RECOGNITION OF STUDENTS, STAFF, AND COMMUNITY IN THE VILLA PARK HIGH SCHOOL ATTENDANCE AREA

DESCRIPTION:

The Orange Unified School District will recognize District schools by high school attendance area who have met one or more of the following criteria in their work to improve student academic achievement:

- Met all of their NCLB (AYP) targets.
- Reached or exceeded the state's goal of an API of 800.
- One of the three highest ranked elementary and secondary API schools in the District.
- One of the three highest growth/most improved elementary and secondary schools since the inception of the state testing program.
- One of the top three elementary and secondary schools that have the highest achieving English Learners in the District.
- School's scores reflect movement in closing the achievement gap of their English Learners in English Language Arts.
- One of the top five performing schools in the District on the new science proficiency portion of the STAR test.
- One of the top five performing schools in the District on the new History/Social Science proficiency portion of the STAR test.

Schools in the Villa Park High School attendance area meeting one or more of these criteria are: Fletcher, McPherson, Nohl Canyon, Olive, Serrano, Taft, Villa Park Elementary, Cerro Villa, and Villa Park High.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This item has no fiscal impact on the general fund.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education recognize the schools listed above for the Villa Park High School attendance area.

ACTION ITEMS

RESOLUTION NO. 29-06-07: APPOINTING AND EMPLOYING CERTAIN CONSULTANTS IN CONNECTION WITH THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE DISTRICT'S OTHER POST-EMPLOYMENT BENEFITS (OPEB) FUNDING PROGRAM AND APPROVING CERTAIN RELATED ACTIONS

DESCRIPTION:

Representatives from Dolinka Group, Inc. will present an option for funding obligations for Other Post-Employment Benefits. The District has a \$150 million OPEB liability according to an actuarial valuation completed by the Epler Company. The District currently funds the OPEB liability on a pay-as-you-go basis that requires an annual expenditure for retiree health benefits. The pay-as-you-go funding model will require expenditures exceeding \$357 million over the life of the OPEB liability. Annual expenditures to fund this liability are increasing at rates that substantially exceed the rate of growth projected for the General Fund.

The consultants appointed by this resolution will develop a plan specifically to meet the needs of Orange Unified School District. A committee consisting of District level staff and representatives from all employee groups will review all potential funding solutions proposed. A recommendation for funding the District's OPEB liability will be presented to the Board of Education for consideration at a future meeting.

FISCAL IMPACT:

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education adopt Resolution No. 29-06-07 appointing and employing certain consultants in connection with the development of the District's Other Post-Employment Benefits funding program and approving certain related actions.

RESOLUTION NO. 29-06-07

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE ORANGE UNFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT APPOINTING AND EMPLOYING CERTAIN CONSULTANTS IN CONNECTION WITH THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE DISTRICT'S OTHER POST-EMPLOYMENT BENEFITS FUNDING PROGRAM AND APPROVING CERTAIN RELATED ACTIONS

WHEREAS, the Orange Unified School District (the "District") has previously adopted one or more retiree health and welfare benefit plans for its participating employees providing such employees with retiree health benefits and other post-employment benefits (collectively, "OPEB");

WHEREAS, the District desires to develop a comprehensive long-term funding program (the "OPEB Funding Program") to meet certain current and future OPEB obligations, including unfunded liabilities;

WHEREAS, the OPEB Funding Program will involve the development of actuarial assumptions to meet required accounting standards for OPEB obligations, the establishment of a trust for the investment of funds to be used for satisfying OPEB obligations and the development of investment policies and funding methods;

WHEREAS, as part of the OPEB Funding Program, it may be advantages to issue bonds ("OPEB Bonds") to fund the District's OPEB obligations;

WHEREAS, the District desires to proceed with the development of the OPEB Funding Program in order to provide the District with a long-term funding mechanism for OPEB obligations;

WHEREAS, the District desires to appoint and employ certain consultants to assist the District in developing, structuring, implementing and administering the OPEB Funding Program; and

WHEREAS, all acts, conditions and things required by the Constitution and laws of the State of California to exist, to have happened and to have been performed precedent to and in connection with the actions authorized hereby do exist, have happened and have been performed in regular and due time, form and manner as required by law, and the District is now duly authorized and empowered, pursuant to each and every requirement of law, to undertake such actions for the purpose, in the manner and upon the terms herein provided;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Orange Unified School District (the "Board"), as follows:

- **Section 1.** All of the recitals herein contained are true and correct and the Board so finds.
- **Section 2.** Dolinka Group, Inc. is hereby appointed as the District's Financial Consultant in connection with the development and implementation of the OPEB Funding Program. The Superintendent is hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the District, to enter into a contract with such firm for the provision of services as the District's Financial Advisor in connection with the development and implementation of the OPEB Funding Program.
- **Section 3.** California Financial Services is hereby appointed as the District's Program Manager in connection with the development and implementation of the OPEB Funding Program. The Superintendent's is hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the District, to enter into a contract with such firm for the provision of services as the District's Program Manager in connection with the development and implementation of the OPEB Funding Program.
- **Section 4.** Stone & Younberg LLC is hereby appointed as the District's Underwriter for the OPEB Bonds to be issued under the District's OPEB Funding Program. The Superintendent is herby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the District, to enter into a contract with such firm for the provision of services as the District's Underwriter in connection with the development and implementation of the OPEB Funding Program.
- **Section 5.** Orrick, Herrington & Sutcliffe LLP is hereby appointed as Bond Counsel and Disclosure Counsel for the OPEB Bonds to be issued under the District's OPEB Funding Program. The Superintendent is hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the District, to enter into a contract with such firm for the provision of services as Bond Counsel and Disclosure Counsel for the OPEB Bonds to be issued under the District's OPEB Funding Program.
- **Section 6.** Keenan & Associates is hereby appointed as the District's Implementation Advisor to provide the services required for the development and implementation of the OPEB Funding Program and the ongoing administration of the OPEB Funding Program. The Superintendent is hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the District, to enter into a contract with such firm for the provision of services as the District's Implementation Advisor in connection with the development and implementation of the OPEB Funding Program.
- **Section 7.** The Superintendent is hereby authorized and directed, jointly and severally, to do any and all things which they may deem necessary or advisable in order to consummate the transactions herein authorized and otherwise to carry out, give effect to and comply with the terms and intent of this Resolution.
- **Section 8.** All actions heretofore taken by the officers, employees and agents of the District with respect to the OPEB Funding Program are hereby approved, confirmed and ratified.
 - **Section 9.** This resolution shall take effect from and after its date of adoption.

CHARTER RENEWAL PETITION FOR EL RANCHO CHARTER SCHOOL

DESCRIPTION:

El Rancho Charter School has submitted a charter renewal petition that meets the criteria for renewal as outlined in Education Code Section 47607. A charter granted by a school district governing board may be granted one or more subsequent renewals by that entity. Each renewal shall be for a period of five years. A public hearing was held pursuant to Education Code Section 47605(b) on May 24, 2007.

Copies of the charter renewal petition are available to the public in the Business Services Department at the District Office. Copies will also be available at the Board of Education meeting.

A separate Memorandum of Understanding regarding the operation of El Rancho Charter School and a Facilities Use Agreement will be presented for approval at a future Board of Education meeting.

FISCAL IMPACT:

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve El Rancho's charter renewal petition.

FIVE-YEAR DEFERRED MAINTENANCE PLAN

DESCRIPTION:

The State of California annual application for funds for the Deferred Maintenance Program is required to be submitted no later than June 30, 2007. This program addresses the District's facility needs in different areas of concern, i.e., Roofs, heating and air conditioning, fire alarms and intercom, carpet, paint, electrical and plumbing systems, paving and lighting.

The Maintenance Department has developed a five-year plan that identifies the needs of the District. As the identified needs are met and new needs identified, the plan is adjusted/revised and submitted annually.

The State of California currently requires that the Board of Education hold a public hearing to receive input on the District's Deferred Maintenance Plan. The District's plan will be available for public review in the Business Services Office and in the Maintenance Office.

The contribution to this fund is one-half of one percent of statewide average general fund expenditures including transfers out. The amount is budgeted at approximately \$1,256,000 and is anticipated to be matched by the state between 92% and 95% for this year.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Deferred Maintenance Fund (14).....\$2,500,000

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education hold a public hearing to receive input on the District's Deferred Maintenance Plan and approve the Deferred Maintenance Plan as presented.

DESCRIPTION: Purchase orders have been processed in accordance with the

District procedures and computer system controls require that an approved purchase order, pay voucher, current liability, or credit memo exist on the District's computer system prior to the issuance of warrants. There may be a multiple number of warrants drawn against a given purchase order up to the maximum amount for that purchase order. The system restricts the processing of payment amounts in excess of the

issued purchase order.

It should be noted that the purchase order system allows for a one-line description of the services or items to be procured. The issued purchase order forms a contract between the

District and the vendor.

APPROVAL OF AII POINTS PUBLIC FUNDING MULTI YEAR LEASE-PURCHASE FINANCING AGREEMENT FOR COMPUTING SYSTEMS, REPLACEMENT VEHICLES AND EQUIPMENT

DESCRIPTION:

The District has continuous requirements for computing systems and associated items, vehicles and equipment. Using a multi year lease-purchase financing arrangement ensures that school sites and departments have a viable option to purchase current technology, replacement vehicles and replacement equipment in a cost-effective manner.

As in the prior fiscal year, the District will establish a leasepurchase financing arrangement that consolidates several purchase requirements. Financing rates were solicited as follows:

All Points Public Funding 4.22%*
Sun Trust Leasing Corporation: 4.24%
California Capital Leasing Corp. 4.81%
CitiBank/SCMH: 6.6%

All Points Public Funding submitted the lowest finance rate. It is planned to procure the needed items under the five-year lease-purchase plan utilizing volume pricing and quotes from the Districts' vendors.

At the conclusion of the lease, the District would own all of the following items: 1) Computing Systems (laptops, desktops, controllers, servers, printers, digital phones, cabling, etc.) for the Special Education Department valued at approximately \$115,000; 2) Computing Systems for Child Development Services valued at approximately \$125,000; 3) Computing Systems valued at approximately \$38,680 for Villa Park ES: 4) Computing Systems valued at approximately \$16,923 for Jordan ES; 5) Nutrition Services Refrigerated Delivery Truck valued at approximately \$64.950 (replacing 1991 Truck with 208,500 miles, blown engine); 6) Deep Reach Lift valued at approximately \$37,790 for the Warehouse (exchanging 20 year old lift with faulty reverse gear & defective brake); 7) LP Fork-Lift valued at approximately \$22,500 for the Warehouse (exchanging 30 year old forklift, parts unavailable); 8) GMC 3/4 ton pick-up truck valued at approximately \$20,723 for

Due to the varying delivery dates of the items, it may be necessary to add a separate lease schedule(s), or to have funding dispersed through a bank escrow account after the District actually takes possession of a particular item(s). In this way, the District is not paying for an item until it is received. The lease schedule, if needed, would be at the same lease rate factor.

El Modena High School ASB-Santa Barbara, CA-August 15-17, 2007

The El Modena High School ASB leadership team will travel with their advisor to Santa Barbara to participate in the ASB Leadership Camp at UC Santa Barbara. Students will attend leadership skills training as well as receive valuable information from key note speakers. They will work together to plan next year's student activities as well as work on team building skills. The 13 female and 12 male students will be accompanied by one male and one female adult chaperone. Transportation will be provided by Certified Transportation Motor Coach with the cost being reimbursed by ASB funds. Students and adults will be staying at the UCSB dormitories. Students will not miss any school days and no substitute will be required. The cost per student is \$175 and scholarships are available.

<u>El Modena High School Cross Country Team – New York October 11-15, 2007</u>

El Modena High School's Cross Country team will travel under the direction of their coaches to New York City to participate in the Manhattan Cross Country Invitational. The team will race against the premier East Coast cross country teams and gain exposure to Ivy League colleges. Currently, El Modena has cross country runners on scholarship at Columbia, NYU, Penn, Fordham, etc. These former El Modena athletes ran in the 2004 Manhattan Invitational. Students will tour colleges, the city's historic sites, etc. The 28 students, 14 female and 14 male students will be accompanied by four male and four female adult chaperones. Transportation will be provided by American Airlines leaving from LAX. Students and adults will be staying at the Edison Hotel in New York. The cost per student is \$400 per person and scholarships are available. Students will miss three school days and three days substitute will be required for two of the coaches/teachers. TOPIC:

PROGRAM IMPROVEMENT RESTRUCTURING PLAN FOR ESPLANADE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

DESCRIPTION:

Under the requirements of Title I of the Elementary and Secondary Act – Improving The Academic Achievement of the Disadvantaged (No Child Left Behind Legislation), the local education agency must develop a "School Restructuring Plan" for a school receiving Title I funding that has not met its Adequate Yearly Progress goals by the end of the third year after identification.

Over the past three years, Esplanade School has shown significant increases in student achievement on both the California Public Schools Accountability Act Academic Performance Index (API) and the "No Child Left Behind" Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP) indicators, both school wide and for numerically significant subgroups. In spite of this growth, Esplanade did not meet the AYP target for all subgroups in 2005-06 and, therefore, moved into Year 4 – First Year of School Restructuring – Development of a Restructuring Plan.

During the past year, Esplanade, with the technical assistance of the Educational Services division, has analyzed student achievement data, current site instructional practices, and student support systems. This analysis has guided the development of the "Restructuring Plan for Esplanade Elementary School" for the 2007-08 school year. The "Restructuring Plan" addresses specific strategies in the major areas of: restructuring the student intervention and monitoring processes; restructuring the duties of instructional support personnel; expanding targeted staff development in the utilization of data for instructional planning; and increasing the capacity of the parents to support their child's education.

The "Restructuring Plan" will be funded by combining site and centralized categorical funds: Title I, Title I – Reading First, Title III, Economic Impact Aid – Limited English Proficient (EIA-LEP), English Learner Acquisition Program (ELAP) and School and Library Improvement Program (SLIP).

\$260,000 (restricted categorical fund monies)
