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TOPIC:	<b>PUBLIC HEARING – CHARTER SCHOOL RENEWAL PETITION, SANTIAGO CHARTER MIDDLE SCHOOL</b>
DESCRIPTION:	This item pertains to holding a public hearing with respect to the charter school renewal petition from Santiago Charter Middle School which was presented to the District on April 12, 2010. A copy of the petition is available for public review in the District's Human Resources office. Education Code Section 47607 provides that a charter granted by a school district governing board may be renewed one or more subsequent times by that entity. Each renewal shall be for a period of five years. Education Code Section 47605 requires that a public hearing be held within 30 days of receipt of the renewal petition. Following the public hearing and review of the petition, the Board of Education shall act on the charter renewal petition within 60 days of receipt of the renewal petition.
FISCAL IMPACT:	The fiscal impact of the charter renewal petition will be reviewed and information regarding changes in fiscal impact as a result of the renewal petition will be presented to the Board of Education.
RECOMMENDATION:	It is recommended that the Board of Education hold a public hearing and schedule the May 13, 2010 meeting of the Board of Education as the date to take action regarding the charter renewal petition.

**TOPIC: PURCHASE ORDERS LIST**

**DESCRIPTION:** Purchase orders and change orders have been processed in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Board of Education and applicable legal requirements of the State of California.

District procedures and computer system controls require that an approved purchase order, pay voucher, current liability, or credit memo exist on the District's computer system prior to the issuance of warrants. There may be a multiple number of warrants drawn against a given purchase order up to the maximum amount for that purchase order. The system restricts the processing of payment amounts in excess of the issued purchase order

It should be noted that the purchase order system allows for a one-line description of the services or items to be procured. The issued purchase order forms a contract between the District and the vendor.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** \$845,514.62

TOPIC:	<b>APPROVAL TO EXTEND UTILIZATION OF PRICING AGREEMENT BETWEEN WILSONA SCHOOL DISTRICT AND CLASS LEASING FOR THE PURCHASE OR LEASE OF DOH/DSA RELOCATABLE BUILDINGS</b>
DESCRIPTION:	<p>The District has a need to extend the existing lease for interim student housing being utilized during the Yorba Middle School modernization project. The Wilsona School District (WSD) advertised a competitive bid for the purchase or lease of relocatable buildings, referenced as “Modular Building Bid Package for Wilsona School District August 2007.” WSD awarded a pricing agreement contract to Class Leasing, Inc., for the lease or purchase of relocatables on September 20, 2007. This contract allows school districts to also utilize the contract pursuant to Public Contract Code section 20118. The term of the contract is for one year, with four optional one-year extensions. WSD has extended the awarded contract with Class Leasing, Inc., for a second year, effective through September 20, 2010.</p> <p>The Orange Unified School District Board of Education authorized use of the WSD pricing agreement contract on February 26, 2009, Resolution No. 31-08-09. Currently, 32 relocatable buildings are being utilized for interim student housing for the Yorba Middle School modernization project. Additionally, the District has requirements to periodically lease or purchase relocatable buildings.</p>
FISCAL IMPACT:	Expenditures are made from all programs, sites, and departmental budgets. This is not a request for additional budgetary appropriation. Yorba Middle School interim student housing costs were included in the Board of Education’s adopted Resolution No. 31-08-09 on February 26, 2009.
RECOMMENDATION:	It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the contract extension with Class Leasing, Inc., for the lease or purchase of relocatable buildings pursuant to the contract awarded by the Wilsona School District.



**TOPIC: PERSONNEL REPORT**

**DESCRIPTION:** All actions listed in the Personnel Report, representing a cost to the District, have been reviewed by the Business Department and have been assigned a budget number. Appropriate funds exist in all budget areas presented in this Personnel Report. Some items on the report represent the maximum amount that could be encumbered for that item, the actual expenditure may be less, and in no instance will the expenditure be more than the requested amount without an additional request being generated.

This report may require actions for extra pay projects, separation from service, short-term employment, leaves of absence, change of status, and new hires. All requests are generated by individuals, school sites, or various District departments.

TOPIC: **STUDY TRIPS**

DESCRIPTION: McPherson Magnet School - Drama Students – Claremont, CA - April 24, 2010

McPherson Magnet's drama students, under the direction of their teacher, Jennifer Connell, and Coach Zachary Groenwold, will travel to Claremont High School to compete in the Southern California Classic Dance and Cheer competition. Four female and four male students will be accompanied by one female and one male adult chaperones. Parents will provide transportation for their student. Total cost per student is \$10 and scholarships are available. Students will not miss any school days. A substitute is not required.

La Veta Elementary - 4<sup>th</sup> Grade G.A.T.E. Class – Ocean Institute – Dana Point – April 28 - 29, 2010

The fourth grade students from La Veta Elementary School, under direction of Karin Barone, will travel to Dana Point on April 28 and return on April 29. The students will participate in a lab/cruise with activities that explore the world of nocturnal and deep-sea animal adaptations. There is no impact to the general fund. The student cost may be supplemented by funds donated from individual parent organizations. The cost will not exceed \$100 per student, and scholarships are available.

FISCAL IMPACT: Receipt of restricted categorical fund monies and unrestricted donated funds.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the study trips as presented.

**TOPIC: AMERICAN INDIAN EDUCATION APPLICATION**

**DESCRIPTION:** Staff is requesting authorization to submit the annual application for federal funds under the American Indian Education, Part A and B, Subpart 1 of Title VII of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act for a multi-year grant to include the 2010-11 school year.

The funds will be used to provide services in the following areas: (1) monitoring the academic progress and attendance of Indian students; (2) tutoring of identified students; (3) home-school liaison and recruitment services; and (4) American Indian cultural awareness.

The Title VII Native American Education Program held a public hearing on April 13, 2010 to receive input from parents and community members for the application at the district office.

This application has also been discussed with the Parent Advisory Committee and they have given their approval for its submission to the Board of Education.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** This grant provides receipt of restricted categorical fund monies totaling approximately \$72,180 annually.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board of Education authorize the staff to submit the American Indian Education Application to the U.S. Department of Education.

**TOPIC: THIRD QUARTER REPORT OF UNIFORM COMPLAINTS FOR THE WILLIAMS AND VALENZUELA CASE SETTLEMENTS**

**DESCRIPTION:** As a result of the State of California's settlement of the Williams and Valenzuela class action lawsuits, Education Code section 35186 requires school districts to do two things: 1) provide an opportunity to file formal complaints under the District's Uniform Complaint Procedures; and 2) report to the Board of Education and the public four times a year the number of complaints filed and the area of the settlement they target.

The Third Quarter Report covers the number of Uniform Complaints received by the District under the four areas governed by the Williams and Valenzuela Case Settlements for the period of January – March 2010. The four targeted areas are:

1. Sufficient Instructional Materials
2. Emergency or urgent facilities conditions that pose a threat to the health and safety of pupils or staff
3. Teacher vacancy and/or misassignment
4. Pupils, including English Learners, who have not passed one or both parts of the high school exit examination by the end of the 12<sup>th</sup> grade are entitled to receive intensive instruction and services for up to two consecutive academic years after completion of the 12<sup>th</sup> grade, or until the pupil has passed both parts of the examination, whichever comes first

No Uniform Complaints for any area have been reported during the third quarter for the Williams and Valenzuela Case Settlements.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** This item has no fiscal impact.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board of Education receive the Report of Uniform Complaints as mandated by the Williams and Valenzuela Case Settlements.

**TOPIC: CHILD DEVELOPMENT SERVICES - PROPOSED TUITION INCREASE FOR THE 2010-2011 SCHOOL YEAR**

**DESCRIPTION:** The Child Development Services department offers fee-based School Age Care (SAC) programs and the Child Development Center (CDC) to parents in the District at 24 locations. The parent pay programs have been in operation for over 25 years with the objective of providing a self-supporting community service. To continue providing a cost effective program without impacting the General Fund, tuition costs are reviewed and reevaluated annually. A tuition increase is recommended for the School Age Care program and the Child Development Center for the 2010-11 school year. This increase is necessary to continue covering operating costs of the programs, including ongoing cost of living increases, facility maintenance, technology upgrades, and additional utility and custodial costs scheduled during school breaks. The proposed rates are comparable to similar public and private programs in the community.

- Provide students with strong experience and understanding of all aspects of an industry.
- Develop, improve or expand the use of technology.
- Provide professional development programs to teachers, counselors and administrators.
- Evaluate and assess how the needs of special populations are being met.
- Improve, expand and modernize programs.
- Provide services of sufficient size, scope and quality to be effective.
- Link secondary and post-secondary career and technical education.

**FISCAL IMPACT:** Receipt of approximately \$187,000 in categorical income. No general fund monies will be expended.

**RECOMMENDATION:** It is recommended that the Board of Education authorize the Superintendent or designee to submit the application for the Carl D. Perkins Career and Technical Education Improvement Act of 2006.
