NAMING OF FACILITIES - EL MODENA HIGH SCHOOL LIBRARY MEDIA CENTER

DESCRIPTION:

On August 26, 2010 the Board received a request to rename a school for Lorenzo Ramirez in recognition of his efforts to end segregation in the El Modena school system during the 1940s. Lorenzo Ramirez was an El Modena native who returned to El Modena in 1944 from Whittier where his children had attended an integrated school. When he learned that his children would have to attend a segregated school in El Modena, he took action. Ultimately, Lorenzo Ramirez joined Gonzalo Mendez, William Guzman, Frank Palomino, and Thomas Estrada, as the main plaintiffs in the groundbreaking case entitled Mendez et al. v. Westminster School District et al.

In order to be responsive to the significance of the accomplishments of Lorenzo Ramirez, the Board directed staff to bring back information on the policies, bylaws and practices for naming District facilities. Accordingly, the Board was provided information that: (1) Board policy provides direction in the naming of schools and school facilities; (2) Board policy provides an avenue for requests to name school facilities but precludes the naming of schools in honor of community members; (3) All current OUSD schools are named consistent with Board policy, i.e. all elementary schools are named for a street adjacent to or near the location of the site, all middle schools including the two charter schools are named in accordance with a historical Spanish theme appropriate to the history of the area, and all senior high schools are named for the general community of their location; (4) No OUSD schools are named in honor of past or present OUSD community members; and (5) Several OUSD facilities, but not schools, are named in honor of OUSD community members.

Items relative to this topic were discussed at the August 26. 2010, October 14, 2010, November 18, 2010, and February 17, 2011Board meetings, culminating at the March 10, 2011 Board meeting with a Proclamation of the Board honoring Lorenzo and Josefina Ramirez and their children for their significant and lasting contribution to the quality of education in Orange, California, and across the nation.

In accordance with the Proclamation of the Board for the significant role played by Lorenzo Ramirez in ending segregation in the El Modena school system, and consistent with Board policy and District practice, it is recommended that the Board of Education name the El Modena High School Library Media Center in honor of Lorenzo Ramirez.

The EI Modena High School Library Media Center is the educational center piece of the EI Modena High School community. The Library Media Center plays an important part in the education of every high school student who attends EI Modena High. The Lorenzo Ramirez Library Media Center at EI Modena High School would provide a significant platform to honor the vision and accomplishments of Lorenzo Ramirez in the EI Modena community and in the entire Orange Unified School District, now and into the future.

It is also recommended that all schools in the Orange Unified School District honor Lorenzo Ramirez on March 2nd (which is the anniversary date of the first filing of the case - March 2, 1945). In order to do so, it is recommended that the District curriculum staff identify appropriate resource materials which may be used in the honoring of the accomplishments of Lorenzo Ramirez each March 2nd.

PROPOSED BOARD POLICY: FUND BALANCE POLICY

DESCRIPTION:

Board Policies are routinely reviewed and updated. Updates may be triggered by changes in law, regulation, or direction from the Board of Education. The Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) is the regulatory body responsible for establishing and improving standards of state and local governmental accounting and financial reporting.

GASB has issued Statement 54 (GASB 54), Fund Balance Reporting and Governmental Fund Type Definitions, which alters the categories and terminology used to describe the components that compose fund balance. These changes are intended to enhance how fund balance information is reported and to improve its usefulness by establishing new fund balance classifications that are easier for users to understand and apply. The new standard also clarifies the definitions of certain governmental funds. The new policy as noted in the attached proposed BP3470.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Education receive proposed Board Policy 3470 for a first reading.

Business and Non-Instructional Operations

Fund Balance Policy

Purpose

This Fund Balance Policy establishes the procedures for reporting unrestricted fund balance in the General Fund financial statements for the district's governmental funds. commitments and assignments of fund balance will help ensure that there will be adequate financial resources to protect the District against unforeseen circumstances and events such as revenue shortfalls and unanticipated expenditures.

The policy also authorizes and directs the Superintendent or designee to prepare financial reports which accurately categorize fund balance as per Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB) Statement No. 54, Fund Balance Reporting and Governmental Fund Type Definitions.

General Policy

Fund balance is essentially the difference between the assets and liabilities reported in a governmental fund. There are five separate components of fund balance, each of which identifies the extent to which the District is bound to honor constraints on the specific purpose for which amounts can be spent.

- Nonspendable Fund Balance consists of funds that cannot be spent due to their form (e.g. inventories and prepaids) or funds that legally or contractually must be maintained
- Restricted Fund Balance consists of funds that are mandated for a specific purpose by external parties, constitutional provisions or enabling legislation.
- Committed Fund Balance consists of funds that are set aside for a specific purpose by the district's highest level of decision making authority (governing board). Formal action must be taken prior to the end of the fiscal year. The same formal action must be taken to remove or change the limitations placed on the funds.
- Assigned Fund Balance consists of funds that are set aside with the intent to be used for a specific purpose by the district's highest level of decision making authority or a body or official that has been given the authority to assign funds. Assigned funds cannot cause a deficit in unassigned fund balance.
- Unassigned Fund Balance consists of excess funds that have not been classified in the previous four categories. All funds in this category are considered spendable resources. This category also provides the resources necessary to meet unexpected expenditures and revenue shortfalls.

BP 3470 (b)

Minimum Fund Balance Policy

The Governing Board maintains a minimum fund balance policy for the General Fund in order to protect the District against revenue shortfalls or unpredicted one-time expenditures. The policy requires a Reserve for Economic Uncertainties consisting of unassigned amounts equal to no less than three percent of General Fund expenditures and other financing uses.

Authority to Commit Funds

The Governing Board, as the District's highest level of decision-making authority, may commit fund balance for specific purposes pursuant to constraints imposed by formal actions taken, such as a majority vote or resolution. These committed amounts cannot be used for any other purpose unless the Governing Board removes or changes the specific use through the same type of formal action taken to establish the commitment. Governing Board action to commit fund balance needs to occur within the fiscal reporting period, no later than June 30th; however, the amount can be determined subsequent to the release of the financial statements.

Authority to Assign Funds

Upon passage of the Fund Balance Policy, authority is given to the Superintendent or designee to assign funds for specific purposes. The Governing Board has the authority to remove or change the assignment of the funds with a simple majority vote.

AP Chinese Language and Culture will bring the students an opportunity to further develop their four language proficiency skills: listening, speaking, reading and writing in the Intermediate to Advanced-level range across the three communicative modes (interpersonal, interpretive, and presentational) and the five Cs (communication, culture, connections, comparisons and communities) as defined in the Standards for Foreign Language Learning in the 21st Century. The AP Chinese Language and Culture course provides the students an opportunity to totally immerse themselves in the richness of Chinese Language and Culture by introducing varied aspects of both contemporary and historical Chinese culture. The course is conducted almost exclusively in Mandarin Chinese and the students are required to speak in Chinese as much as possible.

Chinese 4 IB SL is intended for the student who is fluent in the Chinese language. The Chinese 4 student progresses toward a more sophisticated level of reading and writing the modern Chinese language. Classical Chinese will also be introduced. A flexible format emphasizes individual needs and much of the work is done independently. The student is expected to do a detailed analysis of major short stories, essays, novels, plays, and poems and to express analysis in clear expository writing. Copies of previous International Baccalaureate tests are examined and discussed. Continued use of literary genres, magazines newspapers provides the student with deeper understanding of the culture.

CALIFORNIA TECHNOLOGY ASSISTANCE PROJECT

DESCRIPTION:

The California Technology Assistant Project (CTAP) Region 9 has awarded the District the following four CTAP grants:

A team CTAP Teacher grant in the amount of \$6,998.48 was awarded to Jackie Francoeur, Jeff Ricupito, Laura Herbert, Barbara Sataki at Orange High School. The grant entitled, "Blogging and Glogging for Earth (BG4E) will increase scientific literacy and appreciate the need for knowledge and understanding of science in the 21st Century. In this project students will research and learn earth science content by creating multimedia. digital posters called Glogs, and expressing their informed opinions about societal concepts by writing password-protected blog entries. Grant funding will provide 12 netbooks and 2 digital cameras for students to "blog and glog."

An individual CTAP Teacher grant in the amount of \$2,846.41 was awarded to and Rosina Talamantes at Yorba Middle School. The grant is entitled "Stimulus-Responder: Immediate Feedback Motivates Students & Drives Instruction." This project will meet the needs of approximately 70 seventh and eighth grade English Language Learners master Written and Oral Language Conventions. By using SMART response systems, students will interact with the target language, use current, hand-held technology and make individual contributions toward their English Language proficiency and exhibit a range offunctional and critical thinking skills. Each student will directly participate in providing the teacher with immediate modifications during instructional minutes and the ability to modify long-range pacing guides. The grant will fund 32 XE Responders System.

An Individual CTAP Teacher grant in the amount of \$3,000 was awarded to Glenn Warren at McPherson Magnet School. The grant entitled, "Passion Based Learning Project" will inspire students to pursue, create, and share information about non-fiction areas of personal interest using wireless network connected iPod touch units. Building on the English Language Arts standards, students will demonstrate mastery of 21st Century skills information literacy, media literacy, and ICT literacy by accessing and evaluating information efficiently and effectively, building on an ethical and legal information use foundation. The grant will purchase 12 iPod Touchs and some apps.

Receipt of grant funding totaling \$12,845
