Mission Statement

Board Meetings

Regular Board meetings are typically scheduled the second and fourth Thursday of each month at 7:30 p.m. at the Orange Unified School District Education Center, 1401 North Handy Street, Building H. The purpose of the Board meeting is to conduct business. This is done in **Open Session**. Matters dealing with students and employees are reserved for **Closed Session** to provide confidentiality as required by law. Other Closed Session topics include: pending litigation, property negotiations and collective bargaining issues with employee associations.

Special Board Meetings

Meeting notices for **special meetings** are posted 24 hours in advance of the meeting and shall indicate the business to be transacted at the meeting. No other business shall be considered at the special meeting. The public will be provided an opportunity to address the item described in the notice.

Emergency Board Meetings

When the Board determines that an emergency situation exists, it may call an **emergency meeting**. The Board may hold an emergency meeting without complying with the 24-hour notice or 24-hour posting requirement for special meetings pursuant to Government Code 54956. The Board shall comply with all other requirements for a special meeting during an emergency meeting.

Agendas

Agendas contain a brief description of each item to be discussed or transacted at the meeting. Copies of the agenda are available in the Superintendent's Office, Building B, at the District Education Center or on the web site at www.orangeusd.k12.ca.us/board/calendar.asp.

Consent Items are routine in nature and generally require no discussion. These items are acted upon by one motion; however, any such item may be considered separately at a Board member's request. **Action Items** are acted upon separately. Board members may ask questions or request that staff make a presentation before voting on an item. **Information/ Discussion Items** do not require action by the Board. The Board may take action only on those items listed in the printed agenda, except for emergencies.

Any member of the public may request that a matter within the jurisdiction of the Board be placed on the agenda of a regular meeting. The request must be in writing and submitted to the Superintendent at least ten working days before the scheduled meeting date.

Addressing the Board

Persons wishing to address the Board are requested to fill out a "Public Comment" **blue card** available at the meeting on the information table. The "Public Comment" card should be submitted to the Superintendent or the Board Clerk prior to the start of open session.

Speakers are limited to three (3) minutes per speaker with a maximum of twenty (20) minutes per topic. With Board consent, the Board President may modify the time allowed for public presentation. **Power Point and computer presentations are not allowed.** A speaker may not relinquish his/her time to another. When addressing the Board, speakers are requested to state their name for the record and address the Board from the podium. If the topic has been previously addressed, it is requested that the speaker's remarks be limited to **new points only**.

Speakers will be called upon at the appropriate time during the meeting. Agenda items may be addressed during the Board's consideration of the item. Items **not on the agenda** that are within the Board's subject matter jurisdiction may be addressed during the "Public Comment" section. Items not on the agenda may not be acted on or discussed by the Board, but will be researched and responded to in any one of the following ways: 1) by telephone after research; 2) by mail after research; or 3) at a subsequent Board meeting as an agenda item.

No boisterous conduct shall be permitted at any Board meeting. Persistent boisterous conduct shall be grounds for summary termination by the Board President of that person's privilege of address.

"Any person who willfully disturbs any public school or any public school meeting is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500)." (CEC § 32210)

Complaints against employees will normally be heard in Closed Session. The District's complaint procedure should be followed before discussion with the Board.

Requests for Information

Requests for information shall be made in writing and submitted to the Superintendent's Office. There is a nominal charge of \$.10 per page for copies of public records.

The Orange County Sanitation District has sent invoices to school districts for capital facilities fees. DESCRIPTION: The Orange Unified School District has determined that Capital Project Fund 49 and Debt Service Fund 52 for Blended Component Units are required for reporting purposes.

The Capital Project Fund 49 is used to account for capital projects financed by Mello-Roos Community Facilities Districts and similar entities that are considered blended component units of the District under Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP).

The Debt Service Fund 52 is used to account for the accumulation of resources for the payment of principal and interest on bonds issued by Mello-Roos Community Facilities Districts and similar entities that are considered blended component units of the District under GAAP.

FISCAL IMPACT: The establishment of these funds has no fiscal impact.

TOPIC: 2008-2009 NATIONAL BOARD FOR PROFESSIONAL TEACHING STANDARDS CERTIFICATION

DESCRIPTION: The National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS) is a nonprofit, nonpartisan, and nongovernmental agency governed by a 63-member board of directors, the majority of whom are classroom teachers, which focuses on development of professional standards for early childhood, elementary, and secondary school teaching. National Board certification recognizes experienced teachers for the quality of their practice and signifies that a teacher is accomplished and has met challenging professional teaching standards evidenced by rigorous performance-based assessments.

The California Department of Education (CDE) administers the federally funded Candidate Subsidy Program (CSP) for NBPTS candidates. Fee subsidies for up to 50 percent of the application fee are awarded to first-time candidates at the time the applications are received, depending upon the availability of funds.

Since the inception of the NBPTS certification program, the Orange Unified School District has provided an additional amount of \$1,000 each for NBPTS candidates who teach in Orange Unified, up to a maximum of ten applicants per year.

In order to participate, teachers must be recommended by their principal and are required to submit an application. A maximum of ten Orange Unified teachers would be selected for participation. Should more than ten individuals make application, a random selection process would be implemented to determine participation.

The program provides a California State Standard's compliant assessment for each student and utilizes personalization with one-to-one instruction. The BrainX CAHSEE online tutorials utilize lessons, work assignments, study sessions and quizzes to prepare students for the CAHSEE. Teachers will receive a 90-minute in-service training. The BrainX Teacher Dashboard provides access to individual or cumulative reports on student progress, time on task, and other information by identifying skill gaps and targeting instruction. Every student who completes the course work created for them by their personal digital tutor will pass CAHSEE or BrainX will refund the license fee for that student.

The students will miss one day of school and a substitute will be required.

TOPIC: **RESOLUTION FOR THE ACCEPTANCE OF FUNDS FOR CHILD DEVELOPMENT CENTER, CHILD CARE, AND LATCHKEY PROGRAM**

DESCRIPTION: The Child Development Services department has received notification from the California Department of Education, Child Development Division, that the child development funding for the 2008-09 school year will be \$1,053,264. Funds are provided from grants awarded to the District for low-income families. Funding for child care and development is available to students at 24 of the elementary schools and the Child Development Center located at Parkside. There are approximately 170 school-age students funded by the Latchkey grant in the School Age Care programs, and 100 pre-school children funded through the General Child Care grant.

Section 8263(b) of the Education Code establishes admission priority for services. First priority is given to children who are recipients of Child Protective Services. Second priority is given to all income eligible families.

FISCAL IMPACT: \$1,053,264

TOPIC:	MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AND TALLER SAN JOSE FOR 2008-2010
DESCRIPTION:	<p>The District, through Central County Regional Occupational Program (CCROP) is a long-time partner with Taller San Jose. Currently, the Regional Occupational Program (ROP) provides a part-time instructor for the newly launched Medical Careers Academy. Prior to this, CCROP, through the District and Taller San Jose, (Community Based Organization) offered a Convalescent Nurse Assistant course for eleven years.</p> <p>Taller San Jose is a recipient of a grant from the <i>Santa Ana Workforce Investment Board/Youth Council - Youth Program Operators</i>. The grant requires Taller San Jose to have Memorandums of Understanding with its partners.</p> <p>The classes are composed entirely of adults. The MOU reflects both ROP and Adult Education, in the event that the program needs to be transferred to Adult Education in order to serve high school ROP students.</p> <p>All costs associated with the MOU will be covered by the appropriate categorical program (ROP or Adult Education).</p>
FISCAL IMPACT:	Receipt of up to \$200,000 revenue generated from average daily attendance (ADA), based on enrollment and attendance in the ROP or Adult Education Program, over the next two-year period.
RECOMMENDATION:	It is recommended that the Board of Education authorize the Superintendent or designee to enter into the Memorandum of Understanding with Taller San Jose.

TOPIC:	ORANGE COUNTY MATH INITIATIVE GRANT AWARD

Mind Institute is a secondary math curriculum that has been adopted by the District. This grant provides staff development for teachers in algebra readiness and licensing fees for the related software.

FISCAL IMPACT:	The grant will provide a total of \$175,100 beginning July 1, 2009 to June 30, 2010.

TOPIC: PRIMARY LANGUAGE WAIVER

DESCRIPTION: Districts are required to conduct an annual R-30 Language Census Report identifying the languages spoken in the district (Education Code Section 62002). Initial assessment of English learners in English and their native language is required. Authorization is being requested to use English speaking personnel to administer the English and native language proficiency assessments. The California Department of Education (CDE) will grant a waiver for this requirement when the native language is spoken by a small number of pupils and when bilingual testers are not available. (Bilingual testers are available for Spanish.)

The CDE does not provide an assessment instrument to conduct the required testing. In absence of a native language test, an interview/questionnaire will continue to be used. This waiver request must be submitted annually to the CDE.

FISCAL IMPACT: No fiscal impact.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the request for a Primary Language Waiver that will be submitted to the California Department of Education.

TOPIC: **TEXTBOOK ADOPTIONS – FINAL**

Warrants prepared by the District are forwarded to the OCDE for review of documentation, county signature, and entry to OUSD's county ledgers before they are returned to the District for release to vendors, consultants, or contractors. Purchase orders, bid documents, warrants, payrolls, federal/state/county documents, etc. are audited by the District's independent audit firm.

FISCAL IMPACT: This item has no fiscal impact.
