### Infectious Disease Prevention

The Governing Board recognizes its responsibility to take precautions for preventing the spread of infectious diseases. School district efforts are provided in cooperation with county-wide efforts for infections disease prevention.

Education programs shall be age appropriate and shall include an understanding of infectious disease cycles and prevention methods, such as precautions when rendering first aid involving blood and body fluids, personal hygiene practices and other methods of infectious disease control.

Universal precautions shall be used whenever anyone is exposed to blood or other body fluids through injury or accident. Instruction shall be designed to protect students from contact with blood, body fluids and any type of skin piercing objects.
