Reopener Negotiations 2010-2011

This document represents the District's initial bargaining proposal for reopener negotiations between the District and the Orange Unified Education Association for the 2010-2011 school year. The District submits this proposal for public comment on the open session agenda of the March 25, 2010 meeting of the governing Board.

Negotiations between the parties include the articles which are compensation related, including Article 2 and the appendices, plus two additional articles.

The District's initial proposal, contingent upon projected funding by the State of California for the District's 2010-2011 Budget, is as follows:

Article 2 – Compensation:

This Article is to be reviewed, discussed and negotiated, including:

- Restructure salary schedule (freeze steps)
- Restructure columnar advancement (one time per year)
- Extend terms of 9-3-09 salary agreement for an additional year

- Extended-Day Kindergarten

Article 9 – Class Size/Teaching Load/Workload:

This Article is to be reviewed, discussed and negotiated, including:

- Class size for grades 3-6 may be maintained at an average of up to 33:1
- Secondary school grades 7-12 may be maintained at a staffing ratio of up to 33:1
- Extend temporary high school counselor staffing provision

This document represents the District's initial bargaining proposal for reopener negotiations between the District and the California School Employees Association, Chapter #67, for the 2010-2011 school year. The District submits this proposal for public comment on the open session agenda of the March 25, 2010 meeting of the governing Board.

The Collective Bargaining Agreement between the District and the California School Employees Association, Chapter #67, provides that Article 12 may be re-opened for negotiations.

The District's initial reopener proposal, contingent upon projected funding by the State of California for the District's 2010-2011 Budget, is as follows:

Article 12 – Compensation:

This Article is to be reviewed, discussed and negotiated, including:

- Reduction of compensation
- Restructure salary schedules
- Extension of furlough days

The District reserves the right to make additional proposals at any time during the bargaining process, including but not limited to responses to proposals made by CSEA.

TOPIC:

PROPOSED BOARD POLICY REVISION - BP 6112, SCHOOL DAY - FIRST READING

DESCRIPTION:

The District's Board Policies are reviewed and updated periodically. This item pertains to an update to allow the District to pursue extended-day kindergarten. Education Code (EC) sections 8970-8974 authorize extended-day kindergarten if the local school board adopts a policy establishing an early primary program in keeping with the recommendations of the School Readiness Task Force, found in *Here They Come: Ready or Not!* (1988). EC Section 8973 allows schools to offer extended-day kindergarten if both of the following conditions are met:

- The kindergarten program does not exceed the length of the primary school day, and
- The extended-day kindergarten program takes into account ample opportunity for both active and quiet activities with an integrated, experiential, and developmentally appropriate educational program.

To be eligible to establish extended-day kindergarten, a school district is first required to adopt a policy to allow an early primary program, consistent with EC sections 8970-8974. Based on the requirements of EC sections 8970-8974, Board Policy 6112, School Day, is presented for a first reading:

FISCAL IMPACT:

This item has no fiscal impact.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education receive the attached proposed revision to Board Policy 6112, *School Day*, for a first reading.

Instruction

School Day

The Board of Education shall fix the length of the school day subject to the provisions of law. (E. C. 46100)

The school day shall be arranged and scheduled by the administration so as to offer the greatest return educationally for the time spent, within the limitations of school facilities and requirements of state law and regulations.

The Kindergarten school day may exceed the four-hour maximum instructional day as part of an early primary program. An early primary program consists of same age students or any combination of state preschool or child development program, Kindergarten, first, second, or third grade students who are provided integrated, experiential, and developmentally appropriate instruction.

The District may maintain Kindergarten classes at different school sites within the District for different lengths of time during the school day. The extended-day school day may not last longer than that permitted for the oldest participating students at the school. Ample opportunities must be provided for active and quiet activities. Space availability may impact the opportunity to implement extended day Kindergarten at District sites.

TECH PREP CONSORTIUM-SUB CONTRACT AGREEMENT

COURSE APPROVALS: Chinese III, Class Piano, IB Biology HL II

DESCRIPTION:

The new course outlines described below have been reviewed by Educational Services are recommended to the Board of Education for approval.

- Chinese III is a continuation of the Chinese language series, deepening the understanding of word formation and sentence structure along with Chinese culture study. It also further develops the student's control of the language through listening, speaking, and writing activities to build proficiency in using the Chinese language in a variety of real-life situations.
- Class Piano will train students to practice and perform on an electronic or acoustic piano both independently as well as cooperatively in a group setting. There will be ensemble practice and drill, theory, rhythm, note and fingering exercises directed by the instructor. The student will learn and perform classical and popular musical repertoire for the director as well as for the entire class. This course is one additional offering for students to meet the fine art requirement for admission to the UC system.
- IB Biology HL II is the second year of a required course for International Baccalaureate (IB) students and is necessary to accumulate the number of hours the program requires for Biology in the IB Diploma sequence. The course includes ecology, physiology, immunity, and plant biology. Students will describe advanced biological principles and effectively design scientific experiments.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Chinese III requires purchase of a textbook with a per student cost of approximately \$71 totaling approximately \$3200 for the one class that is anticipated.

Class Piano and IB Biology will utilize existing materials.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the above-described courses presented by the District's Educational Services Division for use in the Orange Unified School District.
