General Overview



Background

- In 2015, California Legislature passed California Healthy Youth Act
- The Act makes changes to HIV and comprehensive sexual health education curriculum
 - To develop healthy attitudes concerning adolescent growth and development, body image, gender, sexual orientation, positive relationships, marriage, and family
 - To ensure pupils receive integrated, comprehensive, accurate, and unbiased sexual health and HIV prevention instruction and provide educators with clear tools and guidance to accomplish that end
- The Act took effect in 2016
- Curriculum must be taught once in middle and once in high school



Pilot Program

- OUSD spent a year developing a State compliant pilot program
- Teacher, Parent and Board Member suggestions were received and taken into consideration
- Pilot design is a total of 10 hours 5 hours in 7th grade and 5 in 8th grade
- Full Parent Opt Out available
- Was originally scheduled for June 2018
