ACTION ITEMS

TOPIC: **CHARTER SCHOOL RENEWAL PETITION, SANTIAGO CHARTER MIDDLE SCHOOL**

DESCRIPTION: On April 12, 2010, the Orange Unified School District received a charter school renewal petition from the Santiago Charter Middle School. A copy of the renewal petition has been maintained for public review at the District Education Center since that date. Education Code Section 47607 provides that a charter granted by a school district governing board may be renewed one or more subsequent times by that entity. Each renewal shall be for a period of five years. The Board of Education held a public hearing with respect to the renewal petition from Santiago Charter Middle School, pursuant to Education Code Section 47605, on April 22, 2010. Several speakers provided input at the public hearing.

District staff have provided a review of the renewal petition from Santiago Charter Middle School. Based upon said review, District staff have found that the charter school renewal petition from Santiago Charter Middle School meets the criteria for renewal as outlined in Education Code Section 47607. Education Code Section 47605 provides that the Board of Education shall either grant or deny the charter within 60 days of receipt of the petition. Accordingly, this item is before the Board for action on May 13, 2010, which is within the 60-day window as provided by law.

In addition to the charter, a separate memorandum of understanding regarding the operation of the Santiago Charter Middle School remains in effect from the previous charter. Following Board action on the charter renewal petition, appropriate revisions to the existing memorandum of understanding may be considered and presented to the Board of Education at a future meeting as necessary.

FISCAL IMPACT: Upon review of the charter school renewal petition, no changes in fiscal impact have been determined.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education take action pursuant to Education Code Section 47607 to renew the charter for Santiago Charter Middle School for a period of five years, to commence on July 1, 2010.

TOPIC: PROPOSED BOARD POLICY REVISION - BP 6112 - SECOND READING

DESCRIPTION: The District's Board Policies are reviewed and updated periodically. This item pertains to an update relative to extended-day kindergarten. This proposed update to Board Policy 6112, School Day, would allow extended-day kindergarten as an option for individual schools in the District based on collective bargaining agreements. The proposed update to Board Policy 6112, School Day, would also allow extended-day kindergarten for the entire District based on the outcome of negotiations. This proposed update to Board Policy 6112, School Day, allows for the option of extended-day kindergarten but does not require extended-day kindergarten.

Education Code (EC) sections 8970-8974 authorize extended-day kindergarten if the local school board adopts a policy establishing an early primary program. EC Section 8973 allows schools to offer extended-day kindergarten if both of the following conditions are met:

- The kindergarten program does not exceed the length of the primary school day, and
- The extended-day kindergarten program takes into account ample opportunity for both active and quiet activities with an integrated, experiential, and developmentally appropriate educational program.

Based on the requirements of EC sections 8970-8974, Board Policy 6112, School Day, is presented for a second reading:

FISCAL IMPACT: Potential cost savings and increased revenue to the general fund are to be determined based upon actual implementation of an extended-day kindergarten.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education adopt the attached proposed revision to Board Policy 6112, School Day, based upon the second reading.

InstructionSchool Day

The Board of Education shall fix the length of the school day subject to the provisions of law. (E. C. 46100)

The school day shall be arranged and scheduled by the administration so as to offer the greatest return educationally for the time spent, within the limitations of school facilities and requirements of state law and regulations.

The Kindergarten school day may exceed the four-hour maximum instructional day as part of an early primary program. An early primary program consists of same age students or any combination of state preschool or child development program, Kindergarten, first, second, or third grade students who are provided integrated, experiential, and developmentally appropriate instruction.

The District may maintain Kindergarten classes at different school sites within the District for different lengths of time during the school day. The extended-day school day may not last longer than that permitted for the oldest participating students at the school. Ample opportunities must be provided for active and quiet activities. Space availability may impact the opportunity to implement extended day Kindergarten at District sites.

TOPIC: **PURCHASE ORDERS LIST**

DESCRIPTION: Purchase orders and change orders have been processed in accordance with the rules and regulations of the Board of Education and applicable legal requirements of the State of California.

District procedures and computer system controls require that an approved purchase order, pay voucher, current liability, or credit memo exist on the District's computer system prior to the issuance of warrants. There may be a multiple number of warrants drawn against a given purchase order up to the maximum amount for that purchase order. The system restricts the processing of payment amounts in excess of the issued purchase order

It should be noted that the purchase order system allows for a one-line description of the services or items to be procured. The issued purchase order forms a contract between the District and the vendor.

FISCAL IMPACT: \$734,051.78

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education approve the Purchase Order List dated April 12 through May 2, 2010 in the amount of \$734,051.78.

Moreno Valley Unified School District's (MVUSD) Bid No. 2008-09-18 for custodial supplies, awarded to Gorm Inc., provides competitive pricing and has been made available for use to all public agencies and school districts. Staff has determined that it is in the best interest of the District to utilize Bid No. 2008-09-18 between MVUSD and Gorm Inc., inclusive of future contract renewal options, through June 30, 2012, for the acquisition of custodial supplies. This is not a request for any additional budgetary appropriation. Expenditures are made from all sites, programs, and department budgets. (L. Davis)

McPherson Magnet's eighth grade class, under the direction of Lynne Palucki, will travel to the Catalina Island Marine Institute (CIMI) in Toyon Bay, Catalina. Students will gain an understanding of marine life, algae, animal classification, and ecosystems, as well as the history of Catalina. The hands-on interactive program also emphasizes teamwork and cooperation. Forty male and forty female students will be accompanied by two male and four female adult chaperones, in addition to site provided chaperones, and will stay in dormitories at the CIMI. Transportation will be provided by District bus to Pierpoint Landing in Long Beach for departure on Catalina Classic Cruises. The cost per student is \$285 and scholarships are available. Students will miss one school day. A substitute will be required for three teachers. Bus transportation and substitutes will be reimbursed through student fundraisers.

TOPIC: **CALIFORNIA TECHNOLOGY ASSISTANCE PROJECT**

DESCRIPTION: The California Technology Assistant Project (CTAP) Region 9 has awarded the District the following four CTAP grants:

A team CTAP Teacher grant in the amount of \$5,830 was awarded to Delia Hawley and Pam Verdone at Anaheim Hills Elementary School. The grant entitled, "The Problem with Words," is a project that will allow students to become familiar with language skills, and number sense, while using logical reasoning and technology to become successful problem solvers. Students will benefit from peer teaching opportunities while applying math and language skills using the Smart Board and Elmo projectors. Students will also have access to a Smart Slate and Senteo Smart Response System for assessments.

A team CTAP Teacher grant in the amount of \$6,724 was awarded to Carol Beaumont, Cary Bordner, and Lanette Gutman at La Veta Elementary School. The grant entitled, "Project E-Xpression," will use technology to improve the Language Arts skills of diverse learners. Teachers will use SMART Notebook software and interactive whiteboards in order to meet the visual, kinesthetic, and auditory needs of learners. Students will create comprehensive presentations using Thinking Maps in Inspiration software and using them in Smart Notebook presentations.

A team CTAP Teacher grant in the amount of \$6,629 was awarded to Lisa Leon, Karen Parrish, Lori Saulten, and Kathy Martin at Olive Elementary School. The grant is entitled, "The British are Coming!" In Paul Revere's Run, school-age Sons and Daughters of Liberty will run the twenty miles of Paul Revere's historic 1755 midnight ride. At least three days a week, Olive School's fifth grade patriots will measure their resting heart rates, take off for a twenty-minute run, use individual stop watches to measure their heart rates again and record them for graphing using a software program.

An Individual CTAP Teacher grant in the amount of \$3,000 was awarded to Scott Williams at Villa Park Elementary School. The grant entitled, "Science Live!" will allow students to cooperatively work together in small groups with news anchors and reporters to create a news show about science. Groups will work together to find videos that correlate to a chapter in the science book, create a script paraphrasing the information from the chapter, and perform a live news show using the videos as their background image.

FISCAL IMPACT: Receipt of grant funding totaling \$22,183

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education accept the California Technology Assistance Project Grant funds.
