A subcommittee of the OUSD Tech Committee has been formed to specifically address the goal of developing business partnerships. - DESCRIPTION: Pursuant to the requirements of California Education Code Section 56365(a) – Non-Public Schools/Agencies (NPS) and Designated Instruction and Services (DIS) – (i.e. speech/language, physical/occupational therapy, orientation mobility training, adaptive physical education) – the Board of Education is authorized to place individuals with exceptional needs in non-public schools/agencies when those pupils cannot be appropriately served within the programs available in the school district.
