# **MARINE CORPS JROTC**

## **Benefits**

The primary goal of the Orange High School MCJROTC Program is to develop the leadership skills, character and self-discipline of our cadets. In addition to learning the customs, traditions, and history of the U.S. Marine Corps, our cadets will study leadership principles and the importance of self -reliance and ethical behavior. Teamwork, personal responsibility, and perseverance are encouraged. We also seek to improve the physical fitness of cadets and prepare them for the challenges of the adult world. Honesty, personal integrity, respect for authority, community service and good citizenship are the hallmarks of our MCJROTC Program.





### **Activities**

The MCJROTC curriculum includes two days of classroom instruction, two days of physical fitness training, and one day of drill each week. All cadets receive uniforms at no charge.

Each cadet will have the option of joining the MCJROTC Color Guard and Drill Team. These cadets practice drill movements during zero and lunch hours. The color guard and drill teams travel to other high schools in Southern California to participate in drill competitions. All cadets receive basic marksmanship training with air rifles.

Each cadet has the opportunity to participate in seven field trips during the school year, and <u>all expenses are paid by the MCJROTC Program</u>. During the 2019 – 2020 school year, our cadets travelled to Santiago Community College, Fleet Week Los Angeles, Naval Air Station North Island in Coronado, the Cabrillo National Monument in Point Loma, the USS Midway in San Diego Harbor, the Nixon Museum & Library, the Blue Angels Airshow, and Camp Pendleton.

Although students enrolled in JROTC receive an exposure to the military, the primary goal of the program is to develop the leadership skills, character and self-discipline of the participants. The curriculum stresses ethics, responsibility, and self-reliance through both academic study and drill, where teamwork and discipline is emphasized. Cadets are also expected to demonstrate their sense of responsibility to the larger community through regular participation in events such as fundraisers for St. Joseph's Children Hospital, and the Marine Corps' annual Christmas "Toys for Tots" program, as well as by serving on Honor/Color Guard units that are frequently called upon to serve at various community and political events countywide.

#### **Cadet Trips**

Trips are planned throughout the year to various military installations for tours and to better acquaint the cadet with how the modern military operates. Highlights of this year included:

#### **REQUIREMENTS**

- Maintain standards of scholastic achievement and good academic standing

- Comply with grooming standards as set forth in the MCJROTC SOP.

#### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

The OHS MCJROTC Association will award four college scholarships in the sum of \$2,500 each to graduating 12<sup>th</sup> grade cadets in May of 2020. Additional scholarship opportunities exist for those cadets with good grades.
