## **Mission Statement**

## **Board Meetings**

**Regular Board meetings** are typically scheduled the second and fourth Thursday of each month at 7:30 p.m. at the Orange Unified School District Education Center, 1401 North Handy Street, Building H. The purpose of the Board meeting is to conduct business. This is done in **Open Session**. Matters dealing with students and employees are reserved for **Closed Session** to provide confidentiality as required by law. Other Closed Session topics include: pending litigation, property negotiations and collective bargaining issues with employee associations.

## **Special Board Meetings**

Meeting notices for **special meetings** are posted 24 hours in advance of the meeting and shall indicate the business to be transacted at the meeting. No other business shall be considered at the special meeting. The public will be provided an opportunity to address the item described in the notice.

## **Emergency Board Meetings**

When the Board determines that an emergency situation exists, it may call an **emergency meeting**. The Board may hold an emergency meeting without complying with the 24-hour notice or 24-hour posting requirement for special meetings pursuant to Government Code 54956. The Board shall comply with all other requirements for a special meeting during an emergency meeting.

## **Agendas**

Agendas contain a brief description of each item to be discussed or transacted at the meeting. Copies of the agenda are available in the Superintendent's Office, Building B, at the District Education Center or on the web site at www.orangeusd.k12.ca.us/board/calendar.asp.

Consent Items are routine in nature and generally require no discussion. These items are acted upon by one motion; however, any such item may be considered separately at a Board member's request. Action Items are acted upon separately. Board members may ask questions or request that staff make a presentation before voting on an item. Information/ Discussion Items do not require action by the Board. The Board may take action only on those items listed in the printed agenda, except for emergencies.

Any member of the public may request that a matter within the jurisdiction of the Board be placed on the agenda of a regular meeting. The request must be in writing and submitted to the Superintendent at least ten working days before the scheduled meeting date.

## Addressing the Board

Persons wishing to address the Board are requested to fill out a "Public Comment" **blue card** available at the meeting on the information table. The "Public Comment" card should be submitted to the Superintendent or the Board Clerk prior to the start of open session.

Speakers are limited to three (3) minutes per speaker with a maximum of twenty (20) minutes per topic. With Board consent, the Board President may modify the time allowed for public presentation. **Power Point and computer presentations are <u>not</u> allowed.** A speaker may not relinquish his/her time to another. When addressing the Board, speakers are requested to state their name for the record and address the Board from the podium. If the topic has been previously addressed, it is requested that the speaker's remarks be limited to **new points only**.

Speakers will be called upon at the appropriate time during the meeting. Agenda items may be addressed during the Board's consideration of the item. Items **not on the agenda** that are within the Board's subject matter jurisdiction may be addressed during the "Public Comment" section. Items not on the agenda may not be acted on or discussed by the Board, but will be researched and responded to in any one of the following ways: 1) by telephone after research; 2) by mail after research; or 3) at a subsequent Board meeting as an agenda item.

**No boisterous conduct shall be permitted at any Board meeting.** Persistent boisterous conduct shall be grounds for summary termination by the Board President of that person's privilege of address.

"Any person who willfully disturbs any public school or any public school meeting is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be punished by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500)." (CEC § 32210)

Complaints against employees will normally be heard in Closed Session. The District's complaint pr cedure should be followed before discussion with the Board.

## **Requests for Information**

Requests for information shall be made in writing and submitted to the Superintendent's Office. There is a nominal charge of \$.10 per page for copies of public records.

PUBLIC HEARING AND ADOPTION OF RESOLUTION NO. 09-08-09 OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT GRANTING EASEMENTS TO THE COUNTY OF ORANGE FOR STREET AND HIGHWAY IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE INSTALLATION OF SIDEWALKS AND HANDICAP RAMPS AT OLIVE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL FOR A "SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL" GRANT PROJECT

DESCRIPTION:

The County of Orange requests an easement to construct and maintain sidewalks and handicap ramps adjacent to Olive Elementary School (Exhibits A, B & C).

The District is authorized to convey easements to the County of Orange under Education Code Section 17556, et seq. Prior to the conveyance and recording, three steps must be taken per the Code: 1) Board resolution declaring the intent to grant the easement; 2) conduct a public hearing; and 3) Second Board resolution conveying the easement.

The Board of Education approved Resolution 01-08-09, declaring its intention to convey the easements to the County of Orange for the placement of the above listed improvements on the Olive Elementary School campus on July 24, 2008. The District has posted, as required by law, notice of public hearing ten days prior to this hearing and published an add five days in advance of this hearing.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education hold a public hearing and approve Resolution 09-08-09, conveying easements to the County of Orange for street and highway improvements and temporary easements to construct the improvements at Olive Elementary School.

## **RESOLUTION GRANTING EASEMENTS**

WHEREAS, the Orange Unified School District (the "District") owns Olive Elementary School located at 3038 N. Magnolia Ave. in the City of Orange, County of Orange, State of California (the "School"); and

WHEREAS, The County of Orange has requested Perpetual Easements and Temporary Construction Easements for street and highway purposes over, under, upon, and above the land on the campus of the Olive Elementary School, described in Exhibits A, B and C attached hereto and incorporated by reference herein, together with all rights of ingress and egress thereto; and

WHEREAS, the Street and Highway Easement will be of direct benefit to the District in providing sidewalks and handicap ramps to the School; and

WHEREAS, the District is authorized to convey the Street and Highway Easement to the County of Orange pursuant to *Education Code* Section 17556, et seq.



### 2008-2009 NATIONAL BOARD FOR PROFESSIONAL TEACHING STANDARDS CERTIFICATION

**DESCRIPTION:** 

The National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS) is a nonprofit, nonpartisan, and nongovernmental agency governed by a 63-member board of directors, the majority of whom are classroom teachers, which focuses on development of professional standards for early childhood, elementary, and secondary school teaching. National Board certification recognizes experienced teachers for the quality of their practice and signifies that a teacher is accomplished and has met challenging professional teaching standards evidenced by rigorous performance-based assessments.

The California Department of Education (CDE) administers the federally funded Candidate Subsidy Program (CSP) for NBPTS candidates. Fee subsidies for up to 50 percent of the application fee are awarded to first-time candidates at the time the applications are received, depending upon the availability of funds.

Since the inception of the NBPTS certification program, the Orange Unified School District has provided an additional amount of \$1,000 each for NBPTS candidates who teach in Orange Unified, up to a maximum of ten applicants per year.

In order to participate, teachers must be recommended by their principal and are required to submit an application. A maximum of ten Orange Unified teachers would be selected for participation. Should more than ten individuals make application, a random selection process would be implemented to determine participation.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT AND TALLER SAN JOSE FOR 2008-2010

**DESCRIPTION:** 

The District, through Central County Regional Occupational Program (CCROP) is a long-time partner with Taller San Jose. Currently, the Regional Occupational Program (ROP) provides a part-time instructor for the newly launched Medical Careers Academy. Prior to this, CCROP, through the District and Taller San Jose, (Community Based Organization) offered a Convalescent Nurse Assistant course for eleven years.

Taller San Jose is a recipient of a grant from the Santa Ana Workforce Investment Board/Youth Council - Youth Program Operators. The grant requires Taller San Jose to have Memorandums of Understanding with its partners.

The classes are composed entirely of adults. The MOU reflects both ROP and Adult Education, in the event that the program needs to be transferred to Adult Education in order to serve high school ROP students.

All costs associated with the MOU will be covered by the appropriate categorical program (ROP or Adult Education).

FISCAL IMPACT:

Receipt of up to \$200,000 revenue generated from average daily attendance (ADA), based on enrollment and attendance in the ROP or Adult Education Program, over the next two-year period.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education authorize the Superintendent or designee to enter into the Memorandum of Understanding with Taller San Jose.

**DESCRIPTION:** 

Authorization of signatures is an item which is routinely updated to reflect changes in personnel and to comply with the requirements of the California Education Code.

As the agency which ultimately releases District payrolls and warrants, the Orange County Department of Education (OCDE) must maintain on file the approved signature authorizations for all school districts. The signatures are applicable to various documents which are approved by the Board of Education and in compliance with the Education Code and other pertinent state and federal laws. The administrative/leadership employees for whom the signature authorizations are designated do not transfer that authority to any staff members.

Purchase orders are processed within the limitations of existing site/program budgets, with the P.O. listing submitted to the Board at each meeting. Non-routine expenditures for consultants, contracts, major facility additions, etc. are submitted to the Board separately for authorization. Before the preparation of a warrant, it is determined that the proper authorizations and approvals exist. Warrants prepared by the District are forwarded to the OCDE for review of documentation, county signature, and entry to OUSD's county ledgers before they are returned to the District for release to vendors, consultants, or contractors. Purchase orders. bid documents. warrants. payrolls. federal/state/county documents, etc. are audited by the District's independent audit firm.
