DESCRIPTION:

Pacific Bell Telephone Company (dba AT&T California) requests an easement to construct, reconstruct and maintain such underground communication facilities as Grantee may from time to time require, (Exhibits "A" & "B").

The District is authorized to convey an easement to Pacific Bell Telephone Company (dba AT&T California) under *Education Code* Section 17556, et seq. Prior to the conveyance and recording, three steps must be taken per the Code: 1) The Board resolution must declare the intent to grant the easement; 2) The District must conduct a public hearing; and 3) There must be a second Board resolution conveying the easement.

The Board of Education approved the resolution of declaring its intention to convey an easement to the Pacific Bell Telephone Company (dba AT&T California) for the placement of the above listed improvements on the Villa Park High School campus on January 17, 2008. The District has posted, as required by law, a notice of public hearing ten days in advance of this evening's hearing.



DESCRIPTION: Evaluation and disposal of surplus property is identified as a

strategy under the facilities area of the three-year strategic

plan.

Education Code section 17388 and Board Bylaw 9130 provides for the appointment of a District Advisory Committee to advise the Board of Education concerning the use or disposition of surplus real property not needed for school

purposes.

Once the District Advisory Committee is formed and if it makes recommendations regarding each of the identified properties, the Board may either adopt the committee's recommendations or reach different conclusions concerning one or more of the

potential surplus properties.

Several potential surplus properties have been identified for

evaluation by the District Advisory Committee.

FISCAL IMPACT: No fiscal impact

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve

Resolution No. 23-07-08 forming a District Advisory Committee to recommend the use or disposition of surplus real property.

RESOLUTION NO. 23-07-08

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT FORMING A DISTRICT ADVISORY COMMITTEE

WHEREAS, the Orange Unified School District (the "District") owns property that it does not and will not need for school purposes;

WHEREAS, Education Code section 17388 requires that prior to the sale, lease, or rental of any excess real property, the governing board of a school district must appoint a district advisory committee to advise the governing board in the development of district-wide policies and procedures governing the use or disposition of property which is not needed for school purposes;

WHEREAS, Education Code section 17389 requires that the advisory committee consist of not less than seven (7) nor more than eleven (11) members;

WHEREAS, the members of the advisory committee shall be representative of the ethnic, age group, and socioeconomic composition of the District, the business community, land owners and renters, teachers, administrators, parents of students, and persons with expertise in environmental impact, legal contracts, building codes, and land use planning;

WHEREAS, Education Code section 17390 requires the advisory committee to (1) review the projected school enrollment and other data as provided by the District to determine the amount of surplus space and real property, (2) establish a priority list of use of surplus space and real property that will be acceptable to the community, (3) cause to have circulated throughout the attendance area a priority list of surplus space and real property and provide for hearings of community input to the committee on acceptable uses of surplus space and real property, including the sale or lease of surplus real property for child care development purposes, (4) make a final determination of limits of tolerance of use of space and real property; and (5) forward to the District's governing board a report recommending uses of surplus space and real property;

WHEREAS, the District provided information and application forms for appointment to the advisory committee to members of the community within the District's attendance area; and

WHEREAS, after reviewing the applications submitted, the District has selected the individuals to be appointed as members of the advisory committee.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Education of the Orange Unified School District does hereby resolve, determine and order as follows:

- 1. The individuals listed in Exhibit "A" attached hereto and incorporated herein shall form the district advisory committee.
- 2. The advisory committee is hereby authorized and directed to evaluate and determine the best use of the District's current surplus property, consisting of the following properties in the County of Orange:
 - a. Killefer (3) acres of property located on Lemon Street in Orange
 - b. Parkside (10) acres of property located at Yorba Street and Palmyra Avenue in Orange
 - c. Peralta (20) acres of property located at Meats and Canal Street in Orange
 - d. Walnut (9.3) acres of property located adjacent to Santiago Middle School

TOPIC: TEACHER ASSIGNMENT/CONSENT - VARIABLE OR

SHORT-TERM WAIVER

DESCRIPTION: The California Education Code authorizes, under the provision

of Section 44830(a), Variable Term Waivers that have to do with educator preparation and credentialing, and with the ability of employers to employ or assign persons who are not appropriately credentialed for their assignment. Requests for Variable Term Waivers may be submitted by employing agencies to solve a temporary certification or assignment problem, when the employing agency finds there are an insufficient number of certificated persons who meet the

specified employment criteria for a position.

The California Education Code authorizes, under the provision of Section 80122 employing agencies to grant a short-term waiver provided it is issued one time only for any one credentialed teacher and one time only for a given classroom. They are valid for no more than one semester.

The teacher(s) whose name(s) is/are listed on the attached has/have met the requirements, has/have consented to the assignment, and has/have been judged by the site administrator to be competent in the subject matter. Likewise, all other means of credentialing and reassignment have been explored. The passage of this waiver will allow us to remain compliant with SB 435, which requires that all teachers be appropriately assigned.

FISCAL IMPACT: This item has no fiscal impact.

High School Diploma/GED

This laboratory setting is designed to assist the adult student receive a high school diploma or equivalent, including preparation to successfully pass the California High School Exit Exam (CAHSEE) or the GED. Students work at their own pace on required high school courses under the direction of a certificated teacher.

Medical Administration/Assistant

This course provides students with necessary skills and knowledge to perform multi-task functions as a Medical Administrative Assistant in a variety of health care facilities. Instruction content includes medical terminology and abbreviations, basic anatomy and functions, medical ethics, health information management, basics of health insurance and aspects of telephone and appointment protocol. Essential employability skills include personal interpersonal skills, plus development career and Students will learn Medisoft, a employment literacy. computerized medical software program, and will perfect data entry skills.

FISCAL IMPACT: Receipt of restricted categorical funds in the amount of

\$46,345.66 in income (\$2,645.30 ADA x 17.52 ADA).
