SUPPLEMENTARY RETIREMENT PLAN

DESCRIPTION:

The 2008 Supplementary Retirement Plan (SRP) provides an enhanced retirement benefit for those employees who elect to participate in the SRP by retiring from District service. The basic benefit provided is a monthly cash payment for the employee's lifetime only, and is derived from the employee's 2007-2008 contract salary multiplied by the employee's FTE with contributions from the District totaling 80% of the final annual pay. The payment is secured by the District making non-elective employer contributions into each participant's 403(b) annuity contract which is held at the Pacific Life Insurance Company. Actuarially equivalent benefits with distribution options other than life are also available to participating employees.

An additional one-week window of opportunity to opt-in only (not to opt-out for employees who have already signed up for the SRP) will be offered to eligible employees who have not signed up for the SRP. This opt-in only window will be from Friday, May 9, through Friday May 16, 2008. Those eligible will be receiving more information regarding this opportunity.

No employee will be eligible to participate in the 2008 Supplemental Retirement Plan unless:

- 1. The employee was employed with the District as of February 21, 2008, and;
- Has initiated the retirement process in accordance with the PARS Supplemental Retirement Plan by the specified due date(s) and;
- 3. Will retire from District service on June 30, 2008, or:
- 4. Has received an exception to be included in the 2008 Supplemental Retirement Program with a different specified retirement date during the 2008 calendar year as authorized by the District's Plan Administrator.

The SRP is implemented by Public Agency Retirement Services (PARS), a fee-for—service company based in Orange County which does not receive commissions, overwrites, front-end or back-end loads from any investment or investment product related to the SRP program. The Assistant Superintendent of Business Services will serve as the District's Plan Administrator for the SRP.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Savings to the District range from approximately \$2,260,000 in year one to an approximate accumulated savings of \$10,320,000 by the end of the fifth year. These estimated savings include the full replacement of all participating teachers and the non-replacement of selected non-teaching positions. Additional savings would be realized when the SRP is coupled with other adjustments to staffing.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the attached Board Resolution and the PARS Supplementary Retirement Plan, a retirement incentive supplementing PERS/STRS for eligible participating employees.

- 1. The Governing Board of Trustees of the District hereby adopts the PARS Supplementary Retirement Plan, as part of the District Retirement Program, effective May 8, 2008; and
- 2. The Board of Trustees of the District hereby appoints the Assistant Superintendent, Business Services, Jon Archibald, or his/her successor or his/her designee as the District's Plan Administrator; and
- 3. The District's PARS Plan Administrator is hereby authorized to execute the contracts, custodial agreements, and other legal documents related to the Plan on behalf of the District and to take whatever additional actions are necessary to maintain the District's participation in the plan and to maintain compliance of any relevant regulation issued.

The District utilizes the professional services of Health & Welfare Insurance Brokerage and Consulting Service firms in order to obtain insurance benefits for the employees and retirees of the District on a cost-effective basis.

REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS

On Wednesday April 2, 2008, the Board of Education accepted proposals in response to a Request for Proposal (RFP) for Health & Welfare Insurance Brokerage and Consulting Services. In accordance with standard procedures, the District issued the RFP, for an initial one-year term followed by two one-year options, to health and welfare insurance brokerage and insurance firms and posted it on the District website.

The RFP specified that proposals would be evaluated and scored utilizing evaluation criteria generally consisting of:

FIRM SELECTION

In response to the RFP, eight firms submitted proposals. School Services of California, Inc. assisted with the initial screening of the proposals and recommended three firms to be interviewed by the District Evaluation Committee. Pursuant to the RFP evaluation criteria, the District Evaluation Committee interviewed and evaluated the three firms. Firm references were contacted. On the basis of all of the information, the Committee selected Keenan & Associates. BenefitBridge, a web-based technology solution for employee benefits administration, eligibility, enrollment, billing, reporting, and employee communications is included as part of the Keenan proposal at no additional charge.

CLASSIFIED POSITION ELIMINATIONS

DESCRIPTION:

As the result of the categorical budget planning process for the 2008-09 school year, certain categorically funded classified positions have been identified for elimination. Education Code sections 45114, and 45117, Board Policy 4317.3, and Article 14 of the OUSD/CSEA Collective Bargaining Agreement stipulate the provisions and timelines for layoff due to lack of work/lack of funds. Under the Education Code, affected employees shall be given notice of layoff not less than 45 days prior to the effective date of the layoff.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The positions involved in this action are categorically funded; therefore, there is no direct fiscal impact to the general fund.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that due to lack of work/lack of funds the Board of Education approve the elimination of the following positions and authorize the Superintendent or designee to give notice of layoff to the affected employees effective 45 days following notification.
