RESOLUTION 22-06-07 OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT DECLARING ITS INTENTION TO CONVEY A PORTION OF LINDA VISTA ELEMENTARY SCHOOL FRONTING ALONG CANNON STREET (.O57 ACRES) TO THE CITY OF ORANGE FOR THE CANNON STREET REALIGNMENT PROJECT

DESCRIPTION:

The City of Orange requests that the District convey the 20-foot frontage along Cannon Street of Linda Vista Elementary School (Legal description - Exhibit "A" & "B"). District and school staff reviewed the proposed plans and asked for certain design considerations. The City modified the design to accommodate those requests.

The District is authorized to convey property to the City under Education Code Section 17556, et. seq. Prior to the conveyance and recording, three steps must be taken per the Code: 1) Board resolution declaring intent to grant the conveyance; 2) Conduct a public hearing; and 3) Second Board resolution conveying title. Upon approval of the resolution presented herein, staff will advertise the public hearing at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting on April 19, 2007.

FISCAL IMPACT:

No fiscal impact

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the resolution declaring its intention to convey grant deed to the City of Anaheim for the Cannon Street Realignment Project.

RESOLUTION NO. 22-06-07

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT DECLARING ITS INTENTION TO DEDICATE PROPERTY

WHEREAS, the Orange Unified School District (the "District") owns and operates the Linda Vista Elementary School (the "School"), located at 1200 North Cannon Street, in the City of Orange, County of Orange, State of California; and

WHEREAS, the City of Orange ("City") has requested that an approximate 2,482 square foot portion of the School, as described on Exhibit "A" and depicted on Exhibit "B" attached hereto and incorporated herein by this reference (the "Property"), be dedicated and conveyed by Grant Deed for the realignment and widening of Cannon Street; and

WHEREAS, the realignment and widening of Cannon Street, together with the City's construction of improvements to the adjacent School parking lot will be of direct benefit to the District in providing improved parking facilities and necessary street and utilities to service the School; and

WHEREAS, the District is authorized to convey the Property to the City pursuant to Education Code section 17556, et seq.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Education of the Orange Unified School District does hereby resolve, determine and order as follows:

- 1. The Board does hereby announce its intention to dedicate and convey the Property to the City, using the Grant Deed in the form attached hereto as Exhibit "C".
- 2. At the Board meeting to be held on April 19, 2007 at 7:30 p.m. in the District Education Center, Building H, located at 1401 North Handy Street, Orange, California, a public hearing will be held upon the question of the proposed dedication and conveyance of the Property to the City.
- 3. The Superintendent of this District or his designee is hereby authorized and directed to give notice of the Board's intent to dedicate the Property by posting copies of this Resolution signed by the Board or a majority of it, in three (3) public places in the District no less than ten (10) days before the date of the public meeting, and by publishing the notice once at least five (5) days before the date of the public meeting in a newspaper of general circulation, published in the District, if there is one, or, if there is no such newspaper published in the District, then in a newspaper published in Orange County having a general circulation in the District.



ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT LEGISLATIVE COALITION - REQUEST FOR SUPPORT OF PENDING LEGISLATION

DESCRIPTION:

At the February 22nd meeting, the Board of Education approved the Legislative Coalition's 2007 Platform, which will be presented to California legislators during the Coalition's trip to Sacramento in April. In addition, the Coalition requests Board approval for the Coalition to support newly-introduced legislation as follows:

AB 1638 Houston

This bill would require the Superintendent of Public Instruction, for the 2007-2008 fiscal year, to compute an equalization adjustment for each school district pursuant to the same formula used for the 2006-2007 fiscal year.

For the purposes of implementing this equalization adjustment, this bill would appropriate \$150,000,000 from the General Fund to the Superintendent. These funds would be required to be applied, in the 2007-2008 fiscal year, toward the minimum funding requirements for school districts and community college districts imposed by Section 8 of Article XVI of the California Constitution.

This bill would declare that it is to take effect immediately as an urgency statue. If the equalization calculation provided for in SB 1638 is approved, OUSD would then be within the 90% level of all school districts. The passage of this bill would provide an additional \$734,000 to OUSD.

AB 768 Walters

Existing law establishes various categorical education programs for which funding is provided for specific educational purposes. Some of these programs are; Special Education, Educational Technology, Routine Restricted Maintenance Match, Transportation Funding, Library Improvement Block Grant, School Safety Block Grants and the Regional Occupation Program.

This bill would declare the intent of the Legislature to enact legislation to consolidate certain funds currently allocated to school districts through various categorical education programs.

AB 168 Berg

This bill would authorize a school district to apply to the State Allocation Board (SAB) for new construction funding based on a lack of *minimum essential facilities*, or a failure of the minimum essential facilities to meet the minimum square footage requirements on an existing school site.

The bill would require the Office of Public Instruction and the Superintendent of Public Instruction to establish standards for *minimum* essential facilities, including minimum square footage requirements for Kindergarten and grades 1-12. The bill also requires the SAB to adopt regulations incorporating those standards.

The bill would require the SAB to establish cost per square foot standards and limit the funding to school districts for *minimum* essential facilities to no more than 50% of the total cost of the project. AB 168 would limit the expenditure of funds allocated for minimum essential facilities to construction, expansion, or reconfiguration of minimum essential facilities at existing school sites.

At this point there is no indication as to what defines *minimum* essential facilities. However, it is believed that bathrooms, a cafeteria, or a library could be defined as *minimum* essential facilities. Therefore, this could be a most beneficial bill to OUSD.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended the Board of Education support the newlyintroduced legislation as stated above.

PROPOSED BOARD BYLAW REVISIONS – BB 9200, BOARD MEMBERS; BB 9322, AGENDA/MEETING MATERIALS – FIRST READING

DESCRIPTION:

At the March 8, 2007 meeting, the issue was raised whether agenda Item 13.D. requested by Mr. Ledesma and Mr. Rocco was within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board of Education. It was the consensus of the Board to consider revising its bylaws regarding the procedure for Board members to submit an agenda item.

The proposed revision to Board Bylaws 9200 and 9322 (attached) states that agenda items submitted by Board members for placement on the agenda must be submitted to the Superintendent's office at least ten (10) working days prior to the meeting date. The Board President will decide whether the request is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board and whether the agenda item is appropriate for open or closed session. If the Board President decides the item is not within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board, the Board member may appeal to the Board of Education for a final determination.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education accept the proposed Board Bylaw revisions for a first reading.

Board Members

Limits of Board Members Authority

The Board of Education is the unit of authority over the District. It has broad but clearly limited powers. The exercise of its authority is restricted to the functions required or permitted by law, and then only when it acts in a legally constituted meeting. (cf. 9000 - Role of Board and Members)

The Board member has no individual authority. Individually, the Board member may not commit the District to any policy, act or expenditure. The Board member cannot do business with the District, nor should the Board member have an interest in any contract with the school District. The Board member represents and acts for the community as a whole. (cf. 9270 - Conflict of Interest)

Members of the Board, by virtue of holding office, shall not exercise any administrative responsibility with respect to the schools or command the services of any school employee. Individual Board members shall submit requests for information to the Superintendent. The Superintendent or designee shall provide materials and/or information that are readily available. (cf. 1340 - Access to District Records) (cf. 9011 - Disclosure of Confidential/Privileged Information) If a request for information is deemed by the Superintendent as requiring significant effort or research, he/she may assign a priority to the item, so that the preparation of the information does not significantly impact the operation of the District.

No member of the Board shall be asked to perform any routine or clerical duties which may be assigned to an employee, nor shall any Board member become an employee of the District while serving on the Board.

Obligations of Board Members

Board members should hold the education of children and youth above any partisan principle or group interest.

Board members should understand their role and the programs offered by the District. They should study all agenda materials before the meeting, participate in the discussion of items which come before the Board and vote on all motions and resolutions, abstaining only for compelling reasons. (cf. 9240 - Board Development) (cf. 9271 - Code of Ethics) (cf. 9320 - Meetings and Notices)

Board members may, at their discretion, refer Board-related correspondence to the Board President or the Superintendent or designee for an appropriate response.

Board members wishing to place an item on the Board agenda shall forward a copy of the item to the Board President Superintendent's Office within ten (10) working days prior to the meeting date. for consideration and placement on the Board agenda. The Board President will decide whether a Board member request is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board and whether the

agenda item is appropriate for discussion in open or closed session. If the Board President denies the placement of the item on the agenda, two Board members may override the denial and place the item on the agenda. The Board President's decision not to place an item on the may be appealed by the requesting Board member to the Board of Education for a determination by the Board on whether the matter is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board and if so, whether the item is an appropriate subject for open or closed session. (cf. 9322 - Agenda/Meeting Materials)

The request for an appeal must be made in writing to the Superintendent's Office ten (10) working days prior to the next scheduled meeting date. Items agendized for appeal will be presented by the Board President.

Board members and persons elected to the Board are responsible for complying with the requirements of the state's open meeting laws.

The Superintendent or designee shall provide a copy of the Brown Act to each Board member and to anyone who is elected to the Board.

Conflict Resolution

If a member of the Board has a conflict with another member of the Board, the Board member shall:

- 1. Make every effort as individuals to resolve the conflict, but failing to do shall:
 - a. Refer the matter to the Board as a whole for resolution, but failing to do so shall:
 - i. Refer the matter to a neutral facilitator for resolution.

Agenda/Meeting Materials

Board agendas shall state the meeting time and place and shall briefly describe each business item to be transacted or discussed, including items to be discussed in closed session. (Government Code 54954.2) (cf. 9122 - Secretary) (cf. 9320 - Meetings and Notices) (cf. 9321.1 - Closed Session Purposes and Agendas)

The agenda shall provide members of the public the opportunity to address the Board on any agenda item before or during the Board's consideration of the item. The agenda shall also provide members of the public an opportunity to testify at regular meetings on matters which are not on the agenda, but which are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board. (Government Code 54954.3) (E.C. 35145.5)

Notices of special meetings at which action is proposed shall provide an opportunity for the public to address the Board on the item before action is taken. (Government Code 54954.3) (cf. 9323 - Meeting Conduct)

Any member of the public may request that a matter within the <u>subject matter</u> jurisdiction of the Board be placed on the agenda of a regular <u>Board</u> meeting. The request must be in writing and submitted to the Superintendent's <u>office</u> with supporting documents and information, if any, at least ten (10) working days before the scheduled meeting date. The Superintendent or designee will decide whether a request is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board and whether the agenda item is appropriate for discussion in open or closed session. <u>Members of the public submitting a written agenda request will be advised by the Superintendent's office of how their request is being handled.</u>

A Board members may submit an item for the agenda no later than seven (7) working days before the scheduled meeting date request that a matter within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board be placed on the agenda of a regular Board meeting. The request must be submitted to the Superintendent's office at least ten (10) working days before the scheduled meeting date in the standard format for an agenda item, listing the Topic, a Description of the item, its Fiscal Impact (if any), and a proposed Recommendation. The Board President will decide whether a Board member request is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board and whether the agenda item is appropriate for discussion in open or closed session. The Board member submitting an agenda request will be advised by the Superintendent's office of how the Board member's request is being handled. The Board President's decision to not to place any item on the agenda ean be overridden by two (2) or more Board members may be appealed by the requesting Board member to the Board of Education for a determination by the Board on whether the matter is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board and if so, whether the item is an appropriate subject for open or closed session.

Items determined to be within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board will be added to the agenda at Item No. 13 or 16, taking into consideration the length and content of the meeting agenda. No more than two agenda item requests will be added to any agenda. Appropriate requests will be added to the Agenda in the order of receipt. Consideration of the agenda item is subject to the Board's Bylaws, and no member of the public or the Board has the right to speak on a matter outside the scope of the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board or unrelated to the agenda item under consideration. Comments that are outside the scope or unrelated to the agenda item at hand will be considered out of order and not a part of the agenda item.

When an item properly posted for a regular meeting is continued to a subsequent meeting, it does not have to be on the agenda of the subsequent meeting if it occurs within five days. The Board shall publicly identify the item before discussing it. (Government Code 54954.2)

All public communications with the Board are subject to requirements of relevant Board policies and administrative regulations. (cf. 1312.1 - Complaints Concerning School Personnel) (cf. 1312.2 - Complaints Concerning Instructional Material) (cf. 1312.3 - Uniform Complaint Procedures) (cf. 3320 - Claims and Actions Against the District) (cf. 5144.1 - Suspension/Expulsion) (cf. 9323.2 - Actions by the Board)

Consent Items

To promote efficient meetings, the Board may act upon more than one item by a single vote through the use of a consent agenda. Consent items are items of a routine nature or items for which no Board discussion is anticipated and for which the Superintendent recommends approval.

In accordance with law, the public has a right to comment on any consent item. At the request of any member of the Board, any item on the consent agenda shall be removed and given individual consideration for action as a regular agenda item.

Board Member Preparation

A copy of the agenda shall be forwarded to each Board member not less than three (3) days prior to a scheduled meeting date, together with the Superintendent or designee's report, minutes to be approved, copies of communications, reports from committees, staff, citizens and others, and other available documents pertinent to the meeting.

When special meetings are called, the secretary and president shall make every effort to get the agenda and support materials to Board members as soon as possible.

Board members shall review agenda materials before each meeting. Individual members may confer directly with the Superintendent or designee to request additional information on agenda items.

PRESENTATION OF REORGANIZATION PLAN FOR DISTRICT AND SITE LEVEL ADMINISTRATIVE DUTIES AND OTHER OPERATIONAL ADJUSTMENTS AS RELATED TO THE 2007-2008 GENERAL FUND BUDGET

DESCRIPTION:

The development of the 2007-2008 General Fund budget is in process. That process includes development of a multi-year projection that will receive positive certification from the Orange County Department of Education indicating the District will be able to meet its financial obligations for the current fiscal year and subsequent two fiscal years.

As part of this process, compliance issues for use of categorical funding will be reviewed, studies of staffing in comparable districts will be conducted and an extensive study of Special Education programs will be completed. The results of these studies will provide a basis for a final budget recommendation. This plan provides the necessary framework for implementation.

While this plan has a fiscal component, educational professional opportunities for students and opportunities for staff will be strengthened implementation. Our limited resources will be focused to a greater degree of personalization individualization instruction and small class size programs will be maintained.

Expansion of alternative programs including the Opportunity Program, Community Day School, ROP Program, and Saturday School will not only help to increase Average Daily Attendance (ADA), but will increase accountability and expand educational options for all students. The impact of declining enrollment has prompted greater review of where students are receiving educational services. Students with attendance, academic, or behavior issues often end up in instructional programs outside the District. This may have been an acceptable solution when facilities were at capacity, but it is not acceptable any longer. Orange Unified School District needs to be the best educational opportunity for every student residing here and these new programs will provide that opportunity.

One of the key components of this plan includes reassigning additional responsibilities that are included in categorical programs to principals at small schools (enrollment less than 450). This will create equality when comparing assignments with principals at larger school sites, provide professional growth opportunities as principals gain expertise through an expanded assignment, and allow small sites to continue to operate in a fiscally responsible manner.

There will be little or no money coming from the state in the near future for new programs due to the budget situation. Districts are seeking more local control through the legislative process for current and future funding. It's important to plan and use current resources in an efficient and effective way in order to make the case for more local control stronger.

This plan will utilize resources more efficiently, allow for stability to continue current educational programs, increase the ability to maintain local neighborhood schools, and help to provide a competitive level of compensation to attract and retain quality employees.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The budget is being developed to meet the Board of Education goal of Fiscal Responsibility.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education receive information on the reorganization plan for District and site level administrative duties and other operational adjustments as related to the 2007-2008 General Fund budget.

EXERCISE – RENEWAL FOR ELECTRIC SERVICES

DESCRIPTION: In March 2006, the firm of Stone Electric No. 2, Inc. was

competitively awarded a Unit Price Contract (UPC) for electrical services as required by the District. The contract provides for an initial one-year term, with two additional oneyear option renewals. Estimated peak bonded values are

\$300,000.

RESOLUTION NO. 23-06-07: APPROVAL TO MODIFY THE EXISTING MASTER CONTRACT BETWEEN THE DISTRICT AND THE XEROX CORPORATION

DESCRIPTION:

Under a competitive request for proposals, the County of Los Angeles awarded renewable Contract 41380 to Xerox Corporation for equipment and related supplies and services. The Board of Education has authorized the use of that contract as well as subsequent contract modifications which provided for additions, consolidations and technology improvements. The District utilizes this contract as a Master Contract.

The District has continuous requirements for office and Print Shop digital copier machines, office equipment, software and related supplies and services. In order to support document requirements, remain technologically current and to ensure operational cost effectiveness, the District regularly reviews its reproduction needs, upgrades reproduction equipment standards and makes Master Contract modifications. A recent review encompassed duplication needs at the four high schools, digital technology improvements, implementation of a Districtwide on-line purchase requisition program, color document volume increases and software licensing negotiations. As a result, a new Master Contract modification is proposed.

The modification proposal consists of the following:

- Provide 16 new, state of the art copy machines to replace aged units (8 upgraded Model 4110 units for high schools which process faster with more reliability and greater capabilities and 12 various new models for other sites)
- Provide periodic model 4110 operational software upgrades at no charge
- Provide various upgraded scanning equipment and new emailing software, enabling each District site to network scan, print and email via a Xerox machine
- Xerox will equally share upgraded Districtwide scanning and emailing software licensing costs
- Xerox will equally share PDF to Word conversion software costs for 75 seat licenses
- Increase monthly color copies volume from 36K to 38.5K
- Consolidating various contracts into Master Contract
- Lease financing at municipal tax-free rate

- Estimated contract costs will be reduced by \$3168
- The contract is currently in month 15 of a 60-month lease.
 The modification would establish a new 60-month term effective on July 1, 2007.

The Master Contract terms and conditions include a "most favored public entity pricing guarantee" and a "total satisfaction guarantee." Sites, schools and departments will utilize the Master Contract on an as needed basis by appropriate contract amendments.

As a result of the negotiated modification items and because a network drop project has been recently completed, each site and department will have a networked capable copy machine for scanning, printing and emailing purposes. Additionally, each site and department will receive a PDF to Word conversion software license.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Expenditures are made from all sites, programs and department budgets. This is not a request for any additional budgetary appropriation. Operational savings estimate is \$3,168.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education authorize staff to enter into an appropriate Master Contract modification with the Xerox Corporation for new reproduction equipment, equipment and software upgrades, and related supplies and services and contracts consolidation.

TEACHER ASSIGNMENT/CONSENT - VARIABLE OR SHORT-TERM WAIVER

DESCRIPTION:

The California Education Code authorizes, under the provision of Section 44830(a), Variable Term Waivers that have to do with educator preparation and credentialing, and with the ability of employers to employ or assign persons who are not appropriately credentialed for their assignment. Requests for Variable Term Waivers may be submitted by employing agencies to solve a temporary certification or assignment problem, when the employing agency finds there are an insufficient number of certificated persons who meet the specified employment criteria for a position.

The California Education Code authorizes, under the provision of Section 80122 employing agencies to grant a short-term waiver provided it is issued one time only for any one credentialed teacher and one time only for a given classroom. They are valid for no more than one semester.

The teacher(s) whose name(s) is/are listed on the attached has/have met the requirements, has/have consented to the assignment, and has/have been judged by the site administrator to be competent in the subject matter. Likewise, all other means of credentialing and reassignment have been explored. The passage of this waiver will allow us to remain compliant with SB 435, which requires that all teachers be appropriately assigned.

Nohl Canyon's 12-member Destination Imagination Team, under the supervision of Denise Trenner, will travel to Elk Grove to participate in the State Competition for Destination Imagination. Students will compete at Monterey Trail High School and Edward Harris Middle School. Each child is attending the event with their own parents who have arranged their transportation and lodging. Total cost per student is \$200 and scholarships are available.

<u>Orange HS – Junior ROTC – Camp Pendleton, CA – April 2 – 5, 2007</u>

This is an amendment to the study trip submitted and approved on December 14, 2006. The original trip planned to Bridgeport, CA on April 1–7, 2006 has been changed to Camp Pendleton due to troops arriving home from military service.

Orange's JROTC, under the direction of Lt. Col. Ruthenberg, will travel to Camp Pendleton to participate in a military orientation. The students will experience military living staying in barracks and eating in the mess hall. They will participate in rappelling, rigid rubber raft exercise and various obstacle courses as well as operate the Individual Simulated Marksmanship Trainer. The students will ride in the ocean amphibious tractors and conduct force marches. The 28 female and 17 male students will be accompanied by three male and two female adult chaperones. Transportation will be provided by OUSD buses with the students housed in the barracks. There is no cost to the students. The students will not miss any school days and no substitute will be required.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Expenditure of donated funds and unrestricted general fund monies.
