Board Meetings

Regular Board meetings are typically scheduled the second and fourth Thursday of each month at 7:30 p.m. at the Orange Unified School District Education Center, 1401 North Handy Street, Building H. The purpose of the Board meeting is to conduct business. This is done in **Open Session**. Matters dealing with students and employees are reserved for **Closed Session** to provide confidentiality as required by law. Other Closed Session topics include: pending litigation, property negotiations and collective bargaining issues with employee associations.

Special Board Meetings

Meeting notices for **special meetings** are posted 24 hours in advance of the meeting and shall indicate the business to be transacted at the meeting. No other business shall be considered at the special meeting. The public will be provided an opportunity to address the item described in the notice.

Emergency Board Meetings

When the Board determines that an emergency situation exists, it may call an **emergency meeting**. The Board may hold an emergency meeting without complying with the 24-hour notice or 24-hour posting requirement for special meetings pursuant to Government Code 54956. The Board shall comply with all other requirements for special meeting during an emergency meeting.

Agendas contain a brief description of each item to be discussed or transacted at the meeting. Copies of the agenda are available in the Superintendent's Office, Building B, at the District Education Center or on the web site at www.orangeusd.k12.ca.us/board/calendar.asp.

Consent Items are routine in nature and generally require no discussion. These items are acted upon by one motion; however, any such item may be considered separately at a Board member's request. Action Items are acted upon separately. Board members may ask questions or request that staff make a presentation before voting on an item. Information/ Discussion Items do not require action by the Board. The Board may take action only on those items listed in the printed agenda, except for emergencies.

Any member of the public may request that a matter within the jurisdiction of the Board be placed on the agenda of a regular meeting. The request must be in writing and submitted to the Superintendent at least ten working days before the scheduled meeting date.

Addressing the Board

Persons wishing to address the Board are requested to fill out a "Public Comment" **blue card** available at the meeting on the information table. The "Public Comment" card should be submitted to the Superintendent or the Board Clerk prior to the start of open session.

Speakers are limited to three (3) minutes per speaker with a maximum of twenty (20) minutes per topic. With Board consent, the Board President may modify the time allowed for public presentation. **Power Point and computer presentations are <u>not</u> allowed.** A speaker may not relinquish his/her time to another. When addressing the Board, speakers are requested to state their name for the record and address the Board from the podium. If the topic has been previously addressed, it is requested that the speaker's remarks be limited to **new points only**.

Speakers will be called upon at the appropriate time during the meeting. Agenda items may be addressed during the Board's consideration of the item. Items **not on the agenda** that are within the Board's subject matter jurisdiction may be addressed during the "Public Comment" section. Items not on the agenda may not be acted on or discussed by the Board, but will be researched and responded to in any one of the following ways: 1) by telephone after research; 2) by mail after research; or 3) at a subsequent Board meeting as an agenda item.

No boisterous conduct shall be permitted at any Board meeting. Persistent boisterous conduct shall be grounds for summary termination by the Board President of that person's privilege of address.

"Any person who willfully disturbs any public school or any public school meeting is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500). "(CEC § 32210)

Complaints against employees will normally be heard in Closed Session. The District's complaint procedure should be followed before discussion with the Board.

Requests for Information

Requests for information shall be made in writing and submitted to the Superintendent's Office. There is a nominal charge of \$.10 per page for copies of public records.

DESCRIPTION: Certificates of Participation executed in 2003 have been used to finance modernization of several Orange Unified School District facilities. The District uses revenue received from Redevelopment Agencies to finance interest and principal payments related to the Certificates of Participation.

> Projected growth in future Redevelopment Agency payments will allow the District to refinance 2003 Certificates of Participation and obtain additional financing to continue modernization of school sites. It's anticipated that approximately ten percent of projected facility needs will be met using Certificated of Participation financed by revenues from Redevelopment Agencies.

> A proposal to refinance 2003 Certificates of Participation and issue additional Certificates of Participation will be brought to the Board of Education for consideration tentatively on August 21, 2008. Designating and appointing the team to evaluate and facilitate this financing will be accomplished with this resolution.

FISCAL IMPACT: This report has no fiscal impact.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education adopt Resolution No. 03-08-09 designating and appointing the Underwriter, Bond Counsel and Disclosure Counsel to fulfill responsibilities and perform duties in connection with proposed Certificates of Participation to refinance 2003 Certificates of Participation and finance additional school facilities.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Orange Unified School District as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. The above recitals are true and correct.

Section 2. Designation of Underwriter, Bond Counsel and Disclosure Counsel. The firms appointed to assume the responsibilities and perform the following duties with respect to the proposed Certificates of Participation shall be Stone & Youngberg LLC, as Underwriter, McFarlin & Anderson LLP, as Bond Counsel, and Orrick, Herrington & Sutcliffe LLP, as Disclosure Counsel. The Superintendent, the Assistant Superintendent, Business Services, each acting singly, are each authorized to execute the investment banking agreement and fee agreements for services in connection with the proposed Certificates of Participation.

Section 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

TOPIC: FINAL REPORT – ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOL DISTRICT ADVISORY COMMITTEE TO RECOMMEND THE USE OR DISPOSITION OF SURPLUS REAL PROPERTY (7-11 COMMITTEE)

DESCRIPTION: Evaluation and disposal of surplus property is identified as a strategy under the facilities area of the three-year strategic plan. Education Code section 17388 provides for the appointment of a District Advisory Committee to advise the Board of Education concerning the use or disposition of surplus real property not needed for school purposes.

A District Advisory Committee to recommend the use or disposition of surplus real property was formed by the Board of Education on February 7, 2008. The Committee met several times over a four-month period and held a public hearing to receive input on potential surplus properties being considered.

The Committee reviewed and evaluated student enrollment projections, the City of Orange general plan/zoning related to each property, reviewed the Final Report (July 2004) by the Facilities Advisory Committee, and evaluated school site capacity and alternatives for future school facilities.

Recommendations included in a final report considered community input and review and evaluation of related data. The Board may either adopt the Committee's recommendations or reach different conclusions concerning one or more of the potential surplus properties.

The Final Report of the District Advisory Committee is available for public inspection in the Office of the Superintendent and Business Services Office at the District Office of the Orange Unified School District. The Final Report has been sent to the Board of Education under separate cover.

FISCAL IMPACT: No fiscal impact

RECOMMENDATION: The Final Report of the District Advisory Committee is presented for information only and does not require Board action.

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TOPIC: TEACHER ASSIGNMENT/CONSENT - VARIABLE OR SHORT-TERM WAIVER

DESCRIPTION: The California Education Code authorizes, under the provision of Section 44830(a), Variable Term Waivers that have to do with educator preparation and credentialing, and with the ability of employers to employ or assign persons who are not appropriately credentialed for their assignment. Requests for Variable Term Waivers may be submitted by employing agencies to solve a temporary certification or assignment problem, when the employing agency finds there are an insufficient number of certificated persons who meet the specified employment criteria for a position.

> The California Education Code authorizes, under the provision of Section 80122 employing agencies to grant a short-term waiver provided it is issued one time only for any one credentialed teacher and one time only for a given classroom. They are valid for no more than one semester.

> The teacher(s) whose name(s) is/are listed on the attached has/have met the requirements, has/have consented to the assignment, and has/have been judged by the site administrator to be competent in the subject matter. Likewise, all other means of credentialing and reassignment have been explored. The passage of this waiver will allow us to remain compliant with SB 435, which requires that all teachers be appropriately assigned.

FISCAL IMPACT: This item has no fiscal impact.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the variable term waiver as presented.

TOPIC:	STUDENT TEACHING AGREEMENT- CALIFORNIA STATE
	UNIVERSITY, FULLERTON (CalState TEACH)

DESCRIPTION: CalState TEACH is a non-traditional program that offers both a student teaching and an intern program for qualified candidates interested in earning their credential through the California State University system via a non-traditional curricular approach. California State University, Fullerton provides support for CalState TEACH program participants in the Orange Unified School District.

CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, FULLERTON STUDENT TEACHING AGREEMENT FOR THE CAL STATE TEACH PROGRAM

THIS AGREEMENT entered into by and between the State of California acting through the Trustees of the California State University on behalf of California State University, Fullerton, 2600 East Nutwood Avenue, Suite 300, Fullerton, CA 92831, hereinafter called "University", and *Orange Unified School District*, hereinafter called the "District".

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the District is authorized to enter into agreements with the University to provide teaching experience through practice teaching to students enrolled in teacher training curricula of the University; and

NOW, THEREFORE, it is mutually agreed between the University and the District as follows:

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

The **SERVICES** to be provided by District to University shall not exceed <u>10</u> semester units of practice teaching per semester.

TERM OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall remain in full force and effect for a term of five years beginning on September 1, 2008 through August 31, 2013. However, either party may cancel this Agreement upon thirty (30) days prior written notice.

Performance under this Agreement shall be reviewed annually by both parties and at the time of the annual review the parties may mutually agree to additional one year extensions of the Agreement.

GENERAL TERMS

1. The District shall provide teaching experience to University students, through practice teaching in schools and classes of the District not to exceed the units of practice set forth in the Special Provisions. Such practice teaching shall be provided in such schools or classes of the District, and under the direct supervision and instruction of certified Teachers of the District as the District and University, through their duly authorized representatives, may agree upon.

The District may, at its sole discretion, refuse to accept any student of the University assigned to practice teaching in the District. Upon request of the District, at its sole discretion, the University shall terminate the assignment of any student of the University to practice teaching in the District.

"Practice Teaching" is used herein and elsewhere in this agreement means active participation in the duties and functions of classrooms teaching under the direct supervision instruction of employees of the District holding valid professional diplomas issued by the State Board of Education, other than emergency or provisional credentials, authorizing them to serve as classroom teachers in the schools or classes in which the practice teaching is provided.

2. An assignment of a student of the University to practice teaching in schools or classes of the Districts shall be at the discretion of the University, for approximately sixteen (16) weeks, but a student may be given more than one (1) assignment by the University to practice teaching in such schools or classes.

The assignment of a student of the University to practice teaching in the District shall be deemed to be effective for purposes of this agreement as of the date the student presents to the proper authorities of the District the assignment card or other document given the student by the University effecting such assignment, but not earlier than the date of such assignment as shown on such card or other document.

Absences of a student from assigned practice teaching shall not be counted as absences in computing the quarter units of practice teaching provided the student by the District.

INSURANCE

- 1. The University and District shall secure and maintain at all times during the Term, at their respective sole expense, professional general liability insurance covering themselves and their respective employees.
 - A. Such coverage provided by the University and District may be afforded via commercial insurance, self-insurance, a captive, or some combination thereof at limits of at least \$1,000,000 per occurrence. Such insurance shall not be cancelable except upon 30 days' prior written notice to the other party. Such coverage shall be primary and non-contributory. Upon either party's request, the other party shall provide a certificate of insurance evidencing such coverage.
 - B. Comprehensive or Commercial Form General Liability Insurance (contractual liability included) with limits as follows:
 - 1) Each Occurrence \$1,000,000
 - 2) General Aggregate \$3,000,000
 - C. The University and District shall each secure and maintain at all times during the Term of the contract, at their respective sole expense, workers' compensation and employers' liability insurance covering their respective employee. Such coverage provided by The University and District may be afforded via commercial insurance or self-insurance.
 - D. Business Liability Insurance for owned, scheduled, non-owned or hired automobiles with a combined single limit no less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) per occurrence.
 - E. The District shall not be responsible for worker's compensation insurance for student teachers.

The University and District shall further provide for thirty (30) day advance written notice of any modification, change or cancellation of any of the above insurance coverages.

The foregoing insurance limits and /or requirements as referred to under Section (B) above shall be subject to changes in, or modifications or, coverage, forms, and/or limits as mandated from time to time by insurance

programs of the parties. When such changes or modifications are mandates, the parties shall agree to renegotiate requirements for insurance coverage, forms and/or limits within thirty (30) days from receipt of notification by either party of such change. The period for renegotiation shall be thirty (30) days. New contract terms regarding coverage, forms, and/or limits shall be mutually agreed upon by the parties and shall be evidenced by a written addendum to this Agreement within the period for renegotiation. If the parties are unable to renegotiate said coverage, forms, and/or limits, this Agreement shall automatically terminate at the end of the thirty (30) day period following renegotiation unless the parties mutually agree to extend the period for renegotiation and additional thirty (30) days.

2. The University shall self-insure its activities in connection with this Agreement by maintaining programs of self-insurance as follows:

The State of California has elected to be self-insured for its general liability, vehicle liability, worker's compensation and property exposures through an annual appropriation from the General Fund. As a State agency, the California State University, Office of the Chancellor, the Trustees, and its system of campuses are included in this self-insurance program. Under this form of insurance, the State and its employees (as defined in Section 810.2 of the Government Code) are insured for any tort liability that may develop through carrying out official activities, including state official operations or under an official contract or license agreement, they should be referred to the State Board of Control, State of California, Tort Liability Section, 1515 K Street, Sacramento, CA 95814. Any claims regarding property are to be referred to the California State University, Risk Manager, 400 Golden Shore, Suite 210, Long Beach, CA 90802.

TIME

Time is of the essence of the Agreement

GOVERNING LAW

This Agreement will be governed by the laws of the State of California and shall in all respects be interpreted, enforced and governed by California laws.

INDEMNIFICATION

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 895.4 of the California Government Code, each party agrees to indemnify and hold the other party harmless from all liability for damage to persons or property arising out of, or resulting from, negligent acts or omissions of the indemnifying party.

FINGERPRINTING/BACKGROUND CHECKS

In accordance with California Education Code Section 44320 (b), each credential candidate prior to assignment to District must obtain at their sole expense a "Certificate of Clearance," which includes a complete Live Scan Service. The University will ensure that student's receive a Certificate prior to beginning their assignment in the District.

DESCRIPTION:

Villa Park High School – Varsity Cheer and Song – Los Angeles, CA – August 7 – 10, 2008

Villa Park High School Varsity Cheer and Song under the direction of Coach Kerry Santos, will travel to Los Angeles to participate in the United Cheer and Dance Association Cheer/Song Camp. The students will have the opportunity to learn new crowd leading chants, stunt techniques, dance routines and participate in team building activities. The fifteen female students will be accompanied by two female adult chaperones. Transportation will be provided by parents and any parent driving a student other than their own will have an OUSD approved driver permit on file prior to this trip. The students will be staying at the University of California dormitories. The cost per student is \$342 and scholarships are available. The students will not miss school, and no substitute will be required.

<u>El Modena High School – Varsity Football Team – Angeles Oaks,</u> <u>CA – August 8 – 10, 2008</u>

The El Modena High School Varsity Football Team under the direction of Coach Greg Olquin, will travel to Angeles Oaks to participate in a team building retreat. The purpose of this trip is to bring the team together, form bonds with players and coaches, and work on leadership skills and teamwork. The sixty male student/athletes will be accompanied by ten male adult chaperones. The student/athletes and chaperones will stay at the Alpine Meadows Camp & Retreat Center and travel by Silver State coach. The cost per student is \$200 and scholarships are available. The students will not miss school, and no substitute will be required.

<u>Villa Park High School – Associated Student Body Board – Santa</u> Barbara, CA – August 12 – 15, 2008

Villa Park High School's ASB under the direction of advisor Ophny Escalante, will travel to Santa Barbara to participate in the Orange County Leadership Camp. Students prepare and plan for the upcoming year, attend workshops specific to their cabinet position, and attend leadership seminars. The twenty male and ten female students will be accompanied by one female and one male adult chaperone. The students will travel by district bus and be housed at the University of California at Santa Barbara in the dormitory. The cost per student is \$240 and scholarships are available. The students will not miss school, and no substitute will be required. <u>Villa Park High School – Pep Squad – Los Angeles, CA – August</u> <u>17 – 20, 2008</u>

Villa Park High School Pep Squad under the direction of Coach Kimberly Henderson, will travel to Los Angeles to participate in the National Cheer Association Cheer Camp at the University of California at Los Angeles. Students will prepare for the upcoming years. Girls will learn to work as a team, set goals for the year, improve cheer technique, and learn routines that will be used throughout the year. The thirty-five female students will be accompanied by two female adult chaperones. The students will travel by district bus and the cost will be reimbursed through the booster club. The students will be housed at the UCLA dormitories. The cost per student is \$328 and scholarships are available. The students will not miss school and no substitute will be required.

<u>McPherson Magnet School – Eighth Grade Class – Toyon Bay,</u> <u>Catalina, CA – September 12 – 14, 2008</u>

The McPherson Magnet School eighth grade students under the direction of teacher Lynne Palucki, will travel to Catalina Island Marine Institute (CIMI) in Toyon Bay. The students will gain an understanding of marine life, algae, animal classification, ecosystems as well as the history of Catalina. The hands-on interactive program also emphasizes teamwork and cooperation. The forty male and thirty-five female students will be accompanied by two male and three female adult chaperones in addition to site provided chaperones. The students will travel by district bus to Pierpoint Landing in Long Beach for departure on Catalina Classic Cruises and they will stay overnight at the CIMI. The cost per student is \$295 and scholarships are available. The students will miss one school day and a substitute will be required for four teacher/chaperones. The cost of the bus and the substitute will be reimbursed through the ASB.

Villa Park High School – Girl's Volleyball Team – San Luis Obispo, CA – September 12 – 13, 2008

Villa Park High School Girls Volleyball Team under the direction of Coach Andrew Wetzler, will travel to San Luis Obispo to participate in the San Luis Obispo High School Varsity Girls Volleyball Tournament. This tournament will give the student/athletes the opportunity to play in one of the top tournaments in the country. The sixteen female athletes will be accompanied by one male and three female adult chaperones. The students will travel by chartered certified bus arranged through OUSD and will be staying at the Best Western Royal Oak in San Luis Obispo. The cost of the trip including the transportation is funded by the Volleyball Boosters. The students will miss one day of school and no substitute will be required. <u>El Modena High School Cross Country Team – San Francisco, CA</u> – September 19 – 22, 2008

El Modena High School Cross Country Team under the direction of Coaches John Ahern and Tom Weber will travel to San Francisco to participate in the Lowell Cross Country Invitational. The team members will compete against other top athletes from Northern and Central California. The fourteen female and fourteen male student/athletes will be accompanied by three male and three female adult chaperones. The group will be staying at the Burlingame Embassy Suites. Transportation will be provided by parents and any parent driving a student other than their own will have an OUSD approved driver certificate on file prior to this trip. The students will miss one school day and a one day substitute will be required for each of the two coaches. The cost will be reimbursed by the cross country boosters. The total cost per student is \$35 and scholarships are available.

Villa Park High School Cross Country Team – San Francisco, CA – September 19 – 21, 2008

Villa Park High School Cross Country team under the direction of Coach David White will travel to San Francisco to participate in the Lowell Cross Country Invitational. The student/athletes will gain experience competing against schools from Northern and Central California which will serve as preparation for the state cross country meet in November. The eighteen female and fifteen male students will be accompanied by five female and five male adult chaperones. The group will be staying at Embassy Suites in San Francisco and transportation will be provided by Certified Charter through the OUSD. The cost per student is \$175 and scholarships are available. The students will miss one school day and a substitute will be required. The cost of the sub will be reimbursed from cross country booster funds.

Canyon High School - Girls' Volleyball Team – Big Bear, CA – August 22 – 24, 2008

Canyon High School Girls' Volleyball Team under the direction of Coach Rebekah Anderson will travel to Big Bear to participate in a team building weekend. Student/athletes will engage in a variety of team building and trust exercises designed to promote a team atmosphere. The sixteen female/athletes will be accompanied by one male and three female adult chaperones. The group will be staying at a cabin in Big Bear. The cost per student is \$60 and scholarships are available. The students will not miss any school days and no substitute will be required.

FISCAL IMPACT: Receipt of restricted categorical fund monies and unrestricted donated funds.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the study trips as presented.

TOPIC: FOURTH QUARTER REPORT OF UNIFORM COMPLAINTS FOR THE WILLIAMS AND VALENZUELA CASE SETTLEMENTS

DESCRIPTION: As a result of the State of California's settlement of the Williams and Valenzuela class action lawsuits, Education Code section 35186 requires school districts to do two things: 1) provide an opportunity to file formal complaints under the District's Uniform Complaint Procedures; and 2) report to the Board of Education and the public four times a year the number of complaints filed and the area of the settlement they target.

The Fourth Quarter Report covers the number of Uniform Complaints received by the District under the four areas governed by the Williams and Valenzuela Case Settlements for the period of April – June 2008. The four targeted areas are:

- 1. Sufficient Instructional Materials
- 2. Emergency or urgent facilities conditions that pose a threat to the health and safety of pupils or staff
- 3. Teacher vacancy and mis-assignment
- 4. Pupils, including English Learners, who have not passed one or both parts of the high school exit examination by the end of the 12th grade are entitled to receive intensive instruction and services for up to two consecutive academic years after completion of the 12th grade, or until the pupil has passed both parts of the examination, whichever comes first.

No Uniform Complaints for any area have been reported during the fourth quarter for the Williams and Valenzuela Case Settlements.

- FISCAL IMPACT: This item has no fiscal impact.
- RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education receive the Report of Uniform Complaints as mandated by the Williams and Valenzuela Case Settlements.

TOPIC: COURSE APPROVAL: INTRODUCTION TO VIDEO GAME DESIGN

DESCRIPTION: The new course outline described below has been reviewed by the District's Curriculum Council and is recommended for approval.

NEW COURSE

Introduction to Video Game Design is a comprehensive, self-contained, fully-computer integrated one-year course, which utilizes project-base learning to develop 2D and 3D PC, web, mobile device (i.e., cell phone), and DDR (Interactive Dance, Dance Revolution) games. In addition, students will be introduced to artificial intelligence with robotics. Students will further develop their practical programming skills introduced in the Fundamentals of Programming course, such as command-driven and object-oriented programming with logical data structures, sequences, Boolean logic, loops, lists, arrays, functions, methods, and graphics. The class will provide a solid foundation of programming skills, which will carry over onto future science courses.

This career technical education course supports the California Business Education Career Path and Model Curriculum Standards for the Information Technology Industry sector, Programming and Systems Development Pathway.

FISCAL IMPACT: This item has no fiscal impact on the general fund.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the above-described courses presented by the District's Curriculum Council.

TOPIC: TEXTBOOK ADOPTIONS – FINAL

- DESCRIPTION: The attached list of textbooks has been available for review for the thirty days required by the Education Code.
- FISCAL IMPACT: Textbooks will be purchased from the textbook accounts during the 2008-09 school year. Auxiliary adoption texts are used to supplement the basic textbook and are purchased with funds other than the state textbook monies.

TOPIC:	SCHOOL READINESS NURSE EXPANSION PROGRAM: NEW CONTRACT WITH THE CHILDREN AND FAMILIES COMMISSION OF ORANGE COUNTY TO PROVIDE GRANT FUNDING
DESCRIPTION:	The School Readiness Nurse Expansion Coordinator is requesting approval to accept a grant from the Children and Families Commission of Orange County to continue the District's School Readiness Nurse Expansion Program for the next three-year funding cycle (July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2011). Grant funding will provide children 0-5 years of age and their families with child health screenings and parent health education classes conducted by two School Readiness nurses.
FISCAL IMPACT:	Receipt of restricted categorical grant funds totaling \$204,000 each year, over a period of three years, for a grand total of \$612,000. 01-00-9206-0-8677-0001-3140-206-207-000

TOPIC:	MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE ORANGE COUNTY SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS AND THE ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT FOR 2008-2009
DESCRIPTION:	Pursuant to the authority established in Education Code Sections 56195, 56195.1, 56195.3 and 56195.5, the Orange County Department of Education may provide for the education of individual pupils in special education programs who reside in other districts or counties. The District has entered into previous agreements with the OCSS/OCDE for the District to provide special education services.
	The proposed agreement is substantially similar to existing agreements and staff recommends this arrangement. The proposed Memoranda of Understanding will provide District SELPA participation in the Special Schools Program within the Orange County Department of Education as deemed necessary for special education students during the 2008-09 school year.
	The estimated billing for 2008-09 will be based upon actual information for 2007-08 plus COLA as set forth in the most current state budget, plus any budgeting projections for step and column, and salary and benefit increases.
