# ACTION ITEMS

TOPIC:

PUBLIC HEARING AND ADOPTION OF CLASS SIZE WAIVER **REQUEST – CALIFORNIA EDUCATION CODE 41376** 

DESCRIPTION:

It is requested that the Board of Education conduct a public hearing with respect to first through eighth grades class size waiver request.

Due to the Governor's current budget projection and the need for as much flexibility to develop a balanced budget as possible, the District desires to submit a request to the California Department of Education (CDE) to waive portions of California Education Code Section 41376(a).(c) and (d) relating to class size penalties for grades one through three and 41376(b)(1)(2)(3) and (e), relating to class size penalties for grades four through eight.

The current approved 2010-11 district-wide class size average in grades one through three is 30:1. The current district-wide class size average in grades four through eight is 29.9:1. The District needs to have the flexibility to negotiate increased class sizes of up to 33:1 for grades one through eight, for a two-year period, beginning with the 2010-11 fiscal year.

#### Background:

Education Code 41376 requires that school districts not exceed a district-wide class size average for grades one through three of 30:1 and 29.9:1 in grades four through eight, or the District's class size average in 1964 (29.9), whichever is greater. A penalty is imposed in the event the class size average exceeds 30 students in grades 1-3 and 29.9 students in grades 4-8. The Education Code class size average coincides with the requirements of the negotiated class size/teaching load/workload with Orange Unified Education Association (OUEA) which requires the following:

- Class size for 1-6 shall be maintained at an average of 30.0:1 students.
- Class size for 7-8 shall be at a staffing ratio of 32.0:1 students.

In light of the current statewide budget crisis and the reduced revenue to school districts, the level of staffing required by EC 41376 has a detrimental effect on the District's operations and ability to provide necessary services.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Cost savings of up to \$2,990,000 annually.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education hold a public hearing, and authorize the Superintendent or designee to submit a first through eighth grades class size waiver request to the California Department of Education.

WAIVER REQUEST - TITLE I, PART A, AMERICAN **RECOVERY AND REINVESTMENT ACT FOR 2009-2010** 

DESCRIPTION:

The United States Department of Education (ED) has granted the California Department of Education (CDE) and the State Board of Education (SBE) waiver requests pertaining to Title I. Part A of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), Local Education Agencies (LEA) may submit waivers for funding requirements of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act (ARRA) allocation for 2009-10.

Staff is requesting approval to submit a waiver of requirements mandated under Title I, ARRA to the CDE. The money unencumbered by the waiver will enable the Title I, ARRA funds to be used for other Title I priorities.

- Section 1 (a) Exemption from the 14-day school choice parent notification requirement for students enrolled in newly identified program improvement (PI) schools
