TOPIC: PROCLAMATION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT HONORING LORENZO AND JOSEFINA RAMIREZ AND THEIR CHILDREN

DESCRIPTION: In March 1945, Thomas Estrada, William Guzman, Gonzalo Mendez, Frank Palomino, and Lorenzo Ramirez challenged the practice of school segregation. They claimed that their children were victims of unconstitutional discrimination by being forced to attend separate "schools for Mexicans" in the Westminster, Garden Grove, Santa Ana, and El Modena school districts. The ensuing case of *Mendez v. Westminster School District* was a crucial case in equality of education, ruling that the segregation of students into separate "Mexican schools" was unconstitutional. The courage of individual parents, like Lorenzo Ramirez, is part of a continuing national story in claiming educational equity for all of our nation's children.

The attached proclamation honors the legacy of Lorenzo Ramirez for his efforts to end segregation in the El Modena school system during the 1940s.

**PROCLAMATION OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION
OF THE ORANGE UNIFIED SCHOOL DISTRICT**

HONORING LORENZO AND JOSEFINA RAMÍREZ AND THEIR CHILDREN

WHEREAS, Lorenzo Ramírez spent part of his youth living in El Modena and graduated from Lincoln Grammar School in 1927; and

WHEREAS, Lorenzo Ramírez, as a young man employed at the Murphy Ranch in Whittier during the 1930s, stood up to defend the rights of his co-workers; and

WHEREAS, Mexico's Secretary of Foreign Affairs, Ezequiel Padilla Peñaloza, recognizing Lorenzo Ramírez's courage, compassion, and commitment to justice, asked him to testify at a hearing in San Francisco in 1943 regarding the mistreatment of *braceros* in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Lorenzo and Josefina Ramírez decided to move back to El Modena in 1944 to raise their children and did so during an era in which Mexican Americans routinely faced segregation in work, housing, schools, restaurants, theaters, and swimming pools; and

WHEREAS, Lorenzo and Josefina Ramírez tried to enroll their three oldest children, Ignacio, Jimmy, and Jose, in Roosevelt Grammar School, only to be told that the children would have to attend Lincoln Grammar School, which had become a segregated Mexican school; and

WHEREAS, Lorenzo and Josefina Ramírez decided to defend all children's rights to an equal public education by uniting with four other families in Orange County as plaintiffs in a class action lawsuit known as *Mendez et al. v. Westminster School District et al.*, which they introduced, with broad community support, in 1945; and

WHEREAS, Lorenzo Ramírez, when called to testify, shared his conviction that all children should be educated together and, furthermore, expressed how grateful he was to live in a country that stood for the principle of equality; and

WHEREAS, Judge Paul McCormick, ruling in favor of the plaintiff families in 1946, challenged fifty years of legal consensus by insisting that "a paramount requisite in the American system of public education is social equality" and that integrated schools are "imperative for the perpetuation of American institutions and ideals"; and

WHEREAS, the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit also ruled in favor of the plaintiff families in 1947, leading directly to legislation that ended segregation in all public schools in the State of California and leading ultimately to the United States Supreme Court ruling in *Brown v. Board of Education* in 1954 that "separate education facilities are inherently unequal"; and

WHEREAS, the newspaper *El Politico* praised Lorenzo Ramírez as "a leader among Mexican Americans" and, above all, "a man of honor"; and

WHEREAS, the courageous fight of Lorenzo and Josefina Ramírez and their children in El Modena, and that of other families in Orange County, to give all children a chance at the American dream has been and will continue to be an inspiration to students, parents, educators, and other community members;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Orange Unified School District recognizes that Lorenzo and Josefina Ramírez and their children, by standing up for American ideals in 1945, made a significant and lasting contribution to the quality of education in Orange, California, and across the nation and deserve our gratitude.



PUBLIC HEARING: TIER III CATEGORICAL FUNDING FLEXIBILITY TRANSFER

DESCRIPTION:

The California State Department of Education gives school agencies the authority to use each of the categorical funds received from the State for Tier III programs for “any educational purpose, to the extent permitted by federal and state law.” The flexibility to transfer funds from each of these programs is authorized for five years – from the current year through 2012-13. Any school agency that wants to exercise this transfer authority is required to hold a public hearing on the matter.

FISCAL IMPACT:

General Fund revenue shift from restricted to unrestricted.


RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education hold a public hearing on the transfer of each of the Tier III program funds, and authorize the Superintendent or designee to transfer those funds into the General Fund for any educational purpose, as allowed by law, through 2012-13.

TOPIC: **SECOND INTERIM FINANCIAL REPORT AND TRANSFER RESOLUTION NO. 24-10-11**

DESCRIPTION: In accordance with state requirements, all school districts are required to file the Second Interim Report by March 15 of each year to certify positive, qualified, or negative financial status based upon the most updated information available. The Second Interim Report (Attachment A) not only reflects actual information as of January 31, 2011 (Column C), but also projects anticipated revenues and expenditures known to date (Column D). The District will file a positive certification in regard to the ability to meet its financial obligations.

Average Daily Attendance (ADA): The total budgeted attendance of 27,345.09 (not including District charter schools) reflects a total increase of 172.00 compared to December 2010 estimates (Attachment B). The following chart is a summary composition of 2010/11 ADA:

Revenue Limit: The 2010/11 (.39)% cost of living adjustment (COLA) net with an 17.963% Revenue Limit deficit represents no change as compared to the December 2010 estimates. The net increase of \$1,269,143 reflects the increase in ADA and adjustments to charter state aid and in-lieu property tax transfers (Attachment C).

"In submitting the 2010-11 2nd Interim Report, the Board understands its fiduciary responsibility to maintain fiscal solvency for the current and subsequent two fiscal years. It is recognized that based on the 2010-11 Enacted Budget, the 2011-12 Proposed Governor's Budget and the expiration of the temporary taxes as provided in current law, the District will implement \$(15,200,000) in budget reductions in 2012-13 to maintain fiscal solvency.

Transfer Resolution: Resolution No. 24-10-11 is the technical mechanism, which the Orange County Department of Education utilizes to authorize and input the information shown in the Second Interim Report.

FISCAL IMPACT: Fiscal impact as indicated by the 2010-11 SACS Financial Reporting Documents Second Interim Report.

RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended that the Board of Education certify and approve the positive financial status as shown in the District Certification of the Second Interim Report for the Fiscal Year 2010-11, and authorize staff to implement the necessary transfers as shown in Transfer Resolution No. 24-10-11.





The State Controller requires that school districts receive independent audits of financial records and procedures on an annual basis in order to verify federal and state compliance. The independent audit is designed to encourage sound fiscal practices, to promote efficient and effective use of public funds and to determine the integrity of the financial accounting and reporting systems.

The District issued a Request For Proposals (RFP) 2011- Audit Services to five auditing firms specializing in school districts, as well as posted the RFP on the District website. Six firms submitted proposals which were received on January 31, 2011. Using the established criteria, a District Evaluation Committee comprised of Joe Sorrera, Barbara Stephens and Charmaine Duquesnel scored the proposals. Based on these scores, the Committee invited two firms to a face-to-face interview.


TOPIC: **APPROVAL OF THE CALNET 2 CONTRACT EXTENSION FOR TELECOMMUNICATION SERVICES**

In accordance with the federally funded E-rate program, applications are submitted each year for telephone services which include all voice and data lines and associated services within the District. In 2008, the District entered into a CALNET 2 contract with AT&T/Pacific Bell. Subsequently, this contract has been utilized to obtain E-rate reductions of telephone costs of up to \$420,000 each year. The existing CALNET 2 contract expires in January 2012, which falls in the middle of E-rate Year 14 (July 1, 2011 – June 30, 2012).

The State of California has extended the CALNET 2 contract with AT&T for a term of two additional years with a new expiration date of January 29, 2014. The CALNET 2 contract will continue to provide the District with additional cost savings over the two year term of the agreement. Accordingly, District staff recommends the approval of the 2 year extension of the CALNET 2 contract.


Authority for Expulsion Recommendation:
