selection**

The Coalition shall encourage each representative organization to appoint a member to serve on the Coalition. The (representative) membership of the Coalition will consist of:

- One parent representative from each school, ratified by the parent group. (In the event there is no parent group representative, the principal may designate a representative.)
- No more than three representatives from the Board of Education
- The Superintendent or designee
- One representative from the Orange Unified Education Association
- One representative from the Classified School Employee Association
- One representative from the Orange Community Council of PTAs

**Section 2: Members-at-Large**

A. The Coalition may approve members-at-large. To be eligible for an at-large membership, the applicant must be a parent from a school in the District.



B. The applicant must submit an application, obtained from the Chair of the Coalition. The Chair will present the application for consideration. Member-at-large applications shall only be considered at the September meeting of the Coalition. If approved by a 2/3 majority vote of the Coalition, the applicant becomes a member in good standing at the next regular Coalition meeting.

C. The number of members-at-large shall not exceed ten percent of the school based membership as of the September meeting.

D. Members-at-large cannot serve as officers of the Coalition.

E. Members-at-large are non-voting members.

### **Section 3: Terms of Office**

A. Members shall be appointed by their representative organization and shall serve for a one-year term.

B. Representative members may serve unlimited consecutive terms.

C. Members-at-large shall serve until June 30<sup>th</sup> following their approval.

D. Members-at-large may only serve one school year and can only become a member-at-large on an every other school year basis.

### **Section 4: Attendance**

A. Members are expected to attend all meetings of the Coalition. If a Coalition member is unable to attend a meeting, the representative organization may appoint a designee. If the representative organization does not have an appointed member, then the representative organization may assign a designee to act on their behalf.

B. The Secretary of the Coalition shall record attendance.

C. After a representative member of the Coalition has three absences from regularly scheduled meetings, the Chair shall inform its appointing body for appropriate action.

D. After any member-at-large has three absences from regularly scheduled meetings, his/her membership may be revoked by a majority vote of the members of the Coalition.

### **Section 5: Release**

A. Any member of the Coalition *who violates these bylaws* may be released *from the Coalition* upon a majority vote of the members of the Coalition. ~~based upon requirements as determined by the members.~~

## ARTICLE IV - MEETINGS

### Section 1: Regular Meetings

The Coalition is scheduled to meet once a month for its regular meetings, or more frequently as needed, at a time and place to be designated by the Chair with the approval of the Coalition members.

### Section 2: Quorum

A quorum shall consist of a simple majority of the voting members.

### Section 3: Public Meetings

All meetings of the Coalition shall be open to the public *and conducted in accordance with the Ralph M. Brown Act.*

### Section 4: Minutes

Minutes of each meeting shall be distributed to members, school principals, the Board of Education, and the Superintendent and will be posted on the District website.

### Section 5: Speakers

By invitation of the Chair, guest speakers may be invited to address the Coalition.

### Section 6: Coalition Member Responsibility

Members shall report to their representative organizations on actions and activities of the Coalition. Communication to the public regarding the Coalition's proposals and activities shall be reviewed and approved by two Coalition officers prior to distribution or release.

### Section 7: Voting

- A. A member's vote shall reflect the direction of its representatives' organization.
- B. Each member is entitled to one vote on behalf of their representative organization(s).
- C. Representatives of the Board of Education shall serve in an advisory capacity and shall not be entitled to vote.

### Section 8: Agenda

- A. The Chair of the Coalition shall prepare an agenda for each meeting.
- B. In accordance with the requirements of the Ralph M. Brown Act, *Government Code section 54954.2*, the agenda for the Coalition will be posted for the public at least 72 hours in advance of the meeting.

C. Members who wish to place an item on the agenda shall submit the item to the Chair at least one week prior to the regularly scheduled meeting.

D. The Chair is responsible for distributing copies of the agenda to all Coalition members and the *Superintendent's Office* at least 72 hours in advance of the meeting.

~~E. Subject to approval of a two-thirds majority of voting members present, items not on the agenda may be presented for discussion by Coalition members or members of the public at the conclusion of the scheduled agenda items.~~

~~1. Presentations shall be permitted only if relevant to the stated purpose of the Coalition.~~

~~2. Presentations shall be limited to three minutes with time for questions by members of the Coalition. The Secretary shall enforce the time constrictions on all speakers.~~

### **Section 9: Parliamentary Procedure**

The meetings of the Coalition shall be conducted in accordance with the most recent edition of Robert's Rules of Order, newly revised.

## **ARTICLE V - OFFICERS**

### **Section 1: Officers**

A. The officers of the Coalition shall be: Chair, Vice Chair, Platform Subcommittee Chair, Treasurer, and Secretary.

B. Officers shall be elected at the June meeting of the Coalition.

C. Officers shall serve for a term of one year or until their successor is elected. No officer shall be eligible to serve for the same office for more than two consecutive terms or hold more than one elected office. Officers will assume their duties on July 1. An officer who has served in an office for more than six months of a full term shall be deemed to have served a full term in such office.

### **Section 2: Duties of the Chair**

A. The Chair shall preside at all regular and special meetings of the Coalition.

B. The Chair shall prepare an agenda for each meeting of the Coalition.

C. The Chair shall be responsible for posting and distributing the agenda.

D. The Chair may report to the Board regarding actions and activities of the Coalition.

E. Should the Chair be unable to complete his or her term of office, the Vice-Chair shall assume the duties of the Chair until a successor is elected or the term of office is deemed complete.

**Section 3: Duties of the Vice-Chair**

- A. The Vice-Chair shall perform the duties of the Chair in his or her absence.
- B. The Vice-Chair shall preside over the planning subcommittee for the Sacramento trip.

**Section 4: Duties of the Platform Subcommittee Chair**

- A. The Platform Subcommittee Chair shall be responsible for all activities and duties associated with the organization, development, approval and presentation of the Coalition platform.
- B. The Platform Subcommittee Chair shall be responsible for convening all subcommittee meetings.

**Section 4: Duties of the Secretary**

- A. The Secretary shall keep an accurate record of all the Coalition meetings.
- B. The Secretary shall keep a record of attendance for all meetings.

**Section 5: Duties of the Treasurer**

- A. The treasurer shall receive and give receipt for all funds received on behalf of the Coalition at each meeting, including all income, expenditures and ending balances.

**Section 6: Duties of the Members of the Board of Education**

- A. Board of Education representatives shall serve as advisors to the Coalition.
- B. Board of Education representatives shall bring to the Coalition legislative issues for discussion.
- C. Board of Education representative ~~should~~ **shall** report to the Board of Education on the activities and actions of the Coalition.

**ARTICLE VI - SUBCOMMITTEES**

The Chair may appoint such subcommittees as deemed necessary, designating the Chair of the subcommittee and specifying the objectives of the subcommittee.

## ARTICLE VII - PLATFORM

The Coalition shall develop a platform annually by the following procedure:

1. Officers of the Coalition, up to three members of the Board of Education, and the Superintendent or his/her designee will develop ideas for an initial platform.
2. The Chair shall appoint a Platform Subcommittee, including at least one member of the Board of Education, to develop a draft platform.
3. The subcommittee shall present its draft platform to the Coalition no later than the November Coalition meeting.
4. The Coalition shall review and revise the draft platform as necessary.
5. The subcommittee shall review and revise the draft platform as necessary, and present the revised platform to the Coalition for approval.
6. The approved platform shall be submitted to the Board of Education for approval.

## ARTICLE VIII - MEETING WITH LEGISLATIVE REPRESENTATIVES

### Section 1: Attendance

A. Members who attend the legislative trip in Sacramento are to ~~represent the Board of Education~~ ***present the legislative platform as approved by the Board of Education.***

B. Representatives may only discuss the legislative platform which has been approved by the Board of Education.

C. The Sacramento trip should be scheduled no later than April 30 of each year to fulfill the mission statement.

D. Only members who have attended at least four regularly scheduled Coalition meetings may attend the Sacramento trip.

***E. Those members requesting to attend the legislative trip in Sacramento shall be approved to attend by a majority vote of the members of the Coalition at least 30 days prior to the scheduled trip.***

## ARTICLE IX - AMENDMENTS

### Section 1: Amendments

These bylaws may be amended by the following procedures:

1. The Chair shall appoint a Bylaws Subcommittee.
2. The Bylaws Subcommittee shall submit written recommendations for proposed changes to its members, showing deletions and additions.

3. The proposed bylaws shall be provided to each member at least thirty (30) days prior to consideration by the members. The proposed bylaw amendments must show deletions and additions.
4. Proposed amendments shall be reviewed by Coalition members and their appointing bodies.

## **Section 2: Adoption of Amendments**

Proposed amendments to the Bylaws shall be adopted by a majority of its members present at the meeting. The Bylaws as revised shall be submitted to the Board of Education. The Board of Education reserves the right to amend the Bylaws of the Coalition.

**TOPIC: ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT PROPOSED LEGISLATIVE COALITION – 2007 PLATFORM, FIRST READING**

**DESCRIPTION:** The Legislative Coalition is a committee of the Board of Education. The purpose of this committee is to:

- Forward the agenda of Orange Unified School District to elected officials and to increase school-community awareness of legislative issues;
- Study legislative issues related to the Orange Unified School District and submit recommendations to the Board of Education for possible action; and
- Serve as a link with the community to enhance the understanding of the legislative process and to distribute such information to the community.

The Legislative Coalition will continue to receive input from school sites regarding the specific wording of the individual initiatives included in the Platform. The Platform will be presented to the members of the Legislative Coalition for a final vote on February 21, 2007. Following the vote, the Platform then will be presented to the Board of Education for a second reading approval at the February 22, 2007 meeting.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** There is no fiscal impact.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended the Board of Education receive the proposed Legislative Coalition Platform for 2007 for a first reading.

## *Legislative Coalition*

### 2007 Legislative Platform - Proposed

**The OUSD Board of Education and its Legislative Coalition support legislation that would:**

1. Encourage reform in the process and payment of mandated costs.
2. Establish a declining enrollment adjustment (based on a multi-year average of average daily attendance [ADA]) to allow districts time to adjust to loss of revenue resulting from multi-year reductions in enrollment.
3. Increase state financial support for the purpose of professional staff development on non-student days.
4. Promote changes to current Class Size Reduction legislation that would provide flexibility in staffing (by allowing district-wide averages of 23:1).
5. Promote legislation that would allow a district to replace portable classrooms older than 20 years without losing new construction eligibility.
6. Promote legislation that would provide ADA funding for on-line classes and modify the teacher-to-student ratio for on-line classes.
7. Provide legislation that would provide and fully fund career and technical education for all students, prior to high school graduation.
8. Promote legislation that would establish a time period longer than one year for state-funded programs. This would allow districts a more reasonable opportunity to develop funding rather than having to reduce district support for other programs when state funding for new programs ceases.
9. Support state funding for home-to-school and special education transportation that reflects actual costs.
10. Support legislation that would require coordination and cooperation between state and local agencies for student safety and security by establishing grant and emergency funds for school site safety and security.



- TOPIC:** **PROPOSED BOARD POLICY REVISIONS - 5000 SERIES, STUDENTS – FIRST READING**
- DESCRIPTION:** Educational Services staff members have been working with the law firm, Parker & Covert to update and revise the 5000 series of Board Policies pertaining to students.
- The entire 5000 series are presented for a first reading. (Due to the volume, the 5000 series will be available under separate cover.)
- FISCAL IMPACT:** There is no fiscal impact.
- RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board of Education accept the proposed Board Policy revisions for the 5000 series, Students , for a first reading.

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**TOPIC: VIDEO REPORT ON THE PROGRESS OF THE HANDS-ON INQUIRY-CENTERED K-6 SCIENCE PROGRAM**

**DESCRIPTION:** The Hands-On Inquiry-Centered K-6 Science program, funded by the Beckman Foundation with matching District funds, began in the fall of 2002. The video will highlight the progress made during the last four years. Highlights include teacher training, classroom use, refurbishment of science kits, the partnership with Canyon Hills' job workshop program, Fletcher Elementary School Science Night, and the 2006 Community Science Night at Santiago Canyon College,

**FISCAL IMPACT:** This item has no fiscal impact on the general fund.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board of Education receive the video report.

**TOPIC: ACTUARIAL VALUATION OF RETIREE HEALTH BENEFITS AS OF JANUARY 1, 2006**

**DESCRIPTION:** The Epler Company has completed an actuarial valuation of retiree health benefits as of January 1, 2006. This actuarial valuation is in compliance with Governmental Accounting Standards Board Statements Nos. 43 and 45 (GASB 43 & 45) in regard to unfunded liabilities for retiree health benefits. The objective of GASB 45 is to improve financial reporting of governmental entities regarding other post-employment benefits (OPEB) including retiree health benefits. This financial information is required to be disclosed as part of June 30, 2007 financial statements for all governmental entities with budgets exceeding \$100 million.

Governmental entities, including the State of California and many counties, cities and school districts, have significant liabilities in this area. The District Fiscal Solvency grant included in the state budget for 2006/2007 provides some funding to develop a plan to deal with OPEB liabilities. Long term solutions and alternatives to deal with this issue are beginning to emerge as this becomes a major budget issue. Once alternatives are identified, a recommendation that meets the needs of Orange Unified School District will be brought to the Board of Education for approval.

It's anticipated that a plan will be completed this year for Board approval. This is a challenging issue for the District since lifetime health benefits were provided for employees in the past. Even though lifetime benefits were discontinued during 1991 and 1992, the liability continues until all eligible employees have retired and received benefits due.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** The actuarial liability for the District's retiree health plan, as of January 1, 2006, is \$150.2 million.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board of Education receive for information the actuarial valuation of retiree health benefits as of January 1, 2006.

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# CONSENT ITEMS

*ROUTINE ITEMS ACTED UPON IN ONE MOTION UNLESS PULLED FOR DISCUSSION AND SEPARATE ACTION.*

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TOPIC: **PURCHASE ORDERS LIST**

DESCRIPTION: Purchase orders have been processed in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Board of Education and applicable legal requirements of the State of California.

District procedures and computer system controls require that an approved purchase order, pay voucher, current liability, or credit memo exist on the District's computer system prior to the issuance of warrants. There may be a multiple number of warrants drawn against a given purchase order up to the maximum amount for that purchase order. The system restricts the processing of payment amounts in excess of the issued purchase order.

It should be noted that the purchase order system allows for a one-line description of the services or items to be procured. The issued purchase order forms a contract between the District and the vendor.

FISCAL IMPACT: \$5,812,358.30

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the Purchase Orders List dated December 18, 2006 through January 28, 2007 in the amount of \$5,812,358.30.

TOPIC: **WARRANTS LIST**

DESCRIPTION: Warrants have been processed in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Board of Education and applicable legal requirements of the State of California and the Orange County Department of Education.

District procedures and computer system controls require that an approved purchase order, pay voucher, current liability, or credit memo exist on the District's computer system prior to the issuance of warrants. There may be a multiple number of warrants drawn against a given purchase order up to the maximum amount for that purchase order. The processing of the warrant is in compliance with the contractual agreement that has been formed by the issuance of the purchase order.

FISCAL IMPACT: \$8,939,299.42

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the Warrants List dated December 18, 2006 through January 28, 2007 in the amount of \$8,939,299.42.

**TOPIC:** **GIFTS**

**DESCRIPTION:** The gift of cash as delineated on the attached list was donated to the District for use as indicated.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** This item has no fiscal impact.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended the Board of Education accept these cash donations and that a letter of appreciation be forwarded to each benefactor.

**TOPIC: TEACHER ASSIGNMENT/CONSENT - VARIABLE OR SHORT-TERM WAIVER**

**DESCRIPTION:** The California Education Code authorizes, under the provision of Section 44830(a), variable term waivers that have to do with educator preparation and credentialing, and with the ability of employers to employ or assign persons who are not appropriately credentialed for their assignment. Requests for Variable Term Waivers may be submitted by employing agencies to solve a temporary certification or assignment problem, when the employing agency finds there are an insufficient number of certificated persons who meet the specified employment criteria for a position.

The California Education Code authorizes, under the provision of Section 80122 employing agencies to grant a short-term waiver provided it is issued one time only for any one credentialed teacher and one time only for a given classroom. They are valid for no more than one semester.

The teacher(s) whose name(s) is/are listed on the attached has/have met the requirements, has/have consented to the assignment, and has/have been judged by the site administrator to be competent in the subject matter. Likewise, all other means of credentialing and reassignment have been explored. The passage of this waiver will allow us to remain compliant with SB 435, which requires that all teachers be appropriately assigned.

TOPIC: **STUDY TRIPS**

DESCRIPTION: Canyon Rim Elementary – 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Classes – Oak Glen, CA  
April 17 – 18, 2007

Canyon Rim Elementary School's 5<sup>th</sup> grade classes, under the direction of the three 5<sup>th</sup> grade teachers, will travel to Oak Glen on April 17 – 18, 2007. Students will explore life in the colonies prior to and during the Revolutionary War time. This experience will correlate with 5<sup>th</sup> grade social science standards. Total cost per student is \$110; scholarships are available. Students will miss one day of school and no substitutes will be required.

El Modena High School – Thespian Society - Ontario, CA  
April 13 – 15, 2007

El Modena's National Thespian Society will travel to Ontario to attend the 2007 California State Thespian Festival. The students will participate in workshops, scholarship competitions, and college auditions with over one thousand Thespians from all across California. The five female and four male students will be accompanied by one female adult chaperone. Transportation will be provided by the student's parents who will drive only their own child. Students and chaperone will stay at the Countryside Suites by Ayres in Ontario. The cost per student is \$250 and scholarships are available. Students will miss one school day and a substitute will be required. The cost of the substitute will be funded from the site discretionary department funds.

Taft Elementary School – 6<sup>th</sup> Grade GATE Class – Catalina Island – March 5 – 7, 2007

Taft Elementary School's 6<sup>th</sup> grade GATE class, under the direction of Stephanie Swailes, will travel to Catalina Island to spend one night at a camp site and one night aboard the ship, Fury. Students will experience a life science lesson about organisms in the ecosystems which addresses the 6<sup>th</sup> grade science standards on ecology. Total cost per student is \$360; scholarships are available. Students will miss three days of school and no substitute will be required.

Taft Elementary School – 5<sup>th</sup> Grade GATE Class – Idyllwild, CA  
April 30 – May 2, 2007

Taft Elementary School's 5<sup>th</sup> grade GATE class, under the direction of Jennifer Mai, will travel to Idyllwild on April 30 – May 2, 2007 to participate in their Astro Camp. Students will learn about planetary atmospheres and changes in states of matter through activities and experiments as addressed by 5<sup>th</sup> grade science standards. Total cost per student is \$200, scholarships are available. The students will miss three days of school and no substitute is required.

Villa Park High School – Junior Statesmen of America –  
Woodland Hills, CA – February 10 – 12, 2007

The Villa Park High School Junior Statesmen of American will under the supervision of their advisor Paul Hunt will travel to Woodland Hills to participate in the Southern California Junior State of America Congress 2007. This conference is a political forum for students to express their views on the world. It teaches students about current events and how the constitution applies to us. The nine (9) male and ten (10) female students will be accompanied by one male and one female adult chaperone. The students will travel by district bus and will be staying at the Warner Center Marriott in Woodland Hills. The cost per student is \$115 and scholarships are available. The students will not miss any school days and no substitute will be required.

FISCAL IMPACT: Expenditure of donated funds and unrestricted general fund monies.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the study trips as presented.



**TOPIC: PLAN TO UTILIZE CALSTAT FUNDING FOR SPECIAL EDUCATION STUDENTS**

**DESCRIPTION:** CalSTAT, a special project of the California Department of Education (CDE), helps schools and families educate children with special needs. The project assists CDE in achieving the objectives of the State Improvement Grant (SIG). It works collaboratively to bring research-based training to schools and families using workshops, online conferences, meetings, and publications. Its activities encourage general education, special education, and families to combine their efforts to improve education. Finally, CalSTAT awards money to successful schools, teacher training programs, and parent centers to improve the quality of education in California, with funds coming from CDE and other sources.

Promising Practice Sites receive specialized CalSTAT technical assistance to support the ongoing growth of the site and their programs. Santiago Charter Middle School has been selected as a Promising Practice Site. They have been awarded \$6,000 in federal money for coaching and support for special education teachers using the 3<sup>rd</sup> Edition Language! Program, a state adopted literacy intervention for low performing language arts students. Guidelines for implementation:

- Attend 2007 State Leadership Institute (\$2,000 stipend provided)
- Maintain representative site team that includes a general educator, a special educator, an administrator and a parent.
- Select a point of contact with CalSTAT (Judy Henderson, RSP teacher at Santiago, is the appointed contact).
- Complete at least three days of technical assistance for on-site professional development to support implementation of their model project.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** Receipt of Categorical Grant Funds totaling \$6,000.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board of Education accept the CalSTAT funding.

**TOPIC: PLAN FOR DISCRETIONARY BLOCK GRANT – SCHOOL SITE**

**DESCRIPTION:** The California State Legislature passed Assembly Bill 1802 in 2006, which allocates funds to be apportioned to school districts on an equal amount per pupil enrolled in the district per 2006-07 CBEDS. School Services estimates that funding will be \$56 per CBEDS enrollment. The minimum allocation is \$5,000 for school sites of 25 or fewer pupils and \$10,000 for school sites of more than 25 pupils. According to the new law, these dollars are to be spent in accordance with a plan developed by each school's School Site Council. Money may be expended for any one-time educational purpose including, but not limited to, instructional materials, classroom laboratory supplies and materials, school and classroom library materials, educational technology, deferred maintenance, professional development, and one-time expenditures designed to close the achievement gap.

All Orange Unified School District elementary, middle and high schools are participating in this grant and have provided documentation of a plan developed and approved by their individual School Site Councils.

The individual school plans will be available under separate cover for review.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** Receipt of grant monies totaling \$1,743,288.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board of Education approve each schools Discretionary Block Grant Plan as presented.

**TOPIC: FEDCO FOUNDATION TEACHER GRANT – ORANGE COUNTY COMMUNITY FOUNDATION - ORANGE HIGH SCHOOL**

**DESCRIPTION:** Orange High School is requesting Board approval for receipt of \$1,800 from the Fedco Foundation Teacher Grant through the Orange County Community Foundation. This grant was awarded to the school on behalf of Ms. Virginia Everett, a math teacher. The grant funds will support the purchase of algebra tiles for the math classes.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** Receipt of restricted categorical funds totaling \$1,800.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board of Education accept these funds.

TOPIC: **COURSE APPROVAL: COMPUTERIZED ACCOUNTING I (FORMERLY ACCOUNTING I)**

DESCRIPTION: The revised course outline described below has been reviewed by the District's Educational Services Department Staff and is recommended to the Board of Education for approval.

**REVISED COURSE**

- **Computerized Accounting I** is a comprehensive, self-contained, fully-computer integrated one-year course which gives an overview of the complete accounting process using both manual entry and industry-standard accounting software such as Excel, Peachtree, and QuickBooks. Basic theories and problems relating to a sole proprietorship are emphasized, while the partnership and corporate types of businesses are included. The accounting cycle for both service and merchandising businesses are included. The theory of double entry accounting, account classification, worksheets, and preparation of financial statements, and ethics will be discussed. This course supports the California Business Education Career Path and Model Curriculum Standards.

FISCAL IMPACT: There is no fiscal impact on the general fund.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the above-described course.

**INTRODUCTION TO THE SUBJECT:**

Accounting I is a comprehensive, self-contained, fully-computer integrated one-year course which gives an overview of the complete accounting process using both manual entry and industry-standard accounting software such as Excel, Peachtree, and QuickBooks. Basic theories and problems relating to a sole proprietorship are emphasized, while the partnership and corporate types of businesses are included. The accounting cycle for both service and merchandising businesses are included. The theory of double entry accounting, account classification, worksheets, and preparation of financial statements, and ethics will be discussed. This course supports the California Business Education Career Path and Model Curriculum Standards.

**COURSE OBJECTIVES:**

**BY THE END OF THE COURSE THE STUDENT WILL BE ABLE TO:**

Develop a knowledge and understanding of the language and concepts of Accounting I.

Obtain employability skills such as time management, problem-solving, and critical thinking.

Obtain technology skills by using MS Word, Excel, Peachtree and QuickBooks.

Obtain career goals knowledge in the field of accounting.

Analyze standard business financial reports by using a business simulation.

Review the accounting cycle for a sole proprietorship including transactional analysis journals, ledgers and posting, analysis of adjustments, the work sheet, financial statements, recording of adjusting, closing entries and the post closing trial balance.

Review the accounting cycle for a merchandising business including accounting for sales on account, cash receipts, purchases on account, cash payments, journal transactions, preparing a ten-column worksheet, preparing financial statements for a corporation, and recording adjusting and closing entries.

Review accounting for payroll and payroll tax records.

Be involved in class discussion regarding the use of computers in accounting, the practice of ethics as related to the accounting field and the careers available in accounting.

**10.0 Technical Knowledge and Skills**

Students understand the essential knowledge and skills common to all pathways in the finance and business sector.





**TOPIC: SECOND QUARTER REPORT OF UNIFORM COMPLIANTS FOR THE WILLIAMS CASE SETTLEMENT**

**DESCRIPTION:** As a result of the State of California's settlement of the Williams class action lawsuit, Education Code section 35186 requires the following of school districts:

1. Provide an opportunity to file formal complaints under the District's Uniform Compliant Procedures.
2. Report to the Board of Education and the public four times a year the number of complaints filed and the area of the settlement targeted.

The required second quarter report covers the number of Uniform Complaints received by the District under the three areas governed by the Williams Case Settlement for the period of October–December 2006. The three targeted areas are:

- Sufficient instructional materials
- Emergency or urgent facility conditions that pose a threat to the health and safety of pupils or staff
- Teacher vacancy and misassignment

No complaints were received during the second quarter at any District site.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** This item has no fiscal impact.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board of Education receive the Report of Uniform Complaints as mandated by the Williams Case Settlement.

**TOPIC: TEXTBOOK ADOPTIONS – 30-DAY REVIEW BY PUBLIC**

**DESCRIPTION:** Textbooks and supplementary instructional texts are reviewed by teacher committees from respective grade levels or departments, who screen available texts and materials for potential adoption. The selection committee(s) submit their recommendations to the District Instructional Materials Advisory Committee (IMAC) for review and consideration. The IMAC committee is composed of parents, principals, media specialists, and teachers whose responsibility is to recommend to the Board of Education approval of the considered texts.

It is at this juncture that the Board of Education places the texts and/or supplementary texts on "30-day review period," so members from the public may have an opportunity to review those texts, pending formal adoption. The texts are available for review in the Board Room this evening and after tonight in the offices of the Library Media Technology/G.A.T.E. Coordinator located in the Instructional Media Center. After the 30-day review period, the Board of Education takes formal action to adopt the textbooks and/or supplementary texts.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** Textbooks will be purchased from the textbook accounts during the 2006/2007 school year. Auxiliary/supplemental adoption texts are used to supplement the basic textbook and are purchased with funds other than the state textbook monies.
